Hawks Fly

The Class 3A Division I Wall Hawks used their talent advantage to get the best of our Sonora Broncos last Friday in Wall. The final score of this non-district game was 48 to 20 in their favor.

In the first quarter, Wall scored after Kaden Cordell was hit from behind while attempting to pass. The ball bounced high in the air and a Hawk came down with it. The Hawks used their speed to get wide for the first touchdown.

When I reviewed my video, I don't believe the Broncos ever made a first down in the first half without the aid of a penalty against the Hawks. Their speed and size pretty

much shut down the Bronco offense.

In the second quarter, the Hawks took advantage of field position and Bronco turnovers to score five touchdowns. The score at the end of half was 42 to 0.

The Hawks received the kickoff to start the second half. They drove the field and scored making the score 48 to 0. The Hawk coach played his reserves the rest of the second half.

Facing football players of equal ability, the Broncos scored 20 points in the second half while shutting out the Hawks. At the end of the game, the Broncos had good

field position for another score. Wall answered with the first string defense and kept the Broncos from scoring again.

Cordell got the first touchdown on a 65-yard reception from keeper. Luke James scored on a 65-yard reception from Cordell. Kevin Martinez scored the last touchdown on an 18 yard run. Octavio Mendez kicked two extra points.

This week is Sonora's Homecoming. The Broncos play the Harper Longhorns in Bronco Stadium. The JV team travels to Harper. The Colts play Harper at home. The Freshman Broncos play the Junction Eagles at home.

Freshman Broncos Remain Undefeated

While the Freshman Broncos have not yet lost, all of their games against the Wall Hawks have been close games. This past Thursday was no exception.

The Broncos scored on the opening drive of the game. The drive covered 80 yards in 13 plays. The first big play came on a rollout to Wesley Dutton's left. Just before going out of bounds, he threw a pass to Brian Van Winkle who gained about thirty-five yards on the catch and run. Willie B. Munoz had nice run to move the ball closer to the end zone. Dutton threw to Walker Sine for the touchdown. The kick for the extra point was no good right. With 3:33 left in the first quarter, the score was 6 to 0 in favor of Sonora.

Wall got its initial first down on a pass interference call. Their second one came on a play that is as old as football. On fourth down, the center snapped the ball to the up back. He ran to his right and used the wrap around handoff to give the ball to another Hawk who ran to his left for the first down. The Hawks called their famous option pitch that worked for a 50 yard gain setting up a first and goal at the Broncos' ten-yard line. Wall scored on a flanker reverse pitch. Dutton blocked the PAT kick.

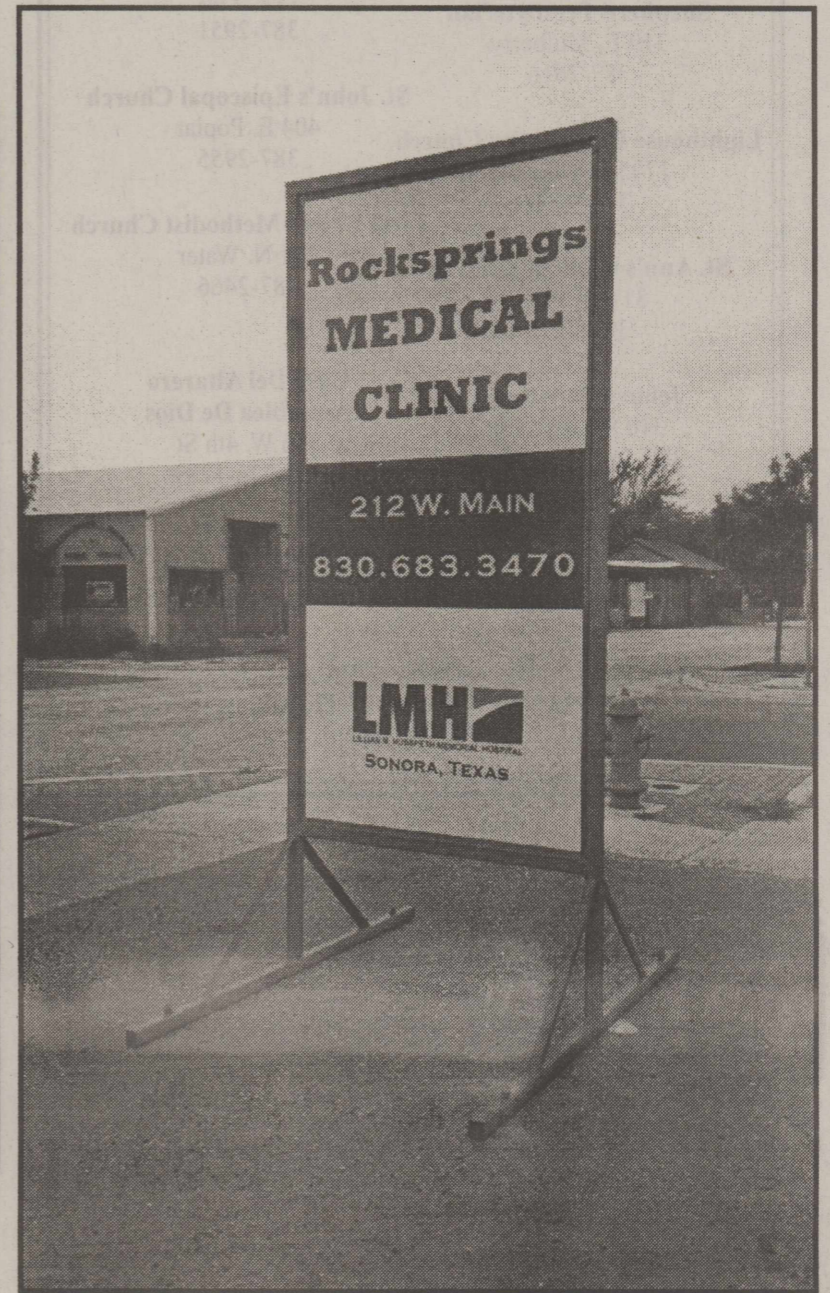
There was no more scoring in the first half.

Wall returned the second half kickoff for a touchdown. They tried for two on the point after, but the Broncos held.

The Broncos turned the ball over on an interception giving the Hawks a chance for a two score lead. They kept the drive alive for eight plays before being forced to punt.

It took the Broncos seven plays to take the lead. Dutton scored on a quarterback sweep from twelve yards out. For the all-important two-point conversion, Dutton rolled to his right and threw to Sine for the game winning PAT. The Broncos won 14 to 12.

In other games, the JV Broncos were defeated 48 to 0. The JV was outnumbered and out-sized, but they played with a lot of heart. The 8th grade Colts beat Wall by a score of 16 to 0. The 7th grade Colts participated in a scrimmage.

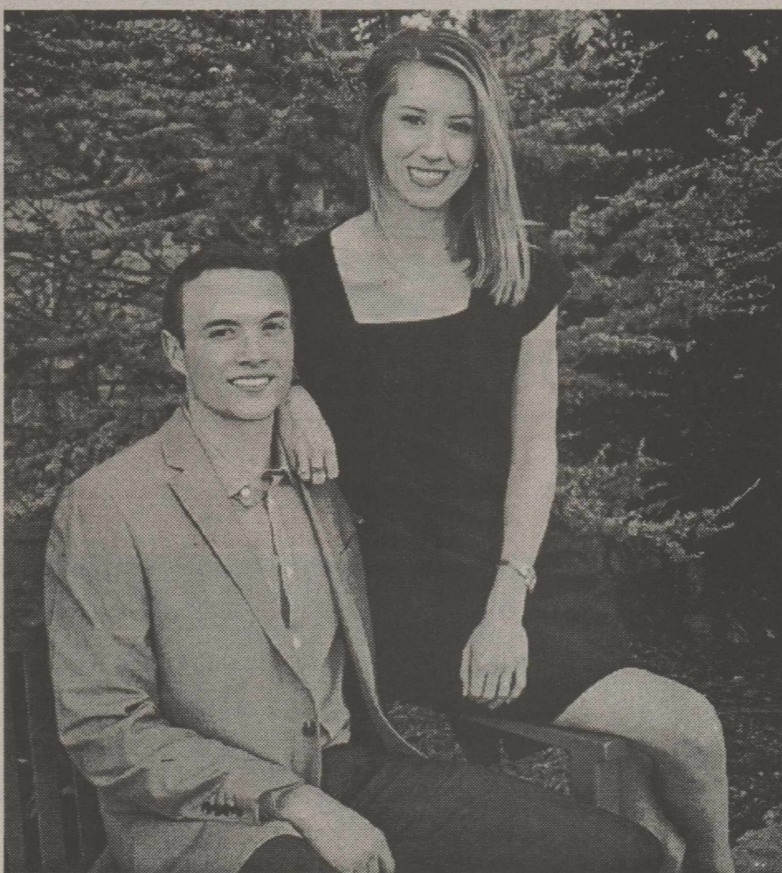



4-H Offering Outdoor Education Project and Livestock Clinic

Sutton County 4-H is back in full swing with the start of school. The next couple of weeks will offer opportunities for youth with interest in agriculture and natural resources. These include an Outdoor Education Project and the start of the Livestock Clinics.

The Outdoor Education project will hold its first meeting on September 21, at 5:15, at the Extension Office. As the name implies, the project is aimed at youth with interest in the outdoors. Participants of the seven-week series will learn basic biology, habitat identification, and ecology.

The project will also offer learning experiences such as

camping skills, wildlife sign identification, outdoor survival skills, first aid, angler skills, and more. Interested youth do not have to currently be 4-H members, but should attend the September 21st project meeting.

Youth interested in showing lambs or goats this year should attend our first Sheep & Goat Clinic on September 22, at 5:15 p.m., at the Ag Farm. Our speaker will be Kimble County Extension Agent, Sam Silvers. He will talk about feeding, training lambs and goats, and developing showmanship. We will also fill out pen agreements for those keeping animals at

the Ag Farm.

Participating in a lamb or goat project teaches record-keeping, time management, nutrition, health, marketing, economics, and genetics. Please let us know if you are attending.

In Texas, 4-H membership is open to all youth ages 8 to 18. In 4-H you can complete projects, give demonstrations, practice leadership, enter contests, attend camps, and learn many life skills. 4-H encourages participation by the entire family.

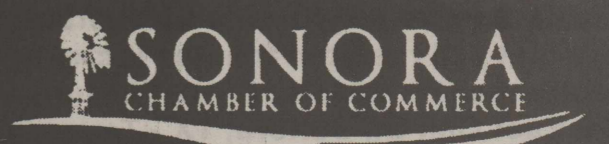

Notice of Tax Revenue Increase

The Sutton County conducted public hearings on September 3, 2015 and September 14, 2015 on a proposal to increase the total tax revenues of the Sutton County from properties on the tax roll in the preceding year by 2.000112 percent.

The total tax revenue raised last year at last year's tax rate of 0.529804 for each \$100 of taxable value was \$3,319,639.06.

The total tax revenue proposed to be raised this year at the proposed tax rate of 0.565355 for each \$100 of taxable value, excluding tax revenue to be raised from new property added to the tax roll this year, is \$3,382,090.92.
