Five Lynn County teams are in basketball playoffs

Five Lynn County basketball teams are in the UIL state basketball playoffs, with some information still unsure at this point, due to the boys regular season games still underway early this week.

New Home and Tahoka High Schools' basketball programs will have both the boys and girls teams in playoff action, and O'Donnell High School's girls are in the playoffs as well, according to information from coaches.

New Home ISD's Lady Leopards were unbeaten in district play with a perfect 10-0 record, and an overall record of 21-7. As District Champions in Class 1A Region 1, they drew a bye for the bi-district round, and advance to the Area round, playing Paducah at Floydada at 8 p.m. Friday, Feb. 19. The boys team will also make the playoffs, possibly as district runnerup, but as of

Tuesday afternoon they were still waiting for other districts to finish before playoff games are scheduled.

Tahoka's Lady Bulldogs (17-9, 9-3 and district runnerup) beat Ft. Hancock for the Bi-District title in Class 2A Region 1 playoffs and will face Christoval in the Area round. The Area match is set for 6:30 p.m. this Friday at Big Spring High School gym. Tahoka boys' team are also in the playoffs, and were awaiting the outcomes of Tuesday night games for seeding and playoff schedules.

O'Donnell's Lady Eagles are the District Champions in District 11 in Class 1A Region II playoffs, drawing a bye for the bi-district round and scheduled to play Marfa in the Area round at 6 p.m. Friday at Fort Stockton High School.

Warrant Roundup coming soon: Pay now or go to jail

A Warrant Roundup will be conducted across the state of Texas soon, according to Lynn County Justice of Peace Nancy Guilliams, but there is some good news: anyone with outstanding warrants has a chance to pay up now, to avoid jail time.

Judge Guilliams told *The News* that a statewide warrant roundup will be conducted on Saturday, March 5, and that many who have had outstanding warrants will find a law enforcement officer on their doorstep to arrest them and take them to jail. The roundup is designed to target thousands of defendants statewide with traffic, parking, city ordinance, penal code, and higher charge warrants from participating jurisdictions.

In Lynn County alone, Judge Guilliams says she has approximately \$17,000 in local warrants to collect, some dating as far back as the year 1998, but these warrants are all going to be in the upcoming roundup.

Numerous counties, justices of the peace, constables and municipalities of all sizes are participating in the 2016 Great Texas Warrant Roundup beginning Saturday, March 5. Notices have been sent by mail by participating entities.

"If you have an outstanding warrant, even if it was several years ago, you now have two choices: pay it now, or go to jail," she said. "If anyone is aware they have an outstanding warrant, or if they are not sure, please call my office as soon as possible, at 806-561-4337, to find out or to make arrangements to pay. You will be given one last opportunity to pay the warrant by March 5, plus any late fees that may have been incurred," she explained.

Early voting underway at Lynn County Courthouse

Early voting for the Republican Primary and Democratic Primary elections began on Tuesday, and continues through Friday, Feb. 26. Early voting will be conducted in the first floor Election Room of the courthouse, between the hours of 8:30 a.m.-12:00 noon and 1:00-5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. Voters are reminded to bring their voter registration card and a photo ID when coming to the polls, whether at early voting or on Election Day, March 1.

Voters may mark ballots in only one Primary election, either the Republican or Democratic Primary. Two local elections will be decided in the Republican Primary, including the Lynn County Sheriff's race, and the Precinct 1 Commissioner seat. Both races have two candidates each on the Republican ticket, with no candidates on the Democratic ticket.

Additionally, the District Attorney's race for the 106th Judicial District will be decided in the Republican Primary, with no Democratic candidates to face the winner of the Republican Primary in the November election. Three candidates are vying for the DA seat. The 106th Judicial District includes Lynn, Dawson, Gaines and Garza counties.

The big race, of course, is the U.S. Presidential race, with many candidates vying for the Republican and Democratic nominations. Thirteen candidates are on the Republican ballot, and eight candidates are listed on the Democratic ballot.

The congressional seat currently held by Randy Neugebauer is also hotly contested on the Republican ticket, for U.S. Representative District 19. Nine candidates are listed for the seat on the Republican ticket, and the winner will not face a Democratic candidate in November.

Both the Republican and Democratic Primary ballots have propositions for voters to consider, with four propositions on the Republican ballot and six referendums on the Democratic Primary ballots.

Bi-District Champions! Lady Bulldogs win Bi-District, set for Area round Friday night

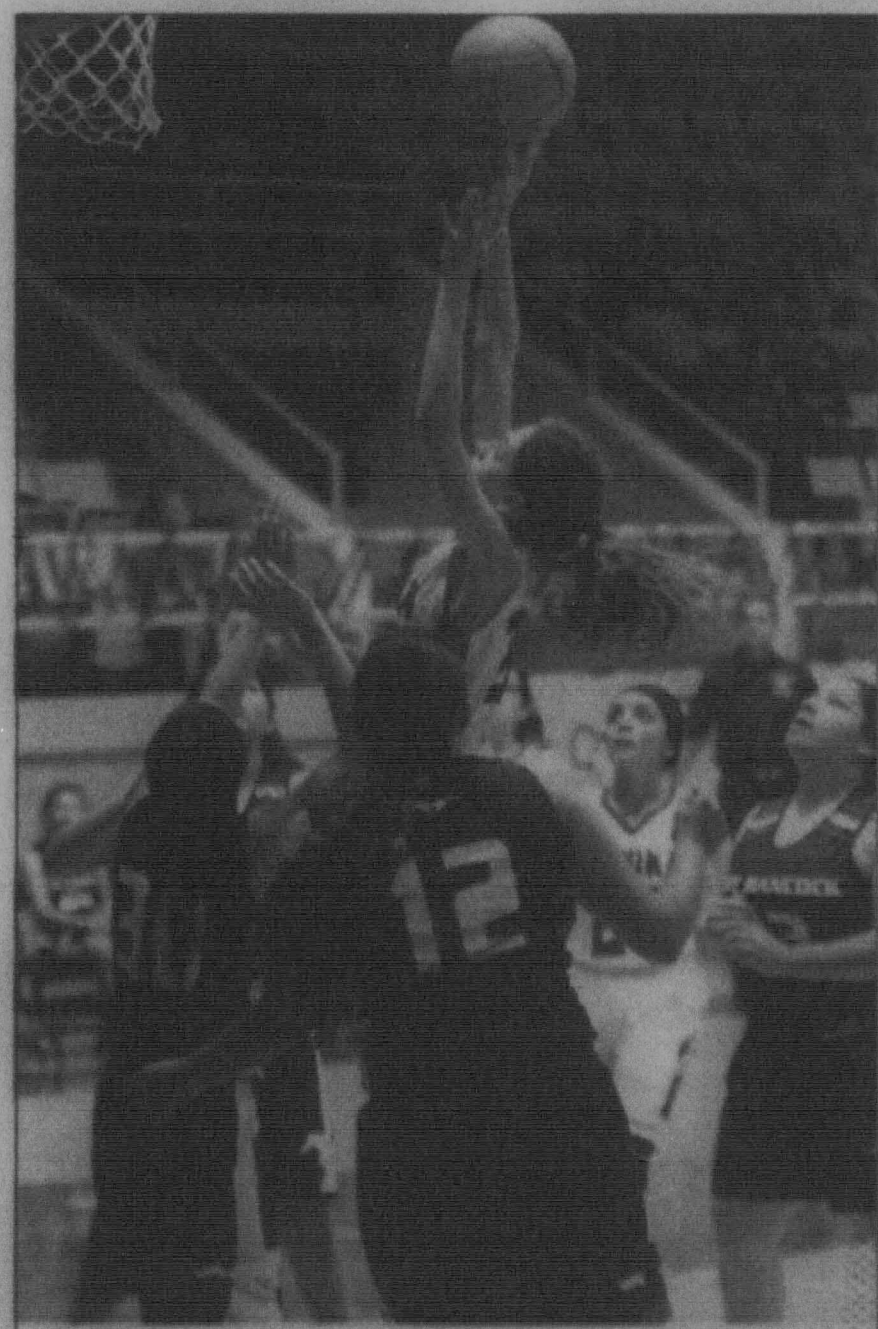
Tahoka's defense shut down the Lady Mustangs from Ft. Hancock Monday night in Bi-District playoff action, as the Lady Bulldogs easily claimed the Bi-District trophy with a 72-32 win to advance to the Area round in 2A Region 1 playoffs. The Lady Bulldogs (17-9, 9-3 and district runnerup) now face Christoval, who was undefeated in District 8 (14-0, 22-5 overall) and beat Hawley 66-30 in bi-district to advance to the Area round. The Area match is set for 6:30 p.m. this Friday at Big Spring High School gym.

Under the direction of Coach Adrian Gutierrez, Tahoka's Lady Bulldogs outclassed the Ft. Hancock team in every area, limiting the Lady Mustangs to only 7 points in the entire first half of the game with terrific de-

fensive play, as the offense racked up 22 points in the first quarter and another 17 in the second to lead 39-7 at the half.

Tahoka played from the bench starting in the first period, and throughout the game, allowing every team member time on the court in the playoff game. Tahoka outscored, out-rebounded, and outplayed for the easy win, leading 61-16 at the end of the third, and ahead by 40 points at the final buzzer.

Two Lady Bulldogs scored in double figures, including Maci Dimak with 13, and Clarissa Lopez with 12; also scoring were Yuli Villegas 8, Caitlynn Adams 8, Miranda DeLeon 8, Natalie Stice 7, Olivia Hammonds 6, Hannah Hammonds 4, Kelsi Hilger 4, and Tanya Stroope 2.

WHEN THE weather people tell us that "conditions will not be favorable for outside activities" at this time of year we know we're in for a bad day. March and April are months that we could mostly do without, since that's when we have the choking dirt storms and winds unfit for humans to get out in.

Brad Tooley over at the Slatonite said once that he could tell how hard the wind was blowing because when it reached a certain velocity, his storehouse blew down. I can do the same with my fence; every time it gets over 60 mph in gusts, a section of fence blows down. It has to be repaired at least once a year.

Maybe it's not true that a guy in a submarine at the bottom of White River Lake couldn't keep the dust from blowing in during such days as we had April 2, but dirt sure does seem to get into everything, and make living not so pleasant for a few hours.

There are some good things about dust storms however. If you hunt Indian artifacts the big winds uncover them. If you are in a business selling air cleaners for cars or shampoo for people, you're going to do well after the storms.

And this week, when couple of people asked me when I was going to pay them, I told them the big wind storm last week blew all the unpaid bills out of our office.

Spring sports out here are courageous folks who like to demonstrate they have a lot of sand in their craw. In a 440 relay the other day, one kid headed east ran his 110 yards in 5 seconds, but he knocked out his teammate trying to make a handoff at 40 mph (and the boy headed west on his lap of the race was still out there Monday).

I drove to Amarillo last Friday during the murderous wind and dirt storm. At a meeting up there I was wearing a name tag, and someone asked me where Tahoka is. I told them that when I left home it was 30 miles south of Lubbock, moving east at about 50 miles per hour.

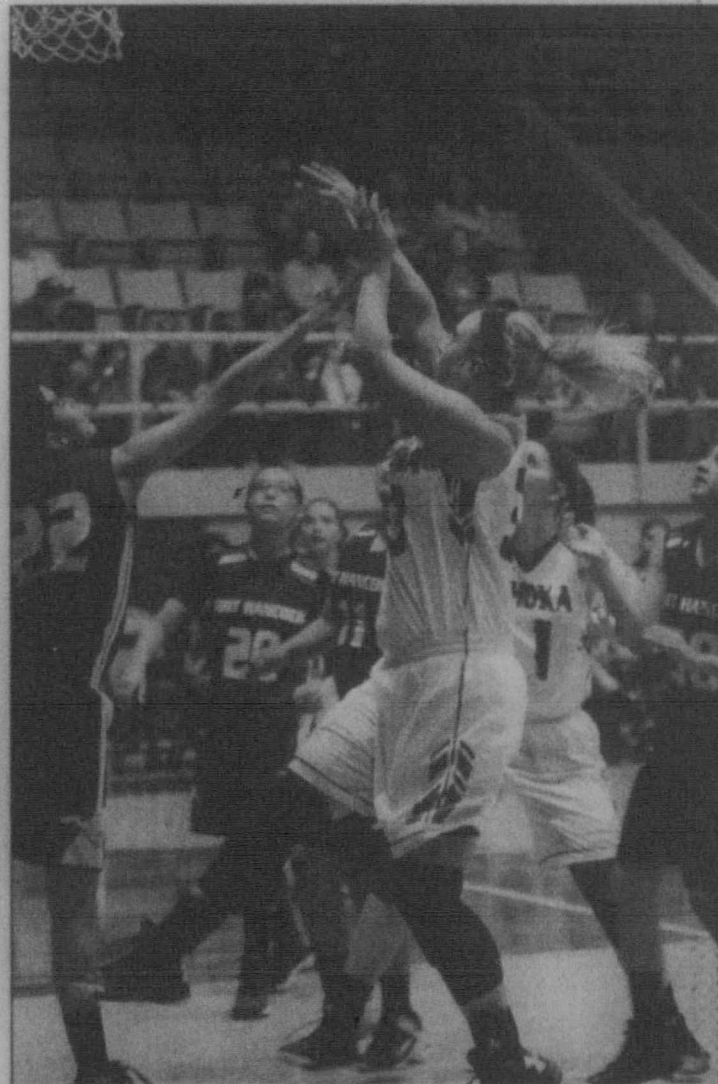

Flashing yellow arrow:

Tahoka's only traffic light being upgraded

The Texas Department of Transportation is set to install new traffic signals with flashing yellow left turn arrows at the US 380/Loop 472 intersection (Lockwood & Main St., which is not only Tahoka's sole traffic signal, but also the only traffic signal in all of Lynn County) as part of an effort to upgrade the signals to meet Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) standards. The traffic signals are scheduled to be installed and set to go online on Thursday, February 18.

"The flashing-yellow, left-turn arrows were adopted in 2009 by the FHWA as the national standard for permissive left-turn signals," said Frank Phillips, P.E., TxDOT Lubbock District director of transportation operations. "The signals are now being used by TxDOT

and local jurisdictions across the state."

Motorists should be aware that oncoming traffic has a green light when the flashing yellow arrow is displayed.

"The flashing yellow-arrow, left-turn signals are gradually being phased in to replace the traditional circular green signals," Phillips added. "The flashing yellow arrow is being used to indicate traffic is permitted to turn left but must still yield to oncoming traffic. This is different from the old green arrow signal which means traffic turning left is protected and has the right of way."

Flashing yellow arrows will continue to be retrofitted where appropriate at existing signals when traffic control equipment is upgraded or replaced.

Work will take place weather permitting.

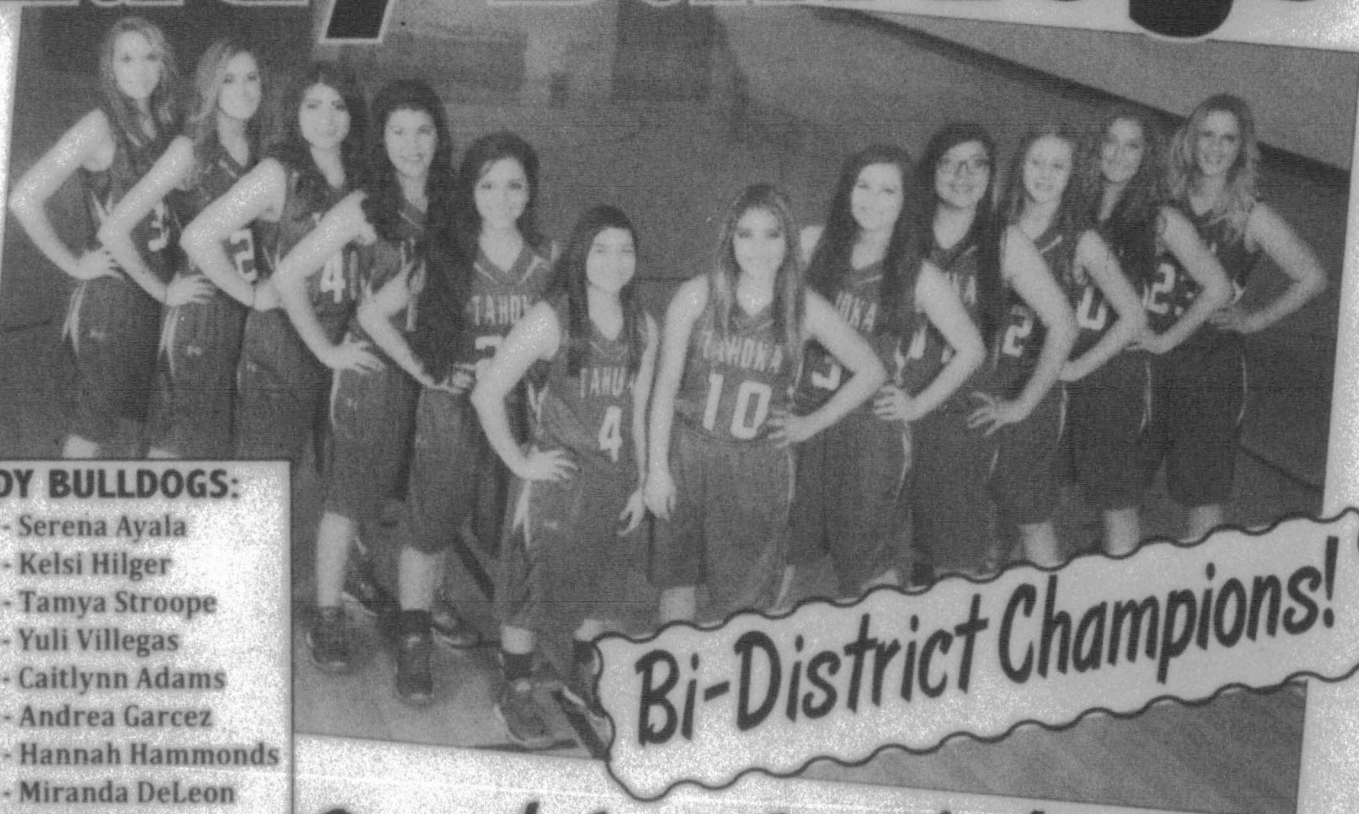

Theft, criminal mischief reported to officers here

On Sunday, Manuel Arrizola reported to Tahoka Police that someone had stolen two toolboxes containing tools from his pickup bed while it was parked in front of his residence. No value was listed on the contents that included a 150-piece Stanley ratchet set, a 20-piece wrench set, and assorted sockets.

Lynn County Jail held 35 inmates during the past week, including 11 for Lynn County, 20 for Ector County, and 4 for Dawson County. Local charges included one for public intoxication, and one for driving while intoxicated.

Texas Prepaid Tuition Program enrollment deadline approaches

The Texas Tuition Promise Fund, the state's prepaid college tuition program, allows participants to purchase tuition units based on current prices and avoid future increases in the cost of undergraduate tuition and school-wide required fees at Texas public colleges and universities.

"Families concerned about the rising costs of higher education can lock in today's rates at Texas public colleges and universities by prepaying tuition and school-wide required fees through the Promise Fund," Hegar said. "The plan has a range of payment options that gives Texas parents and grandparents the flexibility they need to plan ahead and provide future opportunities for their children and grandchildren."

Under the plan, families can prepay tuition and school-wide required fees for a four-year degree, two years of community college or just a few semesters at Texas public colleges and universities by purchasing tuition units.

Enrollment in the program at 2015-16 prices will close Feb. 29. This deadline extends to July 31 for children younger than 1. The next annual enrollment period begins Sept. 1, with new contract prices based on Texas public college costs for the 2016-17 academic year.

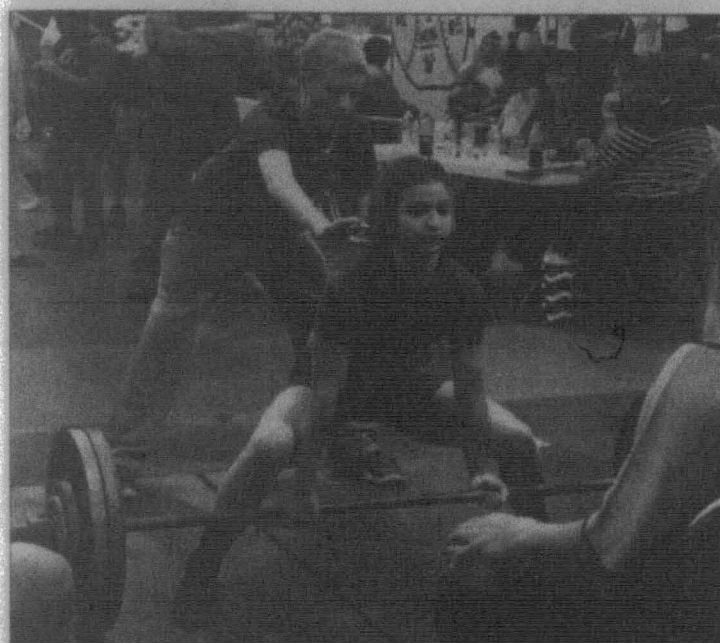

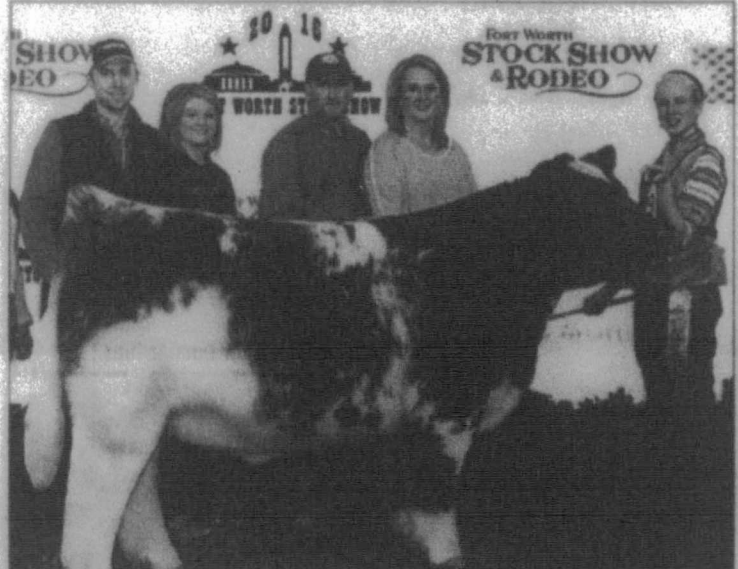
