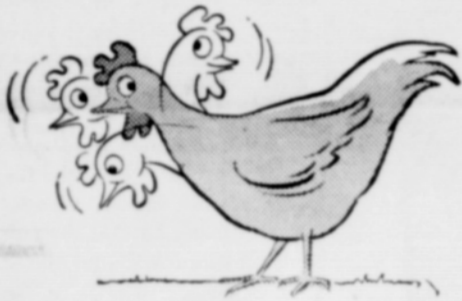

BLACK'S

RECIPE OF THE WEEK

By Mary Lee Taylor
Roast Chicken With Stuffing

Broadcast: November 21, 1953

- 3 Tablespoons finely cut onion
 - 3 Tablespoons hot fat
 - 4 cups bread cubes (2 days old)
 - 1 cup finely cut celery
 - 2 1/2 teaspoons salt
 - 1/4 teaspoon pepper
 - 1/4 teaspoon powdered sage
 - 1/4 cup Fat
 - 5-lb. roasting chicken
 - 2 Tablespoons soft fat
- Cook onion slowly in fat until tender. Remove from heat and add bread cubes, celery, 1 teaspoon salt, the pepper and sage. Then add milk and mix thoroughly. Sprinkle inside cavity of chicken with 1 1/2 teaspoons salt. Spoon bread mixture lightly into cavity of chicken. Sew cavity together or secure with tooth picks laced with string. Rub fat over outside of chicken. Place chicken on its side in shallow roasting pan. Do not cover. Bake on bottom rack in moderately slow oven (325) about 2 hours. At end of first hour turn chicken on other side and finish baking. Remove to warm platter. Makes 4 servings.
