

## Ban back on

Callahan County Commission- order may be enforced by any ers voted to reinstate the countywide Burn Ban effective immediately.

The commissioners' court took the action Tuesday, March 17th during a regular commissioners' court meeting held in the County Courtroom at the County Courthouse in Baird.

On a motion by Commissioner Bryan Farmer and a second by Commissioner Tom Windham, the commissioners' court voted 4-0 to reinstate the countywide Burn Ban.

The Burn Ban order follows:

### CALLAHAN COUNTY, TEXAS ORDER PROHIBITING OUTDOOR BURNING

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 240.906 of the Local Government Code, the Callahan County Commissioners Court had found that dry conditions in the unincorporated areas of Callahan County create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning; and, whereas, such a finding authorizes the issuance of an order which prohibits or restricts outdoor burning.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDERED that the following regulations are hereby established for all unincorporated areas of Callahan County, Texas. (1) Action prohibited:

A. A person violates this order if he or she knowingly, intentionally or recklessly burns any combustible material outside of an enclosure which serves to contain all flames and/or sparks, or orders such burning by oth-

B. A person violates this order if he or she knowingly, intentionally or recklessly engages in any activity outdoors which could allow flames or sparks that could result in a fire, or orders such activities by others. (2) Enforcement:

A. A violation of this order is a Class C Misdemeanor. B. This must be available.

to outdoor burning activities related to public health and safety that are authorized by the Texas Natural Resources Conservation Commission for firefighter training; public utility, natural gas pipeline, or mining operations, or, harvesting of agriculture

Funeral services for Odell Elrod, 88, of Brownwood were held at 11 a.m. Friday, March 20, 2009, at the Davis-Morris Funeral Home Chapel with Dick Williams and Bill Slaymaker officiating. Interment was held at 3 p.m. Friday in the Mt. Hope Cemetery

Odell C. Elrod passed peacefully from this life on Tuesday, March 17, 2009.

Odell was born on November 19, 1920, in Big Spring, Texas. His family later moved to Pioneer, Texas, where he completed high school. It was in Pioneer that he met Lorraine Shirley, who would eventually become his wife of 68 years. 





### TMCN Luncheon in DeLeon 3 charged with arson **TEXAS MIDWEST** in area wildfires

Three Eastland County residents have been charged with five counts of arson and one count of organized criminal activity in connection with a series of area wildfires Cisco, Clyde, Coleman, that destroyed five structures in Eastland and Callahan Counties.

> Forestry officials were still fighting the blazes, which have burned at least 270 acres.

> The Texas Forest Service said in a statement Monday, March 23rd that Christina Utley, 20, of Ranger, and Brian Freeman, 23, and Michael Thomas, 24, both of Cisco,

were being held at the Eastland County Jail on bonds totaling \$87,500. A jail official said Monday night he did not know whether the three, who were arrested Sunday, March 22nd had attorneys.

Forestry officials said the three initially were arrested on charges of fighting and public intoxication but the investigation subsequently turned to Sunday's deliberately set fires after the Cisco Police Department found suspicious items in their vehicle.






