Callahan County Commissioners accept proposed tax rate of .42653 cents per $\$ 100$

| Callahan County Commissioners, in a regular commissioners court meeting Monday, August 23, accepted the proposed tax rate of .42653 cents per $\$ 100$ of property value for Callahan County for 2004-2005 fiscal year. <br> Although the tax rate is two percent lower than-last year's tax rate of .44462 cents per $\$ 100$ of property value, it is above the effective tax rate. The effective tax rate is the rate which would generate the same amount of revenue as last year. The new tax rate will generate an increase of 7.78853 percent in property tax revenue over last year. <br> The proposed General Fund tax rate is .3210 cents per $\$ 100$ of property value, while the Road E Bridge Fund tax rate being proposed is .1055 cents per $\$ 100$ of value. <br> The total income for the 20042005 fiscal year budget is $\$ 2,597,452.72$, while total expenditures are $\$ 2,597,235.42$, giving the county a surplus of $\$ 217.30$ in revenue for the fiscal year. <br> On a motion by Commissioner Charlie Grider and second by Commissioner Harold Hicks, the county commissioners held a voice vote to accept the proposed tax rate for Callahan County. Voting for the motion were Commissioners Grider, Hicks, Bryan Farmer, Tommy Holland and County Judge Roger Corn. <br> Other items brought before the commissioners' court included: <br> -The commissioners court meeting was called to order at 9:05 a.m. with Judge Corn presiding.
