NO PROOF OF DISCOVE

Preliminary Work On Dr. Cook's Records Does Not Convince Danes.

Copenhagen, Dec. 18.——The Associated Press is informed by highauthority that the committee of the University of Copenhagen in it's preliminary examination of his records, failed to discover proof that Dr. Cook had reached the North Pole.

Copenhagen, Dec. 18.—The consistory of the University of Copenhagen at a secret session today received the preliminary report covering the first stage of the work of the committee which is examining North Polar records of Dr. Cook. An excited discussion followed. The committee has not concluded its investigation.

The report was presented by Rector Torp, but its nature was carefully guarded. It was admitted that the work thus far accomplished provoked an animat ed debate.


