### CAMPAIGN STATIC

With a \$12 billion deficit for the current fiscal year and authorization to raise the temporary limit on the national debt to \$288 billion staring him in the face, President Eisenhower indicated to his latest press conference that he would campaign this fall for a Republican Congress to give the nation a more nearly balanced budget and sound money to give the nation "a good, healthy, thriving, progressive economy.

In the same session, the President noted that his "greatest disappointment" had been the cut of something over \$400 million in his \$3.9 billion foreign aid request. He also disappointed, he said, at the failure of Congress to enact legislation to curb racketeering in the labor-management field.

On the other hand, it will be recalled that his outstanding legislative victory was probably passage of the four year extension of the Reciprocal Trade program with increased authority to cut tariffs.

Thus, any electioneering the President may undertake for his party along the lines indicated will be reminiscent of his 1952 time-fora - change campaign promising a
