Bit Scratches Sand at 3,100 Feet and Well is Now Reported Making Two Hundred Barrels Daily, Flowing by Heads

Possibly the most prominent feature in connection with the development of the Young county field during the last two weeks is the bringing in of the Panhandle-Scott No. 1. The bit entered the sand at 3,100 feet and the well is reported as making between 200 and 300 barrels, flowing by heads. The full production of this well, however, will not be known until pipe line connections are made and the hole drilled deeper.

This is a common sight in Poland today, eight and ten-year-old children mothering and fathering their baby brothers and sisters. This photograph, secured by an American Jewish Relief worker at Brest-Litovsk, shows an eight-year-old boy feeding his little brother from a bowl of hot soup just secured at a feeding station supported through American funds. The relief workers found 10,000 children, mostly war orphans, living in deserted dug-outs at Brest-Litoysk.
