Then n top and style corn and pour prinkle crackerscrumbs over the top, dot with butter. Then microwave two strips of thick bacon until crisp. Let cool and crumble rated che casserole top. Spread Next sprinkle to cover the top. add $3 / 4$ cupmilk Plap 350 degrees for 25 to 35 minutes, until hot throughout and the heese melted. Le tit sit at least 10 10 people. If you plan to use frozen corn for his recipe, you will need to cook he corn first, according to and assemble casserole. It's a family tradition!
