

Mrs. Hodgson has been a Texan for over 50 years, but originally hailed from Athens, Georgia. She was only 19 years old in 1941, the year of the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, when she earned her bachelor's degree from the University of Georgia, and received her pilot's license through the Civilian Pilot Training Program. For a while she had to earn her living making typewriter keys "fly," but by 1943, Uncle Sam was desperate for pilots. Mrs. Hodgson qualified to become one of America's first female military pilots, a WASP-short for Woman Airforce Service Pilot. 
Shall we or shall we not call the sheriff? My brother remembers the dogs barking through the night. One of the girls thinks she saw a car parked down there, or at least going "awful slow". The bread man says there have been robberies on the other side of the county. We wonder how a thief could get the blasted thing unbolted, especially at night, but we say nothing. We've found the villain. So we buy a new attachment. Weeks later when the "stolen" one if found, we agree it's good to have a spare.

Over the years we've tried cures. Dad once came home from town with a half a dozen hammers. We stumbled over them in the barnyard, kicked them out of the way to get doors closed. No tractor seat or shop chair was safe to sit down on. It was a gloriously secure feeling. But by the end of the month, we were down to two. For awhile Mom had a tack-hammer in her sewing box that by the name of "Momshammer" and was used in emergency hammer shortages. Until one day, Dad tried driving spikes with it.

## **SHANE DEEL FOR COUNTY ATTORNEY LEADERSHIP FOR CALLAHAN COUNTY**

Last week I shared with you my plan to reform the abuses of the grand jury system here in Callahan County. The second of my primary goals I would like to visit with you about, is my intention to be a leader for Callahan County. In my opinion, a leader is the polar opposite of a politician. I will be the first to tell you, I'm not much of a politician, and I consider that to be one of my greatest strengths. A leader does not shift with the political winds, making decisions worrying about how many votes might be at risk. As County Attorney, I will make every decision based upon what the law, common sense, fairness and justice dictate. With such an effort, one will gain the respect of law enforcement and the citizenry, even when they might have a different opinion on a specific issue because those involved will trust the motivation behind any decision. I also look forward to working with every other office at the courthouse if I can be of any help to them, even when it goes beyond the official job description of County Attorney. I believe that leaders go beyond the call of duty, even when it may not result in getting votes come election time.

Aside from being a leader within the courthouse and our own county, I will strive and persevere to represent Callahan County outside the county as well. Virtually every prosecutor, elected officials or assistants, belong to the Texas District and County Attorney's Association. It's a worthwhile organization. However, I want to do more than just be a member. I will give my best effort to become active in the organization, making sure that the leaders of the organization know the concerns of small West Texas counties, especially ours. It may take some time, but I will work hard to become part of that leadership myself. This association has a much larger voice than any single prosecutor, and can have an effect on legislation which adversely impacts small counties. I will represent Callahan County to the best of my ability in every forum possible. Elected officials have more access to make these efforts, and they should take advantage of them.

I guess what it all boils down to, is that I am not in this just to collect a paycheck. I want to make Callahan County a better place for all of us. Just because we live in a small county does not mean that we should not have high expectations. I have those expectations of myself, and I want you to have those expectations of me, and hold me accountable to such a standard. In the next three weeks I will share with you my plans for being "smart" on crime, for taking politics out of the courtroom, and for accomplishing a complete and massive overhaul of the County Attorney's failed drug policy.
