

Beans may be flour

source The newest food ingredient for cookies, frankfurters or even pancakes may come from navy beans, as a result of joint research by Texas A&M University and Michigan State University.

Under a \$100,000 USDA grant, two teams of researchers are studying new methods of processing the beans and are defeloping five new prototype food ingredients to add convenience and functional features which should encourage their use in new products both here and abroad.

Texas A&M's research is being coordinated by Dr. Jose Aguilera of the Food Protein Research and Development Center.

Already, Aguilera and his staff have produced a lighttextured snack from the starch flour, but they haven't yet begun work on the taste factors. The researchers also will start looking at pinto and black beans this

### Dress in winter for comfort

Dress for comfort and protection when planning to spend much time outdoors during winter. Wind or temperature cannot be controlled, but clothing can.

"Select clothing for your activities as well as for outdoor conditions," says Dr. Ann Vanderpoorten, clothing specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

Think about your clothing as layers of protection, adds Vanderpoorten. By planning the number and thickness of these layers, comfort can be controlled in almost any outdoor climate.

The layer closest to the skin should be a "breathing layer" that allows body moisture and excess heat to escape. This layer may consist of underwear, lightweight socks, blouses or shirts.

The second layer is an 'insulation layer'' that keeps in the warmed air around the body. Bulky fabrics or several thin layers hold lots of air. Examples are sweaters, vests, and heavy socks worn over thin ones. Thermal underwear also acts as an insulation layer.

Blazers, windbreakers, shoes and waterproof pants or jackets make up the "outermost protective laydrafty air out and may also protect inner layers from

A hat or hood is important too, according to Vanderpoorten. Up to 75 percent ventilation is needed to preof body heat may be lost if vent overheating.

When you see signs like those shown above, they tell you that there's a pipeline nearby. If it's underground, you can't see it, of course. But it's there, working quietly to provide energy for you and other consumers throughout this nation.

Some of these signs list the commodity transported in the pipeline, the name of the operator, and a telephone number where the operator's representative can be reached at all times.

Although pipelines have an exceptionally good safety record, once in a while a leak can occur.

- Indications of a leak might include: A strange or unusual odor in the vicinity of a pipeline
- A hissing or roaring sound (caused) by petroleum or product escaping from a pipeline)
- A dense white cloud or fog. A spot of dead or discolored
- vegetation. An accumulation of petroleum

CASING VENT MARKER Avoid creating sparks or sources of heat which could cause the

liquids or vapor to ignite and burn. If you find yourself in a suspected vapor area, do not light a match, start an engine or even switch on an electric light. Notify the pipeline operator as soon as you reach a safe area.

Call collect. Give your name, a description of the leak and its location. If you do not know who the pipeline operator is, call your local fire, police or sheriff's. department, or the state police. Advise them of the nature and location of the emergency

If you see someone digging near a pipeline or doing other construction work . . . or if you plan to do such work near a pipeline yourself please call the telephone number shown on the sign and let the pipeline company know so damage can be avoided. It's in your interest ... and the nation's.

### "Meat Extender" in Beef Patties Can Affect Cholesterol Content

Textured soy protein, called "ground meat extender" in beef patties, can affect the amount of cholesterol retained in cooked beef patties, according to meat scientists

at Texas A&M University. 'Cholesterol content of beef patties including soy extender may be higher or lower in cholesterol, than cooked pure beef patties, depending on ingredients," according to Dr. Gary C. Smith, a member of the Meat and Muscle Research Group for the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station (TAES).

In this research, ground beef patties were prepared to contain 0, 10, 20, or 30 percent rehydrated textured soy protein, (TSP), and 7.5, 15 or 30 percent fat. Patties were cooked from the frozen state on a rack in a preheated oven at 177°C, to an internal temperature of 75°C (well done), according to Dr. Ki Soon Rhee, a member of the TAES research team.

The cholesterol content of raw ground beef patties naturally decreased as the amount of TSP increased beause the meat extender has no cholesterol. It also de-creased as the fat content decreased from 30 percent,

to 15, or 7.5 percent. Even after cooking at initial fat levels of 7.5 and 15 percent, the cholesterol content per cooked patty tended to decrease as the amount of TSP increased, but the decreases in cholesterol content were not proportional to the increase in the amount of TSP in the initial uncooked

However, at an initial fat level of 30 percent, patties containing TSP retained substantially higher amounts of cholesterol when cooked than did those without TSP. At this highest fat level, the binding effect of TSP on the fat present in patties became

Smith says that though there have been numerous studies on cooking properties and sensory quality of ground beef patties extended with TSP, no studies have been reported of the effect on cholesterol content when beef patties were extended with TSP.

No consistent trend was observed as to the effect of the initial fat level on the cholesterol content per cooked patty. However, among patties containing no TSP, those with an initial fat level of 30 percent had less cholesterol per patty when cooked than did those with an initial fat level of 7.5 percent. One possible explanation


