"Don't Close Your Blinds"

The other day, my nine yearold son wanted to know why we were at war... My husband looked at our son and then looked at me. My husband and I were in the Army during the Gulf War and we would be honored to serve and defend our Country again today. I knew that my husband would give him a good explanation. My husband thought for a few minutes and then told my son to go stand in our front living room window.

He said, "Son, stand there and tell me what you see? "I see trees and cars and our neighbor's houses," he replied.

"OK, now I want you to pretend that our house and our yard is the United States of America and you are President Busia.

Our son giggled and said,

"Now son, I want you to look out the window and pretend that every house and yard on this block is a different country," my husband said.

"OK Dad, I'm pretending."

"Now I want you to stand there and look out the window and pretend you see Saddam come out of his house with his wife, he has her by the hair and is hitting her. You see her bleeding and crying. He hits her in the face, he throws her on the ground, then he starts to kick her to death. Their children run out and are afraid to stop him, they are screaming and crying. They are watching this but do nothing because they are kids and they are afraid to their father. You see all of this, son...what do you do?"

"Dad?"

"What do you do son?"

"I'd call the police, Dad."

"OK. Pretend that the police are the United Nations. They take your call. They listen to what you know and saw but they refuse to help. What do you do then son?"

"Dad...but the police are supposed to help!" My son starts to whine.

"They don't want to son, because they say that it is not their place or your place to get involved and that you should stay

The Western Writers of American awarded Boggs a Spur Award for Best Short Fiction in 2002 for "A

"We lost 38 years worth of marriage things," Mrs. Crockett said. "It got everything!"

According to The Houston Chronicle, an estimated 117 homes were leveled and over 7,600 acres land were scorched. Mrs. Crockett remembered hearing a reporter say there was too much damage and Cross Plains would turn into a ghost

It is clear to residents that Cross Plains has little chance of becoming a ghost town. With the residential district rebuilding, and new businesses opening their doors, residents make it clear that it will take more than a fire close

Many residents, such as the Crocketts, were fortunate to receive insurance to help rebuild their homes. Others have received help from the government, volunteers from local churches, or have received a portion of the estimated \$1 million donated from charities, churches and individuals around the country.

The Crocketts are now rebuilding their home in the place it stood before. While they miss some things about their old home, they are thankful that they survived and are looking forward to moving into their new home by Christmas.

City Reminds Citizens of **Junked Vehicle Ordinance**

The City of Cross Plains would like to remind its citizens that the city has adopted an ordinance regulating the keeping of junked vehicles that are located in any place where they are readily visible from a public place or public right-of-way.

The ordinance states that such vehicles are detrimental to the safety and welfare of the general public, reduce the value of private property, invite vandalism, create fire hazards and constitute an unattractive nuisance creating a hazard to the health and safety of its citizens and are considered a public nuisance.

Therefore, the city council requests that its citizens remove any junked vehicles from their property or to completely enclose the vehicle within a building where it is not visible from the street or other public or private property, or maintain the vehicle in such a manner that they do not constitute a health hazard and are screened from ordinary public view by means of a fence.

If the citizens do not comply Clean out your garages with the ordinance, the city will have the vehicle removed from the property at the owner's expense.
