It is the law of physics; the attraction of two bodies draws the smaller body to the larger, the latter being moved only in an inverse ratio to its size. It is the law of morals and politics as well, and so the squad of Cincinnati Greeleyites being brought by the sage and his flagella within the influence of the great pro-rebel Democratic party, lo! they rush into it with all the haste with which an atom is compelled to rush toward a mass, while the great party itself is not moved from its old resting place, just where it was in '60, '64, and '68. To return to the first illustration. What will the enlightened people of other States, among whom free schools are deemed as great a necessity as free churches—or free water—think of us if the advice of the *Herald* shall be followed? Among the hundreds who write to us, and to others here, who are endeavoring to induce the right class of immigration, there is scarcely one who does not desire to know the status of our schools. How we have answered the question the columns of this paper bear witness; how the *Herald* has answered it, its "NOTICE TO TAX-PAYERS" is a sample. Now that it is advocating the election of Horace Greeley, will its editor not obtain and furnish this people with the advice of its Presidential candidate upon the subject? We would like to read Horace Greeley's opinion of the newspaper advising the non-payment of a legitimized tax for school purposes, and a resort to revolutionary measures for the purpose of breaking down the school system. Let us hear from some of the "Reformers" upon this subject.

Recording to Tricks. Here is a nice little game that is played out. The New Orleans papers belonging to the Associated Press printed, on Sunday morning, a dispatch to the effect that the New York *Democrat* and the *Abend-Zeitung* had come out for Greeley. The truth was just the reverse. They had been Liberal organs, but have come out squarely for Grant and Wilson. This change is full of significance, and exceedingly cheering. It leaves Greeley utterly without an influential German organ in the State of New York, where that element holds, perhaps, the balance of power. How the news distressed the Liberals here may be judged from the manner in which the Greeley papers altered the telegram—a trick only resorted to by journals that are desperate and without hope. The New York *Democrat*, which has just come to hand, says the nomination of Greeley at Baltimore makes traitors to their faith of all Democrats who do not support him, and of all Republicans who do. It advises all Liberals to return with it to the regular ranks, and fight Copperheadism once more. Did the National Republicans not predict that this would be the effect of a formal nomination at Baltimore?—Nat. Republicans.

The idea of reclaiming the Colorado desert by means of artesian wells has been broached. It is thought that a large subterranean stream runs under the desert, and that all that is necessary is to bore deep enough to strike it. Congress will be applied to for a grant as a recompense for boring these wells.

In a letter to a friend in this city, Gerrit Smith, the veteran philanthropist, speaks of the present political situation as follows: "We are in a life and death struggle. The restoration of the Democratic party to power would be death to the negro and death to the nation.—Buffalo Commercial Advertiser.

The truth is that the Republican nominations are accepted and sustained throughout New England with unanimity scarcely paralleled in times of political excitement. The first State election takes place in Maine early in September, and the first interest naturally centers there. The State is quoted "doubtful" in the Greeley lists. Vermont and Massachusetts are not more certain to remain Republican than Maine is. New Hampshire and Connecticut are already quoted as surrendered. The most intelligent Republicans in those States assure us that they will hold their own, and that there is no sign of defection in either State sufficient to give them a moment's alarm. There is no Greeleyism in Rhode Island outside of the Democratic minority. As yet there is very little political animation in any of the States, except Maine, where active preparations for the State elections are going on. But the great body of thoughtful men who constitute the backbone of our uniform Republican majorities, and are about their own business, as usual, still watch the progress of events with interest, and will be found ready for action when the time comes.—Boston Advertiser.

LEAF TOBACCO WHOLESALE AND RETAIL BY H. GRENET. COPY OF ACT—TAIL DEALER IN LEAF TOBACCO. DETAIL dealers leaf tobacco are required to pay special tax of \$500, and if their annual sales exceed \$1000, they are made liable for an additional tax of fifty cents for every dollar in excess of \$1000 of their sales. The retail dealer in tobacco, as defined by the act of June 1872 is any person whose business it is to sell leaf tobacco in quantities less than an original hogshead, case or bale, or to sell to persons other than the following three classes of purchasers: 1. Dealers in leaf tobacco who have paid a special tax as such. 2. Manufacturers of tobacco, pipe, or cigars. 3. Persons who purchase original packages for export. The intent of any other special tax will not affect a person who sells leaf tobacco as hereinbefore stated, from the payment of the special tax as a retail dealer in leaf tobacco.
