here's what the bills would do: No. 1. Make open to the public at all times all official meetings of all city councils, commissioners courts, legislative committees and state boards, commissions and agencies. Any officials found in violation would be liable to a \$100 to \$1,000 fine and removal from office, and the action taken in se-

cret would be invalid. No. 2. Make any official who prevents or refuses to permit inspection of a public record liable to a \$100 to \$500 fine and removal from office.

(Neither of the above measures would apply to any meeting or record not open to the public under present laws.)

No. 3. Make any person who takes and carries a public record with intent to destroy, suppress,
