CHEMIST DECLARES SULPHU OUS FUMES IS AN EFFECT-IVE TREATMENT.

CINCINNATI, Ohio, April 14. Noted chemists from all parts of th United States sat spell bound th afternoon during an address delive ed by Dr. Edward Gudeman, a Cl cago chemist, during which he ma s preliminary announcement of who he declares to be effective treatme of tuberculosis in its earlier stage The announcement was made before the gathering of the American Che ical Society, which is meeting he

in annual session. He declared that the remedy w inhaling of sulphurous acid. Sulphourous acid consists of the fumes of burning sulphur. A dime's worth of sulphur, he said, is all that is necessary for a treatment. Dr. Gudeman intimated that there would be a later announcement in which Pipe! the actual results would be reported. In making his announcement. Dr Gudeman said:

"I predict tuberculosis, if not advanced beyond the first three stages, may be cured by direct chemical treatment within a reasonable time. I am making this as a preliminary

Later, in a public discussion of Gudeman's paper, he was asked by one of the convention delegates to give further details and he said: No Substance Will Cure.

"The government health bureau recently issued a paper in which it is declared that there isn't a product now on sale as cure for tuberculosis that is such a cure. That is true, but there is a substance, which if used correctly, will, according to the evidence of vital statistics, prove very effective. This substance is sulphurous acid gas. The treatment can be given through inhalation.

"There are several cases to my knowledge where it has been a cure. It is the only gas that has the property of penetrating intercelular tissues. It is a well known fact that there is very little tuberculosis in the vicinity of sulphuric acid factories.

"At first, the treatment is very disagreeable. It makes you cough and sneeze.

Dr. Gudeman said this treatment can be applied by any one in his the frequency of the treatment depending on the needs of a patient. The speaker declared that, while the \$50,000 TO WORKMAN sulphurous acid treatment was going on, the patient should keep up fresh air and pure food treatment.

"The government health bu recently issued a paper in which it is declared that there isn't a pro duct now on sale as cure for tuber culosis that is such a cure. That is true, but there is a substance, which if used correctly, will, according to the evidence of vital statistics, prove very effective. This substance is sulphurous acid gas. The treatment can be given through in-

"There are several cases to my knowledge where it has been a cure. It is the only gas that has the property of penetrating intercelular tissues. It is a well known fact that there is very little tuberculosis in the vicinity of sulphuric acid factories.

"At first, the treatment is very disagreeable. It makes you cough and sneeze."




