Survivors include a sister, Mrs. Asa Robertson, and a brother Paul Hallcomb, both of Ozona.



Bids will be received by the Crockett county Commissioners Court at 2 p. m. on February 24 for construction of the fourth in a series of seven dams to be constructed on the Johnson Draw watershed for control of flood waters on this normally dry wash. Plans and specifications having been completed by Soil Conservation Service engineers, the local sponsoring agency, the County Commissioners Court, will award contract on Feb. 24, if satisfactory bids are received, for construction of the dam at Site No. 5, on the W. R. Baggett ranch north of Ozona.


