Cotton Harvest At Standstill

Slow Crops Breaking Commissioner's Records In County

The 1971 cotton harvest, and perhaps the 1972, is reportedly one of the slowest on record for Bailey County. Joe Harbin at Bailey County Electric reports that as of December 1, only 3,798 bales of cotton have been ginned at the 14 gins in the rural areas Bailey County

Electric serves. There are three other gins in the county. Harbin said that this was the slowest ginning he could remember in a number of years in the county.

Early estimates predicted that between 40,000 and 45,000 bales would be ginned in the county. Around 90 percent of the cotton is still in the fields in Bailey County and with more wet cold weather setting in this week, it could be another week before strippers could get into the fields.

In regular action, the court paid bills, discussed current business and made the distributions of the check received recently from Bert Blair of the Muleshoe National Wildlife Refuge.

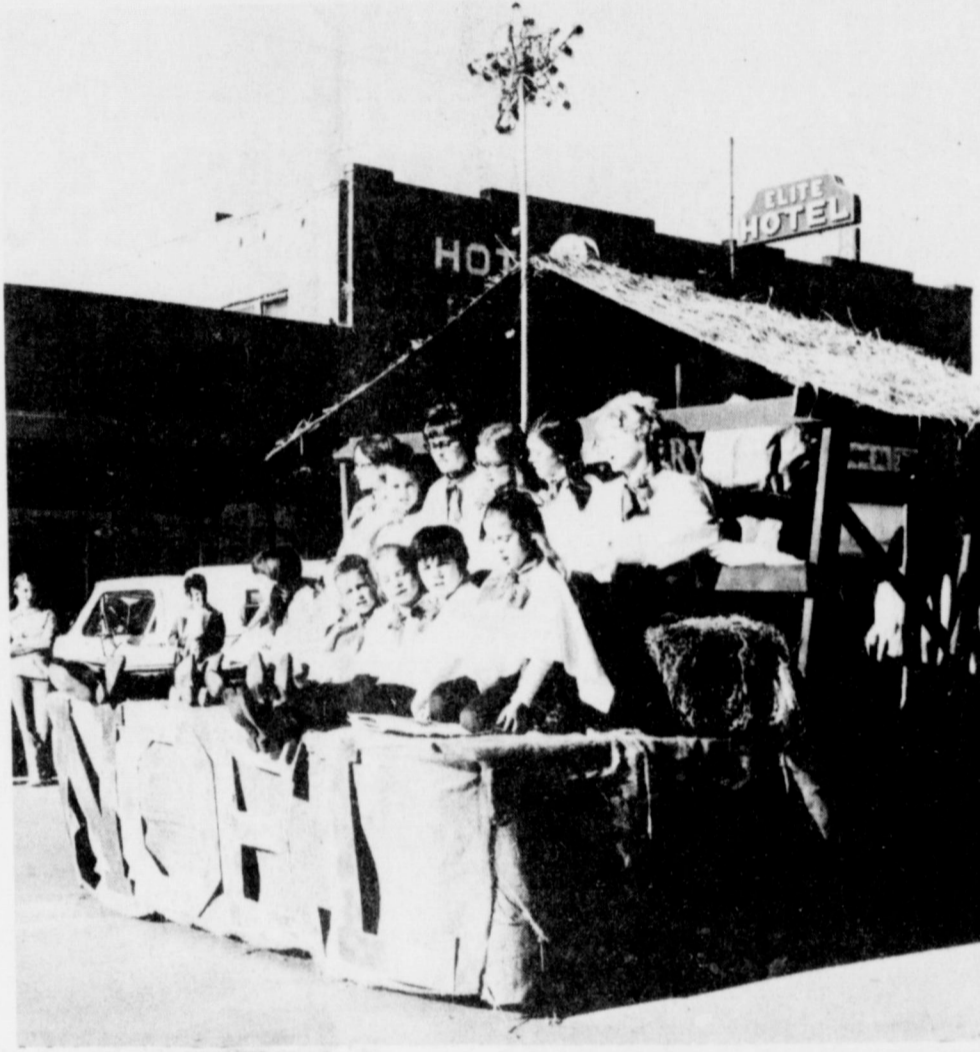
Santa Invites Visitors To His Workshop

1972 Permits Required On LPG Vehicles

A representative of Robert S. Calvet, Comptroller of Public Accounts, will be at the Valley Motel from December 23 through December 31 from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily, for the purpose of renewing Special Farm user permits, and issuing 1972 decals for LPG operated licensed vehicles. The current decals expire on December 31, 1971.

Renewal notices have been mailed to those who currently hold a 1971 decal, and these notices should be taken to the meeting place, and as before, it will be necessary to bring the vehicle. The decals will cost \$60.00 each, and must be placed on the vehicle by the representative.

All farmers and ranchers that have vehicles that are LPG operated should purchase their 1972 decals as soon as possible, preferably on one of the Cont. on page 6, col. 8

Jaycees Sponsor Local OYF Program

A program designed to bring about a better understanding of the problems and achievements of the farmers in Muleshoe area was announced recently by the Muleshoe Jaycees.

A survey of farmers between the ages of 21 and 35 will be climaxed with the naming of Muleshoe's Outstanding Young Farmer of 1971-72 during Jaycee Week, January 16-22, 1972.

This is the 15th year that the United States Jaycees have conducted the national OYF program. Co-sponsor of the U.S. Jaycee program is Chevrolet Motor Division of General Motors. Co-sponsor of the Muleshoe OYF program is Crow Chevrolet Company.

The Muleshoe Jaycees are sponsoring the Outstanding Young Farmer Project because it lends itself to honoring the achievements of young farmers and public attention needs to

be focused on the important role farmers play in everyday life of the community, said Dr. Jim Tucker, chairman of the OYF project.

Tucker said, "Public understanding of the farmer is vital today. The modern farmer is a far cry from yesterday's plowman. Farming today is a complex, exacting, huge business."

"Today's farmer not only produces foodstuffs and fibers needed by an expanding nation, but must keep his land alive, improve production and conserve his natural resources," he continued. "For the farmer cannot purchase more raw materials when his land gives out. He must use and reuse the same land. There is no longer a frontier to which he may move, leaving the worn-out and dead land behind. He must covet his land. In it lies not only his life and livelihood, but the very life of his nation and the world."

prices of farm implement and such supplies as fertilizers, seeds, livestock and poultry feeds, the complexities of distribution and marketing have compounded the farmer's problems", added Tucker.

"To cite a few figures; farmers have a inventory of \$12 billion in machinery-six times the 1940 total;

"Production from one acre out of six is exported; "Agriculture with \$214 billion assets, produces annual sales of over \$40 billion or \$5 of capital is required to produce \$1 of annual sales;

"And, the average return of a farmer's investment is about three per cent-one-half to one-third the return the successful manufacturer considers profitable."

The Jaycee spokesman concluded "And, there are the day-to-day problems- too much or too little rain, frost, a sick calf or an epidemic in an agrarian economy. And, in the course of feeding us and clothing us- and much of the free world as well agriculture contributed as much as the Gross National Product as the entire automobile industry."

"This is only a portion of the reasons the Muleshoe Jaycees place primary emphasis on the progress of young farmers in the area, but recognition is extended to the contribution of all agriculture to the life of the community."

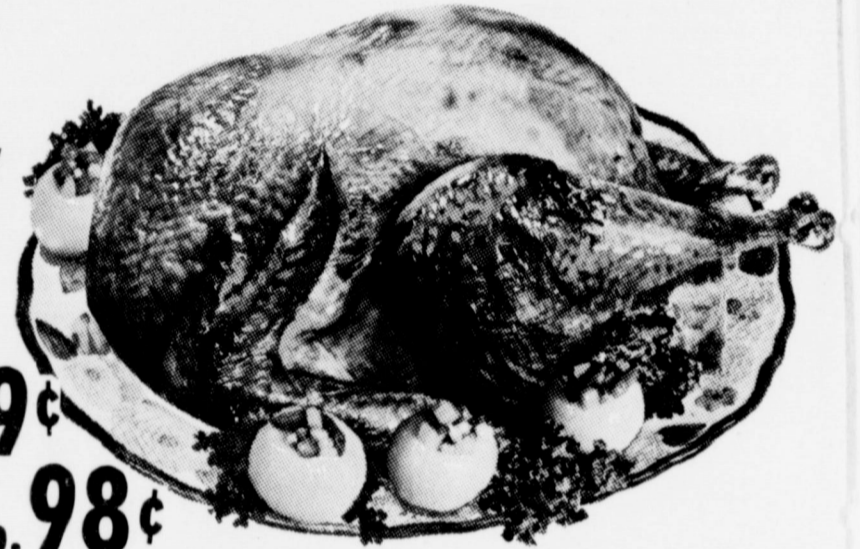

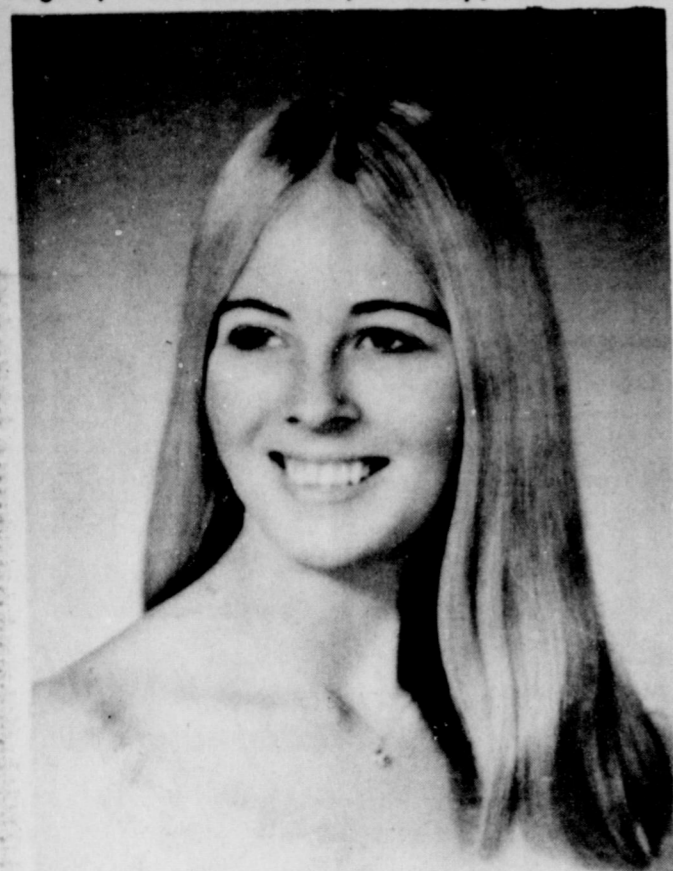

Did a left allemande and bent the line, gave a nod to the caller. We're doing just fine.

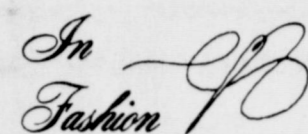
They sprang to the food, for the prize bought a ticket, and away they all flew like the sound of a cricket.

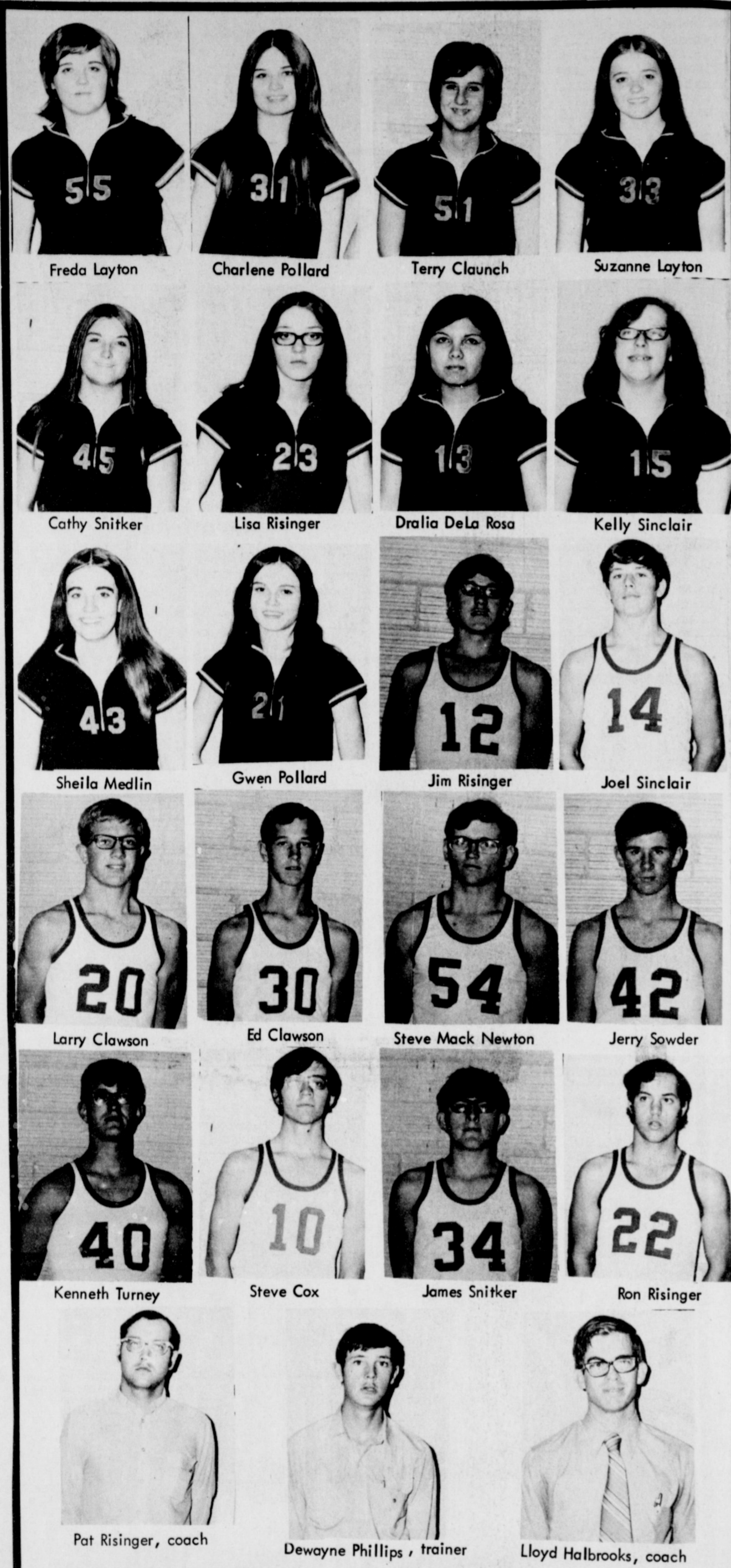

of 3.5 to 4.9, 11 per cent "miked" 3.3 and 3.4, 37 per cent 3.0 through 3.2, 31 per cent was 2.7 through 2.9 and 10 per cent was 2.6 and below.

The Consumer and Marketing Service of the U.S.D.A. reported increased trading in the new crop cotton. Average prices paid for the most predominant qualities in the 3.5 to 4.9 micronaire range were: Low Middling 30 - 28.70; Low Middling 31 - 28.90; Strict Low Middling Light Spotted 30 - 28.95; Strict Low Middling Light Spotted 31 - 29.10; Low Middling Light Spotted 30 - 28.55; and Low Middling Light Spotted 31 - 28.75.

Prices paid farmers for cottonseed ranged from \$44 to \$70 per ton with most prices in the \$48 to \$53 range.

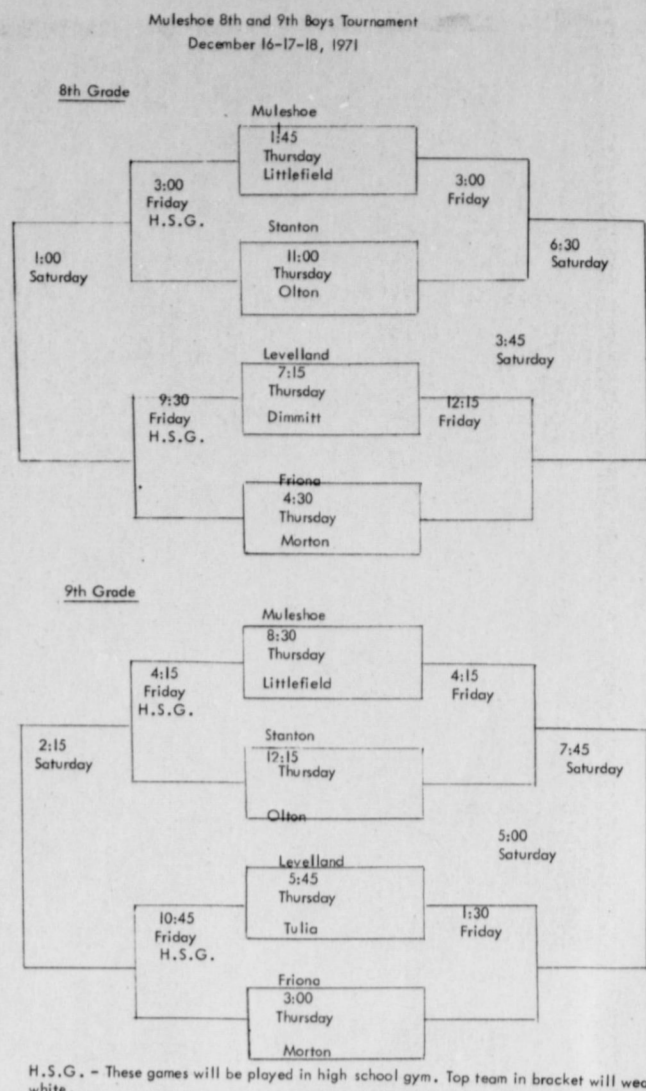
