Simulfaneously in the great cities and tiny hamlets throughout the country the bustle of the daily life was stilled for a short space and citizens stood silently at attention for three minutes. Street car service and auto traffic was suspended in many cities from one to five minutes while theatres and all places of amusement were closed, as were the banks, stores, manufacturing plants and federal buildings.

Practically all of the railroads of the country stopped their trains for one minute, while the motive power of the ships at sea was stopped and the passengers and crews payed silent respect at the moment of burial.

No baseball games, races, tennis or any other sports were indulged in during the afternoon and all boxing contests that had been previously scheduled were called off.


