for a $10-15 \%$ impact on mileage. If you can't avoid it, do not turn on the air conditioner as a
first response to the heat. Start yourdrive with the windows open to exhaust the hot air out of the rear windows and then put on the $\mathrm{A} / \mathrm{C}$ if needed. This will also work faster and more efficiently when turned on.
- Accelerate a little as you approach a hill, rather than hit-
ting the gas and switching gears once on the incline. - Lighten the car's load by removing all unnecessary items
