This football season has been crazy. There are many teams at all levels who have seen their hopes and goals fall by the wayside. Several pro teams have lost their starting quarterback to injuries and have not met their expectations. The Aggies, Red Raiders, Bears, Longhorns, and the Crimson Tide have all fallen short of what they expected. (While it is not looking good for Jerry Jones and his Cowboys, they still have a chance to fall flat and achieve mediocrity.)

Despite many injuries, this year's Broncos have played outstanding -winning the district, bi-district, and area championships. Their hopes for a deep run into the playoffs ended this past week when the Canadian Wildcats won by a score of 28 to 14 in the Region I Semi-Finals. The Broncos finished this season with an 11

and 2 record.

Last year the Broncos defeated Canadian 24-14. At the beginning of this game, it was obvious that Wildcat quarterback, Ben Arbuckle, was playing much better than he played last year. He passed the Wildcats to touchdowns on their first two possessions of the first quarter without a single incomplection.

On Canadian's third possession, the swarming Bronco defense forced Arbuckle to scramble. As he was being sacked, Jonathan Gutierrez stripped the ball from Arbuckle and ran 25 yards for the Broncos' first touchdown.

The Bronco smash mouth offense, led by Chance Campbell and Andres Acevedo, drove the field to a first and goal. Elijah Cross tied the score with a six-yard run. With 5:15 left in the first half, the Broncos and Wildcats were tied at 14 to 14.

Six plays later, Arbuckle completed a 32-yard pass to Braiden Galla to regain the lead. The half ended with the score 21 to 14.

The Broncos received the opening kickoff and smashed their way to the Canadian 23 yard line where they were facing a fourth and eight. In a similar situation against Post, the Broncos needed nine yards on fourth down. Michael Rollert had gained nine yards and two inches. On the naked bootleg, Rollert was tackled after gaining seven yards and ten inches.

Four plays later, Arbuckle threw a perfect pass for a 59-yard touchdown giving the Wildcats a 28 to 14 lead. Neither team scored in the fourth quarter, and the 2013 Sonora Bronco football season was over.

Lady Bronco Basketball have a "Three Parade" for Thanksgiving

Gracie Dozier celebrated an early Thanksgiving by leading a "Three Parade" with 4 long range trifectas, Katie Hartman added 2 bombs, JoJo Gutierrez and Tyler Hampton each had one 'three ball' as the Lady Broncos played a solid offense and defense game defeating Ozona 75-25 in front a festive, large and loud crowd. Gracie finished with 27 points and co-captain Kylie Love scored 20 and pulled down 16

rebounds. "Run and Fun" returned to the Bronco vernacular because of the defense, led by Zella Powers. The Lady Broncos forced 40+ turnovers and only committed 16 errors. Naomi Dozier, Janelle Vasquez and Tori Guerrero all scored 4 points and played important roles in the victory. The Sonora JV team continue their undefeated season by winning 32-15. The JV team

played inspired basketball led by the defense of Julia Pope and the offense of Halle Samaniego (11 points). Next up for the varsity is the (two time defending) Harper Tournament December 5th-7th and the varsity and JV host a home game against Iraan on December 10th. The Lady Bronco Basketball team wish all a Happy Thanksgiving.



Andrew Murr Runs For State Representative



Texas is in Andrew Murr's blood – an 8th generation Texan, descendant of a pioneering family of one of our brave defenders of the Alamo, and grandson of former Governor Coke R. Stevenson – Andrew comes from a long line of Texans committed to making our state a better place to live for future generation. A Product of the Hill Country.

Andrew Murr was raised on a working ranch in Kimble County; he graduated from Junction High School and then earned a teaching degree from Texas A&M University. Later he received his J.D. with honors from the Texas Tech University School of Law. While studying at Texas A&M, he spent time in Washington D.C. working on agricultural and natural resource policy issues, and in Austin as an Assistant Committee Clerk for the Texas House of Representatives Natural Resources Committee.

After passing the state bar exam, Andrew worked for one of Texas' largest law firms in Dallas before returning home to Junction to establish a general law practice. Subsequently, Andrew was elected Kimble County Attorney and then Kimble County Judge.

Andrew served as County Judge for five years before resigning on September 30, 2013 upon announcing his candidacy for State Representative. A successor was selected and sworn into office the following week.

Andrew and his wife, Lacey, a elementary school teacher, live on the family ranch with their five-year old son, Coke, raising cattle and operating Telegraph Title Company in Junction. He also serves on the Board of Directors of Junction National Bank, is the President of the Kimble/Edwards Counties Farm Bureau and the Past President of the local Rotary Club. In 2011, Governor Rick Perry appointed Andrew to the Concho Valley Regional Review Board, and as County Judge, he chaired his judicial district's Juvenile Board, composed of district and county judges and supervising juvenile probation matters throughout several counties.

Andrew has held many other civic posts including Chairman of the Concho Valley Council of Governments Executive Committee, as a board member of the Concho Valley Transit District, Kimble County Historical Commission, Kimble County Youth Show, and the Hill Country Fair Association; as well as serving on the Texas Tech University Hill Country Board of Advisers, the Concho Valley Emergency Preparedness Advisory Committee, and the Concho Valley Solid Waste Advisory Committee.

Frost May Trigger Toxicities in Forages

With first frost, growth in forages ceases, and that prompted a couple of phone calls regarding concern for forage toxicity. The stress of frost disrupts normal plant growth and may cause some plants to accumulate too much nitrate or prussic acid. Under normal growing conditions, nitrate nitrogen absorbed by roots and moved into the plant is rapidly transformed into plant proteins. However, under stress, plant roots continue to absorb small amounts of nitrogen, but the plant has stopped growing. Nitrate accumulates and is stored in lower leaves and stems. Toxicity generally occurs when cattle consume large amounts of forage containing over 1% nitrate ion on a dry matter basis.

Symptoms of lethal nitrate poisoning include labored breathing, frothing at the mouth, rapid pulse, weakness, diarrhea, frequent urination, muscle tremors, incoordination and convulsions, collapse and death. Cattle are the most susceptible domestic species to nitrate toxicity. This is because in their rumen, nitrate (from plants) is converted to nitrite. When this occurs, nitrite accumulates and is absorbed into the bloodstream where it binds to hemoglobin, thus reducing the oxygen-carrying capacity of the blood. The animals die by asphyxiation. Prussic acid, also called hydrocyanic (HCN), normally is not present in plants. As with nitrate buildup, some stress usually triggers accumulation in plant tissue. Unfortunately, often the only indication of prussic acid poisoning is dead animals. HCN is one of the most potent, rapid-acting poisons known. A characteristic sign of HCN toxicity is a bright cherry-red color to the blood, a symptom that persists for several hours after death.

Laboratory testing can be done to indicate levels of both compounds in forages. Along those lines, this and similar forage concerns will be addressed by Extension Agronomist, Dr. David Drake at the Range and Pasture Management Workshop on December 10th. Other topics include Pesticide Laws and Regulations, Prescribed Fire Liability Risks and Management Strategies, Range Plant Identification, and Brush Management By Season. Cost to attend is \$20 and includes a catered lunch, morning refreshments, and course materials.
