School youth offer skills, hard work in 'TISD Community Service Day'

Everyone, from the little pre-kindergarten children though high school youth, had projects that benefitted the community on the Tuesday before Thanksgiving. It was their way of giving back to the community that supports them.


School classwork was set aside for the day, as students, teachers and other staff undertook projects and activities that would show their community that they care. It was very fitting that the community day was scheduled for the Tuesday before Thanksgiving.

In the elementary grade levels, students made goodie bags for first responders and to the senior citizens center, visited senior citizens and shut-ins, helped pick up trash at the mini-park, Little League ballpark and county

showbarn, and visited businesses in town, bringing workers a cup of hot chocolate along with handwritten notes of appreciation for their business.

The Middle School students broke up into groups of 7-10 students along with a teacher and some helpful parents and were assigned streets to clean.

Lynn County Commissioners met in regular session on Monday, November 28, at 9:00 a.m. in the courthouse basement courtroom, discussing finance options for the courthouse renovation project, and hearing information about a new wind energy project in Lynn County. Commissioners Keith Wied, Don Blair and Larry Durham were present with County Judge Mike Braddock presiding. Commissioner John Hawthorne was absent.

Vince Viaille with Specialized Public Finance, Inc. presented information about Certificates of Obligation for the courthouse renovation project.

"As I understand it, Lynn County's portion of the renovation project amounts to \$4,114,067, but the county already has \$1,390,000 in the restoration fund, as well as another \$1,000,000 in the general fund that has been designated for this project." Viaille said. The difference remaining for financing is \$1,724,067, plus \$70,000 in costs of issuance.

He presented information on financing \$1,795,000 in certificates of obligation, and commissioners voted to give notice of intention to issue certificates of obligation (CO) to be published in the newspaper for two consecutive weeks. Commissioner Wied made the motion, Durham seconded, and Wied, Durham and Blair, as well as Judge Braddock, voted in favor. Viaille said that he could present the CO bids in January and the county would most likely receive the funds by the end of February.

A new wind energy project is in the planning stages that will involve Lynn and Garza Counties. Staked Plains is a multi-phase wind project in Lynn and Garza counties being developed by Lincoln Clean Energy. The first phase, Tahoka Wind, is expected to be approximately 300MW, and is anticipated to be online by the end of


Eric Barnett, Director of Development with Lincoln Clean Energy, was present to visit with the court to discuss reinvestment zones in Lynn County for the new wind-energy project. He showed a map for the Staked Plains Energy Center Project Rein-Zone with Lincoln

Clean Energy, and explained that land leases for the wind energy project are currently being considered.

The project will encompass approximately 340,000 acres of land in Lynn and Garza counties with up to four phases in the project. The first phase of the project is in Lynn County, where we are currently working on land leases mostly south of Hwy 380, but we will be working in the northern areas as well," Barnett said.

In other business, commissioners approved renewing an agreement with CIRA for internet and website service.

Judge Braddock informed the court that the Livestock Association wanted to purchase metal pens, insulation for the show barn and a new overhead door for the south entrance. It was suggested that Lynn County auction the old wooden pens and use that money for some of the improvements.





Tahoka ISD gets perfect score for financial accountability practices

Tahoka Independent School District earned a perfect score in financial accountability, scoring 100 in the Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas (FIRST) rating. Dr. George Mc-Farland, Superintendent, presented the information in a public hearing held just prior to last Tuesday night's board meeting.

"This is a financial accountability system that scores districts in their financial practices (similar to how a district gets scored academically by STA- AR scores). The scores range from 0-100. Tahoka received a "Superior" rating with a perfect score of 100," the superinten-

The regular board meeting began at 6:30 p.m., with Board President Dr. Cathy Box presiding and trustees Scott Dimak, Clay Taylor, and Matt Woodley present. Three trustees were absent: Jim Bingham, Doug Green, and Jon Luna.

partnerships with the district: Tahoka Housing Authority (certificate accepted by Cal Huffaker and Bill Miller), and Tahoka Rotary (accepted by Blake Moore). Matt Woodley, trustee, made those presentations. Campus principals Christa

Ritchey, Jeff Perez and Kelly Kieth gave campus reports, Athletic Director Brandon Hopper gave an athletics report, and teachers Amy Izzard and Whitney Wilson gave a report on FCCLA. Christa Ritchey recognized teachers Crystal Pledger, Jynna Bass, and Emilia Garcia (sponsors for the Art club), and they recognized Art Club member Marlie Scott. Also from the elementary were students Tripp Hall and Zephaniah Avila to present their Leader In Me leadership traits to the board. Jeff Perez zed his campus' "Dif. ference Maker of the Month" as Carroll Rhodes, TISD Band director. Mr. Rhodes recognized Jordan Fowler as the student of the month in the High School. Kelly Kieth recognized the MS teacher of the month, Amy Rodriguez (7th grade ELA). Amy recognized Ryan Olivan as the student of the month for the

middle school The board heard a presentation regarding the district's annual financial audit, presented from Ryan King of Terry & King, CPAs, P.C. The audit showed that the district increased its fund balance by \$581,138 over the 2015-16 fiscal year. The audit revealed neither deficiencies in internal controls nor any material weaknesses in operations

The board entered into closed session at 7:30 pm, and reconvened in open session at 7:55.

Trustees gave approval to enter into an agreement with Ines Corral of Corral Environmental Consulting to perform consulting services for Asbestos Abatement for the Tahoka ISD 2016 Bond projects.

The board approved a textbook committee to review texts that will be considered for approval for usage beginning the 2017-18 school year. That committee consists of teachers Ben Freitag, Rebecca Rampy, Shelbie Hannum, Amy Izzard, Whitney Wilson, Cory Medulla, and Darybell Garcia.

The board approved the notice to file applications for a place on the ballot for the May 6, 2017 board election. The first day to file will be January 18, 2017.

Trustees approved supporting a legislative agenda for Tahoka ISD that the superintendent will support during the 2017 legislative session in Austin.

The next board meeting will be December 15, at 6:30 pm. Prior to that meeting the board will hold a public hearing at 6:00 pm regarding the district's Texas Academic Performance Report (TAPR).

Landowners may vote on Referendum to establish Texas Grain Indemnity Fund

The Texas Legislature has acted to allow the Texas Commissioner of Agriculture to conduct a referendum whether to establish a grain indemnity fund for the state of Texas, statute available at http://www.statutes.legis.state.tx.us/Docs/AG/ htm/AG.41.htm#41.201

What is Texas Grain Producer Indemnity Fund? The purpose of the fund is to indemnify corn, grain sorghum, wheat, and soybean producers as a result of the failure of a grain buyer. If passed, producers of these four crops would pay 0.2% of the gross sales price of grain to the Texas Grain Producers Indemnity Board. Assessments would

begin February 1, 2017.

Who is eligible to vote? Persons eligible to vote are landowners and producers who have produced corn, grain sorghum, wheat, or soybeans in the last 36 months preceding the close of

Where will voting take place? Voting will be held at local Texas A&M AgriLife Extension County offices from December 5 through 9, 2016. Persons eligible to vote are landowners and producers who have produced corn, grain sorghum, wheat, or soybeans in the last 36 months preceding the close of voting. The Lynn County Extension Office will be open from 8:30 am - Noon and 1 pm - 5 pm from December 5

through December 9, 2016 for voting.


