

Buffaloes Come Up Short, 37-20

The Cross Plains Buffaloes were unable to get a victory, despite only trailing 22-14 in the third quarter. The Buffaloes were outgained 379 total yards to 261. Evant had 19 first downs to 14 for the Buffaloes.

Leading in rushing was Thomas Estes 7-49 yards, Fili Vasquez 4-46 yards, Russell Thomas 9-45 yards, Sean Williams 7-30, Brice Bowden 4-10. Clay Koenig passed for 60 yards, he completed 5 of 19. Thomas Estes was 2 of 3 for 21 yards and 1 interception. Thomas Estes led all receivers

with 3 catches for 39 yards. Russell Thomas had 1 catch for 33 yards and a touchdown. Mitchell Gibbs had a catch for 11 yards.

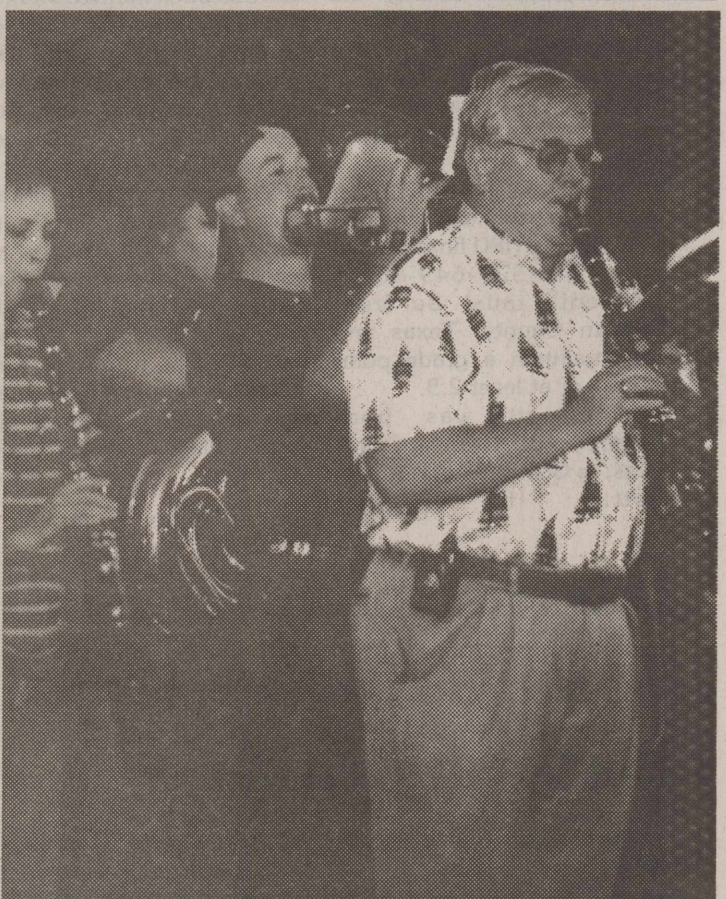

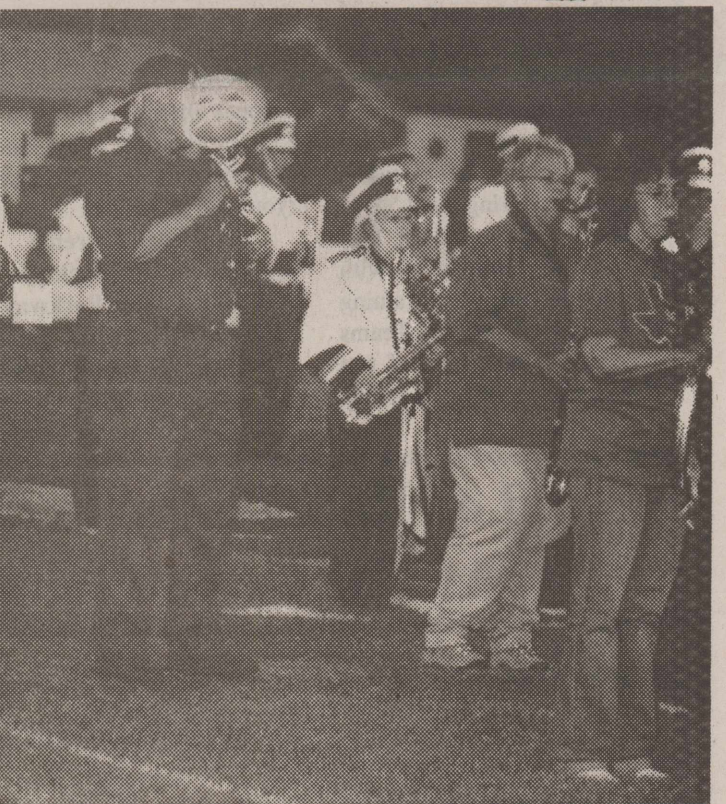

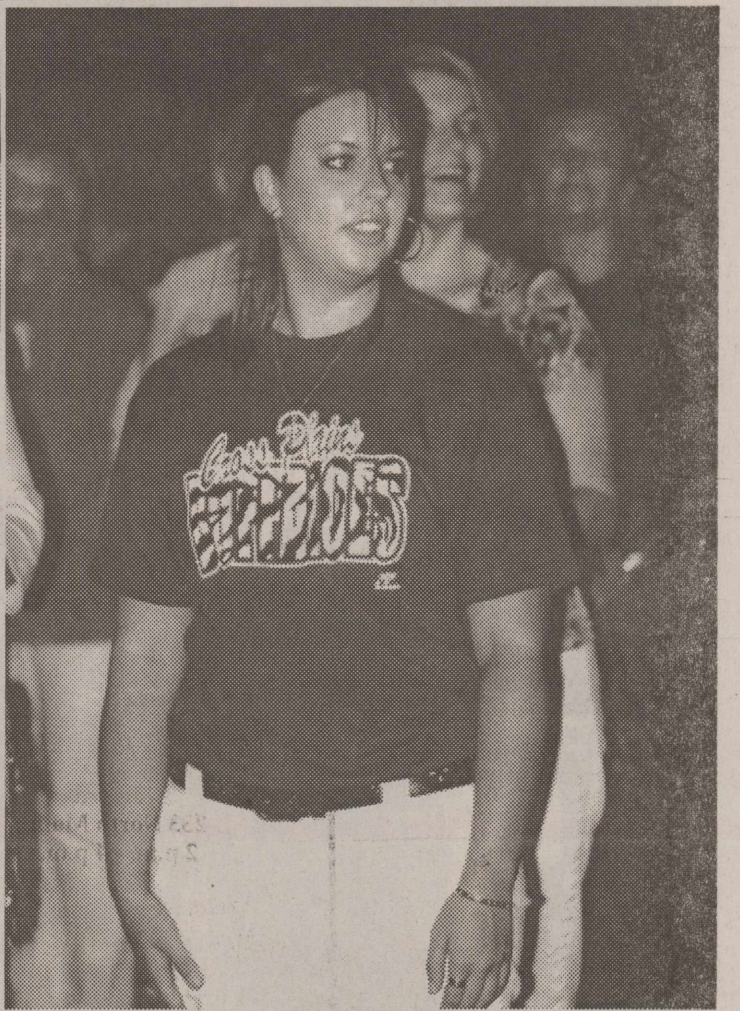

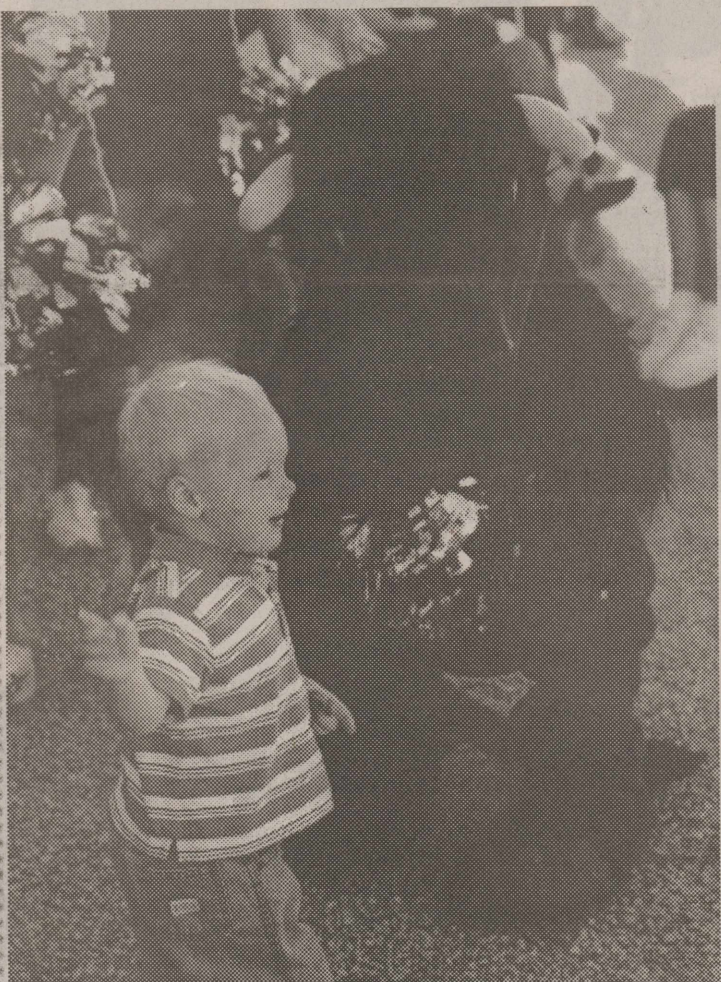

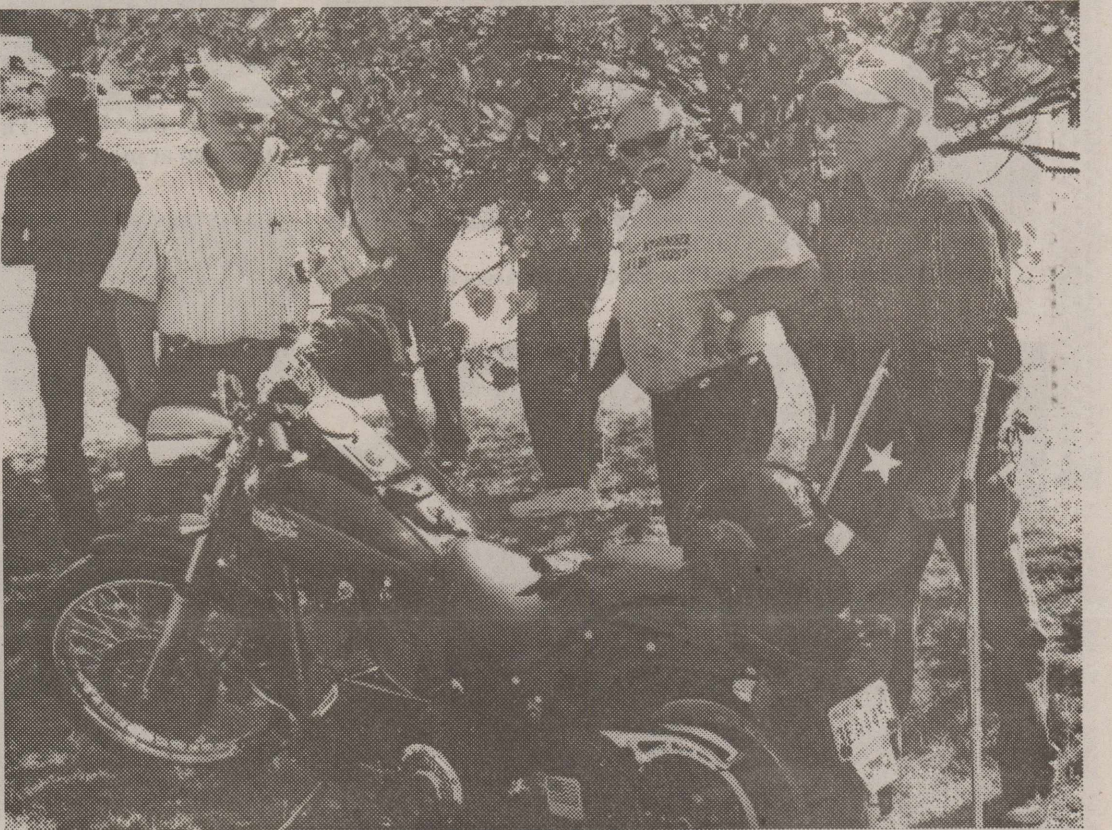

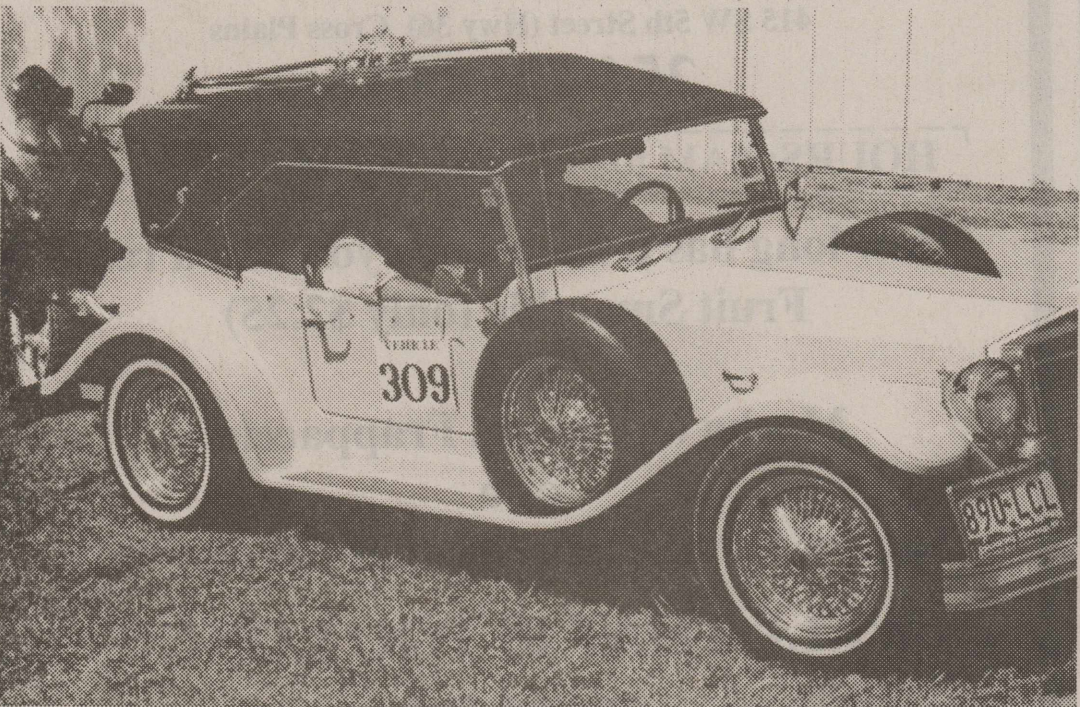
