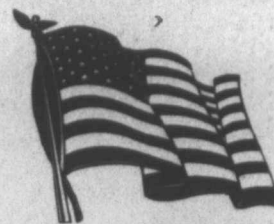

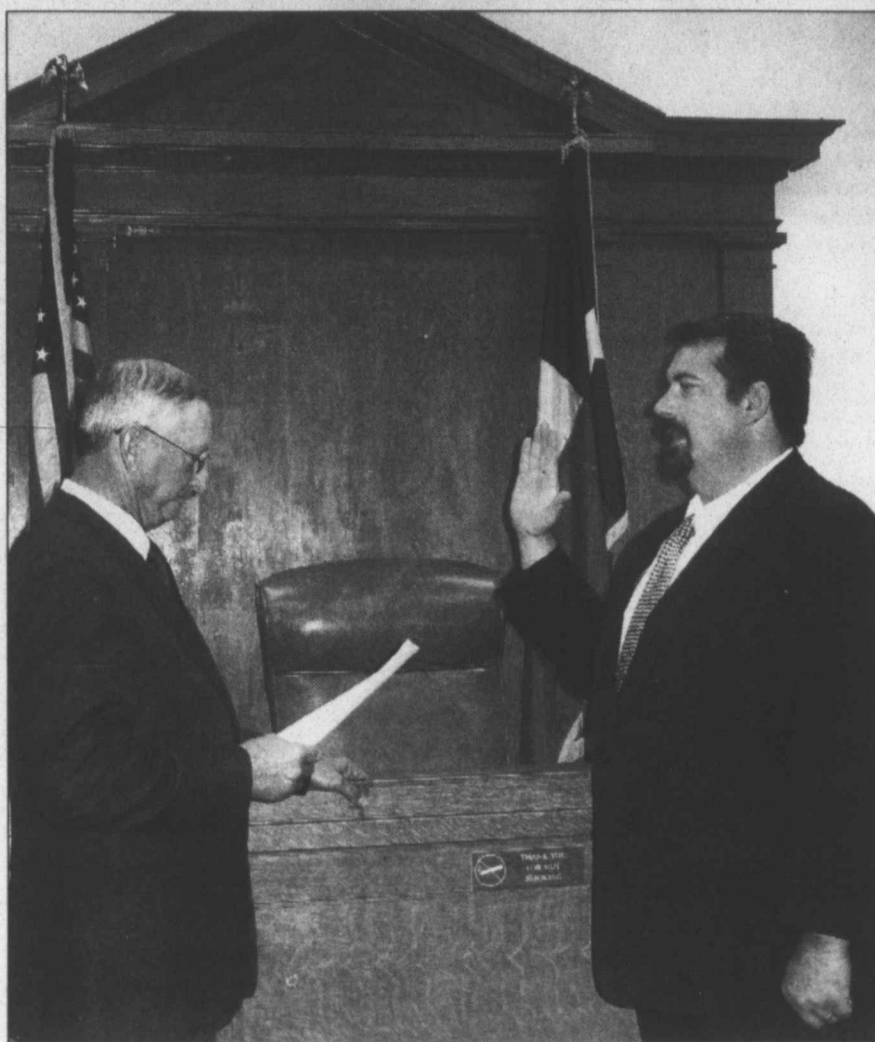

## Parked car damaged by unknown vehicle

A Tahoka man whose parked vehicle was damaged by an unknown vehicle Monday told police that whoever caused the damage left the scene without contacting him.

Fidel Garcia III said his blue Chevrolet Trailblazer was damaged on the right front quarter while it was parked unattended at the Dollar General Store on Lockwood. No estimate of amount of damage was immediately available.

On Saturday a Tahoka policeman

who stopped a vehicle for a traffic violation arrested the 34-year-old driver for driving while intoxicated, third offense or more, with open container in the vehicle.

In the month of March, dispatchers at Lynn County Sheriff's Department processed 275 calls, including 120 for the county, 85 for Tahoka Police Dept., 13 for O'Donnell, 29 for animal control, 24 for EMS ambulances, and 4 fire alarms.

## Wilson ISD Superintendent issues statement Citizens organize meeting to discuss Wilson ISD action

Approximately 60 Wilson citizens attended a citizen-organized meeting last Wednesday night to comment on the actions of the Wilson Independent School District Board of Trustees in terminating the probationary contracts of two teachers at a previous meeting, and reportedly expressing concern because three more teachers have also submitted resignations effective at the end of the school year.

The meeting was held at the Green building in Wilson, due to the large number of citizens expected to attend, and a Lubbock television station reported that 60 were in attendance at the meeting. The Wilson ISD Superintendent was not present at the meeting, and no WISD Board members were present in any official capacity, according to WISD Supt. Russell Schaub.

It is normal for school boards to consider teacher contracts at their March board meetings, and teachers with probationary contracts may be terminated with the appropriate timely notice. The two teachers whose contracts were to be terminated at the end of the school year, however, were subsequently placed on paid administrative leave and the administration has hired substitutes to fill the positions for the remainder of the school year. Additionally, the superintendent restricted the teachers' presence on school grounds and at school activities.

According to televised news reports, some citizens apparently were unhappy that the district was losing 5 of 16 teachers and claimed that some teachers reported a "hostile work environment" and "feared retaliation." However, no teachers expressed any opinions on camera.

Wilson ISD Superintendent Russell Schaub on Tuesday released the following statement to the *The Lynn County News* regarding the administrative and board actions:

### Statement by Russell Schaub Wilson ISD Superintendent April 1, 2014

In an effort to clarify certain information currently being communicated concerning recent personnel decisions at Wilson ISD, the district offers the following statement of facts:

#### 1. Actions by District prior to March 11, 2014, Regular Board Meeting:

Prior to March 11th, teachers whose probationary contracts the superintendent was considering to recommend for termination under Texas Education Code 21.103 were given a courtesy meeting to explain the options available to them. At no time did the superintendent or principal ask them to resign.

#### 2. Actions at the March 11, 2014, Wilson ISD Regular Board Meeting:

During the March 11, 2014, Regular board meeting, the Wilson ISD School Board voted to terminate the probationary contracts of two teachers, effective at the end of the year, by a 5-to-1 vote.

This Board decision was only made after the Board had engaged in significant deliberation and come to the determination that the requirements of Texas Education Code 21.103 had been met, i.e., the board determined that in its judgment it was in the best interest of the students, parents and district to terminate the two probationary contracts effective at the end of the contract term, which coincides with the end of the 2013-14 school year.

The Wilson ISD school board should be highly commended for putting the best interest of the students, parents, and district first in making employment decisions.

#### 3. Action on March 12, 2014, the day after the Board Meeting:

On the morning following the Board meeting, due to the actions of the

two terminated probationary contract employees in their classrooms and on the Wilson ISD campus, a significant disruption to the educational environment at the Wilson campus occurred. In order to ensure that future disruptions to student learning did not occur, the superintendent placed the two probationary contract employees on paid administrative leave in accordance with Board policy DFAA(LOCAL). Since the terminated teachers' presence at school created such a disruption to the educational environment, it was the superintendent's judgment that the best interest of the district would be served by restricting the teachers' presence on school grounds and at school activities. These restrictions, however, may be waived by the superintendent on a case-by-case basis. The superintendent has already waived the restriction in certain circumstances.

#### 4. Other relevant factual information:

- School records reflect that one student has withdrawn from Wilson since March 11, 2014, for reasons not related to the personnel decisions.

- School records reflect no cases of students or parents expressing concern regarding student safety since March 11, 2014.

- The qualifications of the long term substitute teachers in the probationary contract teachers' classrooms who are on paid administrative leave include one who is a certified teacher and another who has demonstrated success with students in the past.

- School records reflect that no grievances have been filed or attempted to be filed during the 2013-14 school year.

## Volunteers recognized in Senior Companion program for county

Dear Editor:  
The Points of Light Foundation has set the week of April 7th through the 12th as National Volunteer Week. Please recognize those individuals that volunteer within Lynn County in all activities.  
One such program of volunteers is the South Plains Senior Companion Program. The program has volunteers (seniors over 55 years of age

who perform in-home services for homebound adults) who work within Lynn County for 20 hours per week. The Companions volunteered 5632 hours during 2013. The Independent Sector has placed a value of \$21.91 on a volunteer hour. Therefore the Lynn County Companions have contributed \$123,397 to residents of Lynn County.

The Companions presently active in Lynn County are: Belia Alvarado, Gloria Garza, and Mary Gutierrez, Lupe Montes and Manuel

Quintero. The South Plains Senior Companion Program is funded thru the Corporation for National Service, as part of the National Senior Service Corps. Local sponsorship is thru South Plains Community Action Association, Inc. Some funding for Senior Companion services is received thru the Texas Department of Aging and Disability Services (DADS). The program does not charge the clients for the services offered by the volunteers. Several fund raisers are done each year to supplement the federal and state funds received. The program has companions also active in Bailey, Cochran, Garza, Hockley, Lamb, and Terry counties. In the seven counties the companions contributed a total of 56218 hours.

**E-filing saves time, prevents common mistakes**

E-file is short for electronic tax return filing. It includes both preparing taxes electronically using tax software and filing taxes electronically.

Buy tax software either off-the-shelf or online. If your income is \$58,000 or less, let Free File brand-name software do the hard work for you with free tax preparation and free e-filing. It's available only through IRS.gov, where a number of tax software companies make their products available for free. Go to Free File to take advantage of this option.

"The software's question and answer format makes doing taxes much easier than filling out paper tax forms," said Clay Sanford, an IRS spokesman in Dallas. "E-file can also help you find credits or deductions for which you may be eligible."

Electronically filed returns are signed electronically. You enter last year's adjusted gross income or a five digit PIN (Personal Identification Number) that you create yourself. This makes your return more secure and completely paperless.

When you hit "send," your return will be securely transmitted through an IRS-approved electronic channel. As part of the delivery process, IRS computers automatically check your return for mistakes. If the IRS finds easy-to-fix mistakes, like a math error or a wrong social security number, they can immediately send it back to you. You can fix it and send it right back.

**Remember to "Render!"**  
Taxable property renditions are due April 15.

**Does this apply to you?**

If you own tangible personal property that is used to produce income, such as the equipment or inventory owned by a business, it does.

**What is a rendition?**

A rendition is a report to your county appraisal district that lists all of the taxable property that you owned or controlled on Jan. 1 of this year. This often applies to furniture, fixtures, equipment or inventory owned by a business.

**What are the advantages of filing?**

- You give your opinion of your property's value.
- You record your correct mailing address so your tax bills will go to the right address.
- If your property's value depreciated, you can file a report of decreased value.

**What is the deadline?**

- The last day for filing renditions is April 15.
- An automatic extension to May 15 is available if requested in writing by the April 15 deadline.
- The chief appraiser may grant an additional 15 days to an owner who shows good cause in writing.

**REMEMBER!!**

Filing is your responsibility. If you render late, don't render or file an incomplete or false rendition, you may face a 10 to 50 percent penalty.
