**Jacob (Jake) Estes** will deliver the Valedictory Address. He is the son of David and Mindy Estes.

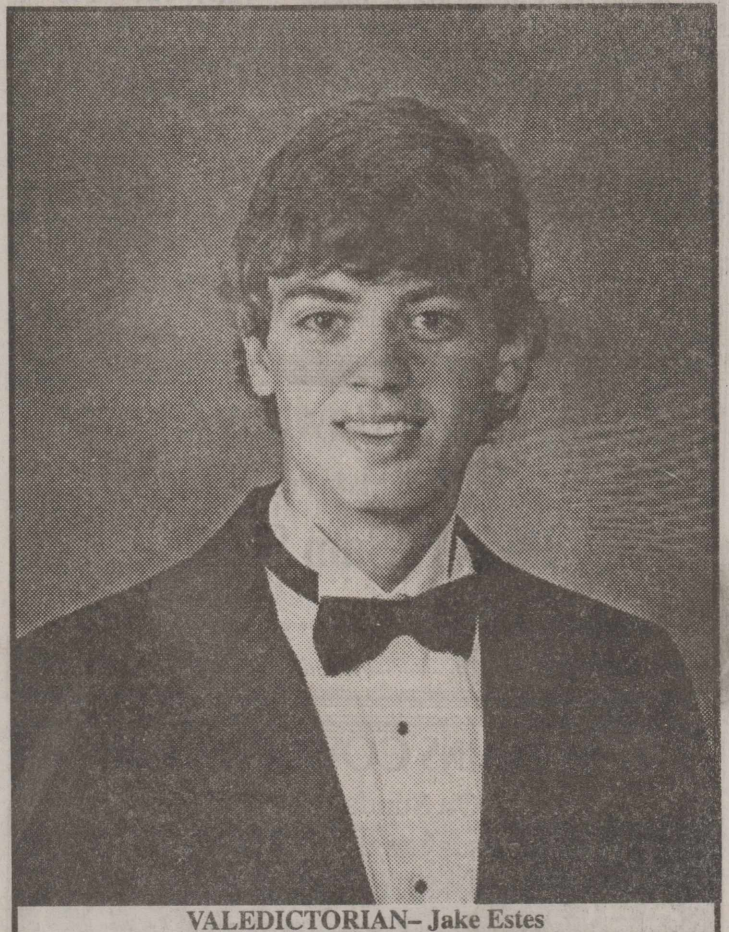
Having maintained the position of **Top Scholastic Average** for the past four years has garnered him the highest award. He has been a member of the National Honor Society for three years.

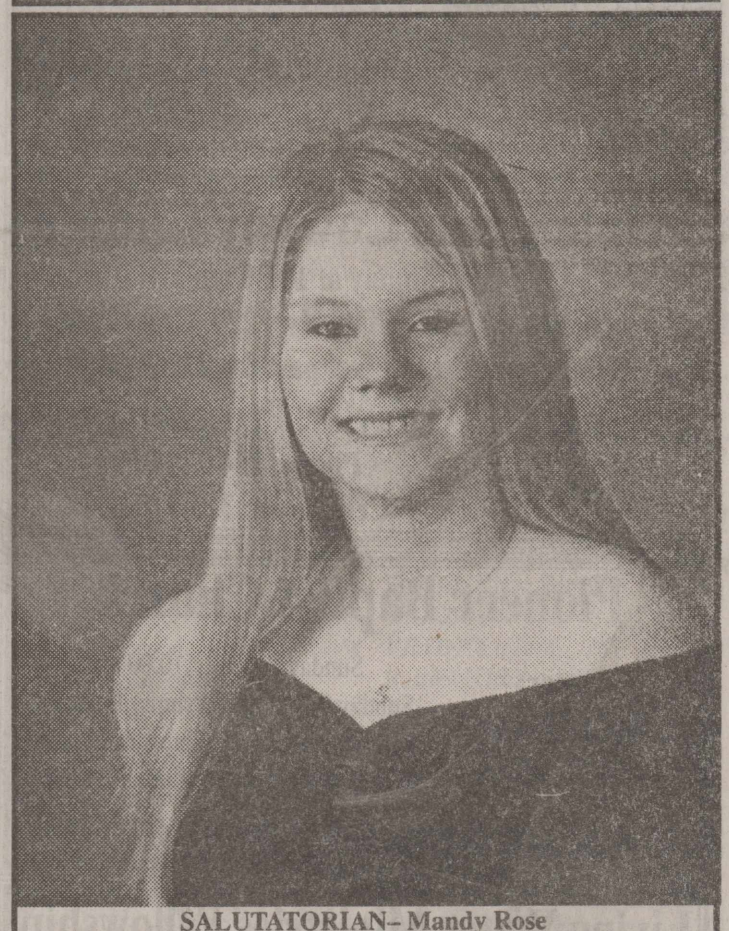

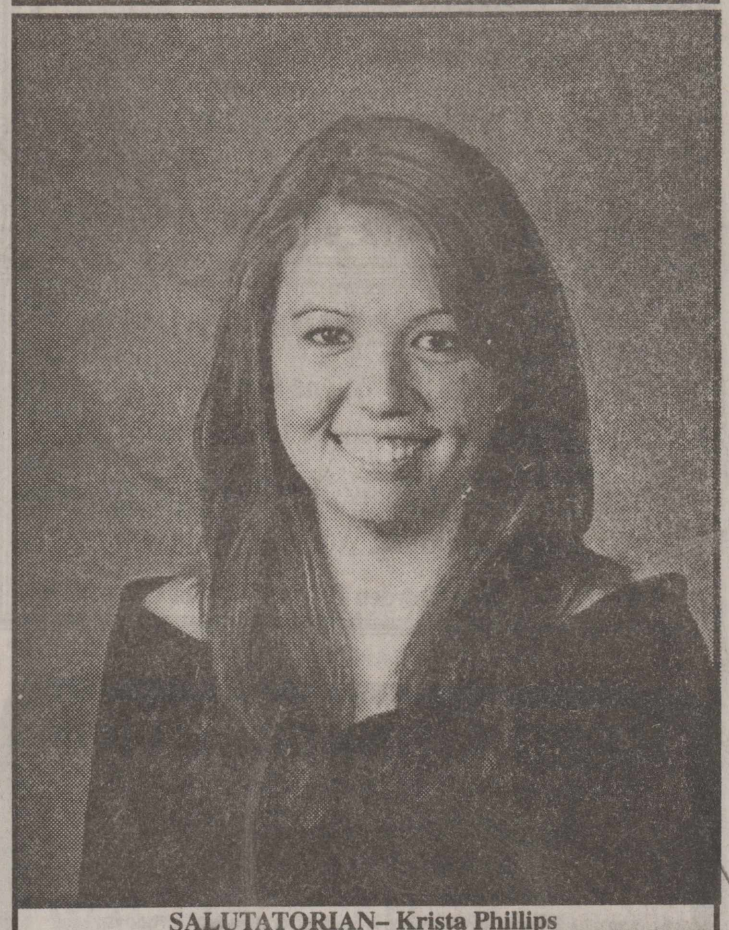

## Passing City Property Tax First on Council Agenda

The Cross Plains City Council held a regular meeting Tuesday evening, May 12th. Discussion was held concerning

the passage of a resolution entering into a contract with the Callahan County Tax Assessor/Collector for the purpose of assessing and collecting property tax for the City of Cross Plains. After the reading of the contract, Peg Terrell moved to enter into the contract with Callahan County. Bob Kirkham seconded and the motion carried.

AEP recently requested from the Public Utility Commission for permission to approve its deployment plan, meaning it seeks a ruling from the Commission that the meters it proposes to deploy meet all functionality requirements embodied in the Commission's rule and that the Commission approve a two-step surcharge for AEP's residential customers to pay a \$3.25 per month charge for four years and the charge decreases to \$2.71 per month for seven additional years.

Their request also states that all customers will pay the infrastructure surcharge whether or not they have received an advanced metering system. Jerry Casle moved to pass a resolution authorizing the intervention in AEP's request through cooperation with a steering committee of cities served by AEP. Bob Kirkham seconded and

motion carried.

Era Lee Hanke met with the council on behalf of the EDC. Ms. Hanke reported that the EDC had three proposals that have been approved for funding through the EDC and asked the council for approval.

Hanke reported that the EDC has approved paying 1/2 of the rent for six months (\$225 monthly) for Montgomery Automotive in order to help him get established in his new place of business. Also approved for funding is Hardwick Nursery in the amount of \$2500 loan and \$2500 grant with the stipulations that Hardwick's must remain open year round and at the end of the first year Mr. Hardwick will owe the loan at 3% interest and may pay it out in monthly installments or may pay in one lump sum.

The last proposal was for Pancake's Home Stitchin' for a \$6500 loan/grant at 60% loan and 40% grant at 3% interest using the Screen Printing Machine as collateral with a three year payout with payment beginning October 1, 2009. Motion was made and passed.

Debbie Gosnell informed the Council that the generator

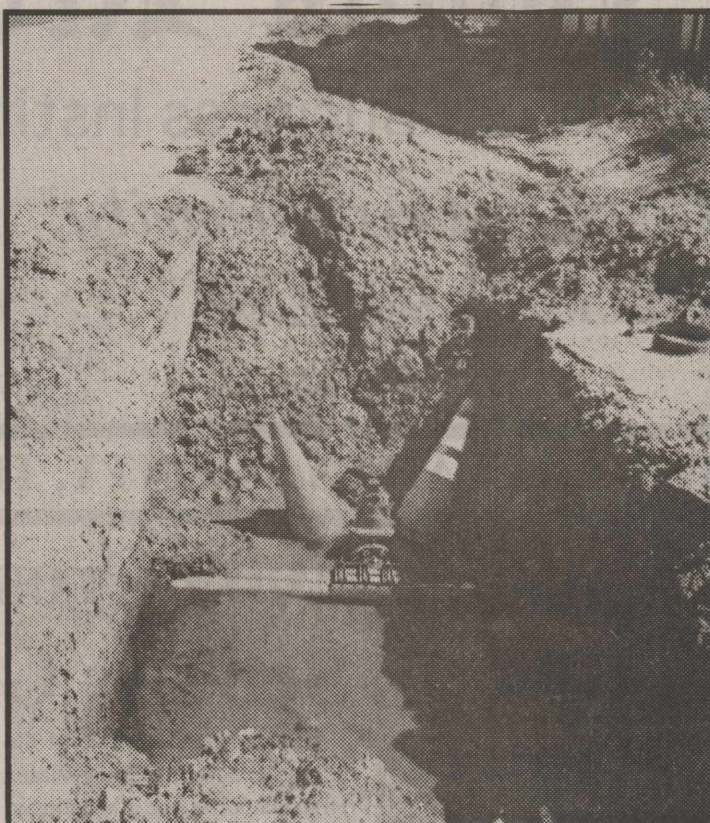

required as backup power for the wastewater treatment plant has been purchased and is in the process of getting the wiring done. All aspects are expected to be completed by the June deadline.

Kerry Mann met with the council on behalf of the Planning and Zoning Commission. He advised the council that the Commission had the following recommendations for changes to the existing Zoning Ordinance. He requested that the council make the following changes: Section 21-1 to change the number of members from "seven" to "six" and from "restricted to citizens of the City" to "active members of the community." At the end of paragraph 21-1, add the sentence, "The commission may go into executive session for discussion, but may not vote while in such state." Section 24-1 change from "citizens of the city" to "active members of the community." Section 24-2, third paragraph, insert the word "certified" to the statement "and shall mail certified notices." Section 24-3, section b, number 2, insert the word "comprehensive" to the statement "intent and purpose of the comprehensive plan." Section 25-5 requested change in the amount of the filing fee from \$25 to \$100 for the first one hundred feet and from \$10 to \$25 for each additional feet, and to add the following statement to the end of the paragraph, "and said fee is received into the planning and zoning budget." The last requested change would be that anytime the language "building inspector" or "inspector of buildings" is used to add "code enforcement officer." Peg Terrell moved to adopt the new wording into the zoning ordinance. The motion was seconded and carried.

John Lambert, with House Calls, was present for the meeting to present a proposal for a new phone system. Mr. Lambert went over the many features of the system with the council and stated that the system had a lot of room for growth if needed. The phone system would allow the city to transfer calls using a drag and drop method from their computers.

Calls could be transferred from city hall to places such as the Fire Dept., if someone dialed the city accidentally, or even to someone's cell phone without having to give the number out. Mr. Lambert thanked the council for their time and consideration of his proposal.

Discussion was held concerning the office hours for City Hall. Debbie Gosnell requested that City Hall be allowed to remain open during the lunch hour and close at four instead of five. City employees feel these hours would better accommodate the citizens. Also requested was permission to close at 1 p.m. on Friday in an effort to have uninterrupted work time. Jerry Cassle moved, Bob Kirkham seconded with Ray Purvis voting for, Peg Terrell and Audrey Purvis voting nay. Motion carried. Mrs. Gosnell is

to advertise the new office hours until July 1, 2009 before going into effect.

Debbie advised the council that the CP EMS service has approached her about allowing the Police Department to carry a defibrillator in their patrol car due to the fact that at times they are the first responder to an incident. George Matthews explained that the defibrillator is extremely smart and will not allow a person to be shocked whose heart is working properly or has already passed away. By general consent the matter was tabled until the next meeting to gather more information.

Peg Terrell asked Jarrod Potter to update the council on the animal control issue of registering the animals and also having a rabies clinic for the community. Potter explained that he has talked with the Animal Control Officer at Clyde and they usually have the registration in conjunction with the rabies clinic. Explaining that when an animal owner brings their animal in to have it vaccinated, they are issued a registration at that time. An approximate cost on this service is \$12. Potter is to meet with the local vet to set up a date to hold the clinic.

Upon returning from executive session Bob Kirkham moved to accept Mary Jones' resignation and to hire Barbara Cook to replace her. Motion was seconded and carried.

Discussion was held at length concerning the Windstream Telephone Proposal and House Calls proposal. Jerry Cassle moved to purchase the phone system from Windstream and Gosnell to make sure the phones are wireless and headphone capable. Motion carried.

Motion was made and carried to pay the bills. By general consent the council approved the previous minutes as read along with approving the police and judge's reports.

The fact is that the animal agricultural picture is changing in our state and the interest is contagious as we are now seeing meat goat production in states all over our nation and abroad. The future of the meat goat industry is exciting and the purpose of this seminar is to update producers on the diversity of opportunities that exist in the meat goat industry.

The evening will begin with the Big Country Goat Producers catering a meal at 6:00 p.m. The program will begin at 7:00 p.m. with Dr. Frank Craddock, Extension Sheep & Goat Specialist from San Angelo giving a state of

Fairly often, we see male patients who experience menopausal symptoms just as some women do. The symptoms include hot flashes, night sweats, weight gain, loss of strength, decreases or lack of libido, forgetfulness, depression, insomnia, poor concentration, and a host of other symptoms such as bone loss mass.

When a man suffers from these symptoms, a testosterone deficiency can easily be diagnosed by a simple blood test. If the result shows a testosterone deficiency, there are a variety of treatments.

## Callahan County homeowners eligible for housing assistance through Texas Department of Housing & Community Affairs

Callahan County homeowners affected by the April 9th wildfires north of Eula are now eligible to receive assistance in regards to unmet housing needs from the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA).

Dear Judge Corn:

The Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA) is in receipt of a letter from Governor Rick Perry recognizing that a disaster occurred in Callahan County on April 9, 2009, due to wildfires and has been requested to provide assistance to eligible victims of the disaster in regards to unmet housing needs.

In accordance with Texas Administrative Code, Title 10, Part 1, Chapter 1, Subchapter A §1.19, the Department is pleased to inform you that deobligated HOME funds are available for disaster relief. The funds are awarded through the HOME Division's Owner-Occupied Housing Assistance Program to local entities such as cities and counties or their designated non-profits for distribution to individuals directly affected by the disaster. The program is designed to assist eligible homeowners to rehabilitate or reconstruct their existing home. Assisted homeowners must have earnings at or below 80% of the Area Median Family Income (AMFI), as defined by HUD, must occupy the property as their principal residence and must have been directly affected by the above referenced disaster. Depending on the household income of the eligible homeowner, the assistance provided is either in the form of a deferred, forgivable loan or a repayable loan made to the eligible homeowner.

The Texas Government Code (Section 2306.111(c)) requires that TDHCA administer 95% of HOME Program funds for the benefit of nonparticipating small cities and rural areas that do not qualify to receive funds under the Cranston-Gonzales National Affordable Housing Act directly from HUD. Five percent of the funds will be for the benefit of persons with disabilities who live in any area of this state. Due to the unavailability of funds for participating jurisdictions, funds for disaster relief will not be awarded in a participating jurisdiction.

The HOME Division is committed to assisting your community and households affected by disasters with the provision of safe, decent and sanitary housing. Please note you have until November 19, 2009, to apply for these funds.

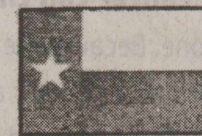

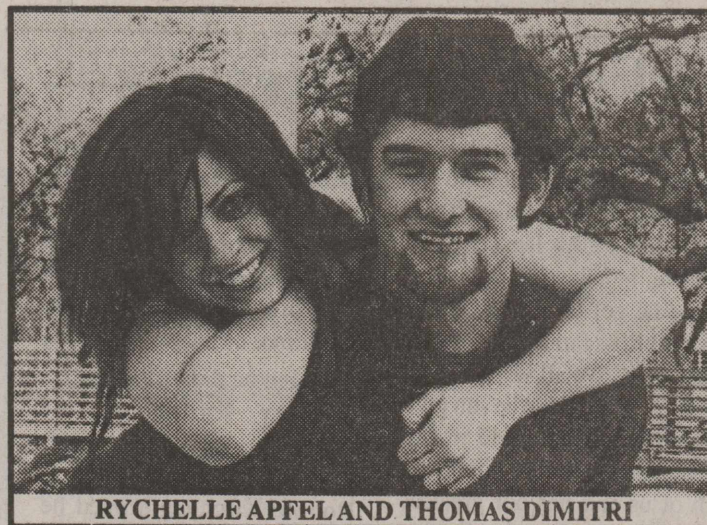
