## SCOTTON TALKS

Officials of Plains Cotton Growers. Inc., Lubbock, in separ
ate communications August 13 addressed the US D. ment of Agriculture and the Cotton Board on pending deci
sions of importance to tigh Plains cotton producers. By letter PCG Executive Vice President Donald Johnso responded to a USDA request for comment on loans and tar
get price decisions get price decisions for the 1977 cotton program. And the o
ganization's President, W.B. Criswell of Idalou, presented the
PCC ganization's President, W.B. Criswell of Idalou, presented the
PCZ Board's position at a hearing in Dallas on the upcoming
eferendum to determine if producers want to referendum to determine if produccers want to traise upe emoung
of their investment in research and market development of their investment in research and market development
through Cotton Incorporated.
Johnson's letter, to the Director of Grins Johnson's letter, to the Director of Grains, Oilseeds and
Cotton Division of USDA's Agricultural Stabilization an Cotton Division of USDA's Agricultural Stabilization and
Conservation Service, recommended that the loan level on 1977 crop U.S. cotton be set "at the highest level permissible should be announced on or before November 1 of this yeear
and that a loan on field-stored seed cotton should continue to be made available.
In 1974, 1975 and 1976, USDA has announced a "pre,
liminary" loan price on November and left open the possibili
ty that the price might be lowered at some fore "A loan subject to change after the corep is planted,
Johnson contends, "is of little or no use to producers in the financial planning that must be done months before planting
time., The letter pointed out that the USDA has a certain degree
of atitude in its calculation of the eloan level under the law's stipulation that it not be above " 90 percent of the average
pire of American cotton in world markets" for the three pre. guage, PCG suggested that USDA use the actual thice at which U.S. exporters sold cotton in foreign markets during
