An Ordinance

An ordinance to require railro companies, corporations and other where such railroad companies, corporations or persons shall operate a sometimes known as the Hall's Bluff road, within the corporate limits of the City of Crockett, Texas.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Crockett, Texas, that any and all railroad companies, corporations or persons engaged in operating or in control of any line of railroad extending across Public Avenue, sometimes known as the Hall's Bluff road, within the corporate limits of the City of Crockett, Texas, shall at each and all of such crossings where locomotive trains are run, provide and maintain a flagman to warn passers of the approach of trains and locomotives, or provide, main tain and properly operate safety gates or an electric bell of the design and mechanism suitable for the protection of persons riding, driving or on foot from trains and locomotives approaching said cross-

Section 2. Be it further ordained that any railroad company, corporation or person failing to provide and maintain the flagman, or provide, maintain and operate the safety gates or electric bell as required by the provisions of the foregoing section, shall be fined not less than ten nor more than fifty dollars for each day they fail to do so.
