Editor San Antonio Express:

Uncontrollable circumstances make it necessary that I spend a day or two in this burgh and I know no better way of passing my time than to drop you a line giving an account of the journey I have just made. June 10th I left Brackettsville the County seat of Kinney Co. for San Antonio. Arriving in the morning of the following day at the usually gently flowing and limpid Nueces, I now found it booming over its banks, muddy and filled with driftwood. Owing to the incessant rains it had in the last three weeks thrice risen and fallen: We were compelled to remain on the western shores and await the next falling of the waters. And they did fall soon—but not as we wished. About 2 o'clock P. M. of the 11th inst. a shower came on which lasted until nearly night. When the rain abated, we (myself and traveling companions, one of whom now dwells in a safe and comfortable house furnished him by the State, at Huntsville) after which labor, owing to the moisture of material—succeeded in making a large fire. After divesting ourselves of our soaking wet garments and hanging them around the fire to dry, we stretched out our weary bones to rest—the stary heavens our roof, the green sward our mattress, the mellow tune of the mosquito our lullaby—and were soon sweetly dreaming in the arms of Morpheus.

About midnight loud peals of thunder awoke me. The camp fire was still flickering brightly; in the south and west the sky was serene and ever star visible; in the north and west dark and heavy clouds covered the horizon; the lightning flashed and thunder rolled; out of this and the roaring of the Nueces, the whistle of the angry wind, the creaking of the great trees and the rustle of their foliage one could sometimes plainly distinguish the doleful notes of the "whip-poor-will."

It was one of those indelible scenes of nature which fill the astonished beholds with wandering admiration and awe we at the grandeur and power of the almighty creator. It soon began to rain. We put our clothes under dry shelter in a hollow tree, threw more wood on fire and then cheerily awaited the pleasure of the elements. In the morning of the 12th when the rain ceased we brought forth our clothes under which, together with the contents of a bottle we had brought with us for cases of snake-bite, we soon felt comfortable. Let this be a hint to vandants traveling in Texas. Whenever you are caught out in the rain without a change of cloths, take off those you have on you and secure them in a dry place. If no other way is convenient, wrap the cloths in your blanket which you hold carefully and place under your saddle.

A little shower-bath will not injure—especially when the weather is warm and the road dusty—and when the rain is axg you will have dry clothes which are a great deal better for health and comfort than wet ones.

As the last rain had not extended very far above, the river was fast falling, and when in the afternoon Mr. Cheyanakoko with his suit arrived and declared (from his extensive experience in and knowledge of this country) that the Nueces was fordable, we crossed. Passed through Uvalde same day. This, the headquarters of the western stockraisers, is quite a thriving little settlement. It is situated on the banks of the Leona about 35 miles from San Antonio.

I cannot but repeat here what I have heretofore written to the Express, namely that the country from here to the Rio Grande is the finest stock country in the world. The limitless prairies, which are all ways covered with the richest grasses, afford ample grazing for cattle and horses and in Maverick, Kinney and Dimmitt counties the herb covered hills and fertile valleys on the Rio Grande and on the creeks rushing into the same, afford the best facilities for sheep raising. The wool from this section brings as high a price in New York markets as any Texas wool. Mr. H. Greiner at Brackettsville, J. H. Taylor at San Felipe both in Kinney county and Judge Stone (Wm) at Eagle Pass, Maverick county are the leading stock raisers in this section and I think they would certainly be glad to give any information asked them concerning this business.

Hans Patrick will also answer with pleasure any letters addressed to him concerning this country. His address is Brackettsville, Kinney Co. Immigrants wishing to settle in the west as stockraisers or farmers would do well to visit us and look at our facilities before settling elsewhere. If they can find farms superior to those on the San Felipe, Mad Creek and Los Olmos, Hans

gives it up. It may be a little away from the intent of this letter, but perhaps not improper, while speaking of this Rio Grande country, to mention the coalmine of Messrs. Heintzel and Turpe in Maverick county. These energetic gentlemen having found a little surface coal, began to dig for a better quality and are now bringing forth a good bituminous coal, the same which Mr. Mauermann presented at you last fair. Let us hope that Messrs. Ed. Heintzel and Albert Turpe will receive such encouragement as is due them for their energy and perseverance in urging forward the products of our Texas soil. As you suggest in your paper, no better material for gas can be found than this coal. But let us proceed on our journey. From Uvalde to Dhannis is a good days journey. We cross on our road the Frio, Blanco, Sabinal and Seco.

The banks of these streams are dotted here and there with farms and cattle ranches—but there is plenty of place for more.

Dhannis is a flourishing settlement of Germans and Alsacians—good, honest, hard-working people who gain their livelihood mainly by tilling the soil. The only objection one might have to some of the inhabitants is their exceeding piety—which of course gives the priests—the modern scribes and pharisees—a good opportunity to prey upon the hard earned property of these innocent people. Yesterday I accidentally entered a grocery where I found the town priest surrounded by several persons. He was reading to his astonished audience a letter which he said was from his brother in the old country. It gives an account of the Virgin Mary, (Muttergottes) or an image of hers, I don't remember which, having appeared in several of the villages, and executed wondrous miracles. Oh! could I but open the eyes of these good people and expose this humbug.

Twelve and fifteen miles further, on the San Antonio mail route, on the banks of the Hondo are the promising towns of Quidi and New Fountain. Corn and other products are in fine condition here as every where else. Good crops infallible this year.

Twelve miles more and we reach the beautiful and romantically situated town of Castrovilla. To obtain a good view of the town and surrounding country one must climb the hill on the Eagle Pass road, west of the town. From here a scene most lovely and inspiring gratifies the eye. At your feet to the right lies the picturesque little town with its white houses and cottages surrounded by neat and tastily arranged gardens and hedgerows; its two church towers rise proudly yet modestly toward heaven informing the weary traveler in the distance that he approaches a plains and God fearing community. To the left we behold the beautiful, fertile and well cultivated valley through which the silvery Medina meanderingly winds its course. Now we see it gently flowing through grassy meadows until suddenly it disappears in a clump of green trees; we trace it up and find it again brightly sparkling in a field of yellow cereals or rushing madly through acres of green corn. Hadly in all his travels has never seen a lovelier and more glorious scene. To describe it is worthy of a better pen and feasting that I paint but a very bad picture. I leave the subject for a more skillful artist. Besides Mr. Vance's mill and the hospitable Monsieur Tarde's excellent hotel, Castrovilla affords a District Judge, a District Attorney, two lawyers, and last but not least a beer brewer—Mr. Kiefer—who makes most excellent beer. Until the Democratic Legislature tore down our free schools, Castrovilla was blessed with a most excellent one under the experienced teacher and accomplished lady Mrs. Howard. Responsible citizens of Castrovilla inform me that a better teacher more accomplished and better instructed than Mrs. H. cannot be found in the State. Owing to the reckless and unscrupulous action of our revolutionary Legislature this poor lady—on whom a family of her own depends for support—is thrown out of employment, and left penniless on the frontier. This of course is not the only case, but many more teachers who came here from the North to educate the youth of Texas are now left in an almost starving condition.

Twenty five miles more and we reach the "Queen of the Prairies" gay and festive old San Antonio de Bexar. Coming from the frontier one imagines on entering San Antonio, that he enters a large city. The bustle and noise, though light it may seem to a New Yorker or Ohioan, sounds terribly loud in the ears of one not accustomed to the city. It would be superfluous to spend time and space here concerning your city. Only one thing particularly I wish to mention. Twenty years ago when my

little bare feet pattered through the unpaved streets of San Antonio, "Railroad" was the topic of conversation; the railroad would be through to San Antonio in a short time. I find the same thing to-day, railroad talk is cheap; everybody speaks of the R. R. but none has yet been built.

I have no room for comment here, besides I might hurt the feelings of some of your old fogies. From San Antonio I traveled to Austin, but cannot give a detailed account of the trip as this will already take up too much space in your paper. Suffice it to say that owing to the horrible stretch left by the Confederate Legislature, which even drove away Gov. Davis, Col. DeGress and others, I could stand it only a day in that city. When I returned to San Antonio I found there the gentleman whose old hat, which was found in the river, had created such a stir. We read the article in the Express advising teetotalers (such as Hans) and drinkers of strong beverages (such as the above mentioned gentleman of the old hat notoriety) to compromise on lager beer.

We effected a compromise and are now delaying here at the house of the hospitable and amiable Joe Ney, to get rid of our Katzenjammer—(now don't you translate this.) Begging that you pardon the great length of this letter I promise to write when I return home, a shorter, more sensible and more to the point one, provided you do not condemn this to an ignominious death in your waste basket.

Escobedo on the Rio Grande.

Gen. Escobedo with the 4th Division of the Mexican army is now under marching order for the Rio Grande, and, latter reliable information has been received in San Antonio that he is recruiting the ranks of his division "as he comes marching on." A gentleman, who knows thereof he speaks, tells us that the 4th division of the Mexican army is veteran soldiers, armed with reed-loading fire-arms, including artillery. And it is but reasonable to suppose that the best general the Mexicans have would not be sent to any point of possible danger without the best troops having been selected to accompany him. Of course many rumors are afloat to the object of this apparently unwise expedition.

By some it is regarded as a hostile demonstration on the part of Mexico against the United States and it is predicted that our Government will be obliged in self defence to reinforce our troops on the Rio Grande, as there are not more than 500 troops in Texas at told.

Others, again, suppose that the Mexican Government is anxious to rid of the Kickapoo and other Indians and that Escobedo has been directed to assist the United States troops in removing them if so should be required.

This view of the situation can hardly be correct as a gentleman arrived from the vicinity of the Kickapoo assures us that their removal by force, or otherwise, is impossible, as the Indians have on the alarm and already dispersed among the mountains. It is daily necessary to remark that by removing the Indians it is absolutely necessary to find them.

The U. S. Government will not raise the number of troops the Rio Grande because of the anticipated arrival of the Mexican army and his troops. There is a real danger of any war between the United States and that country. Mexico does not desire war and cannot afford it.

The Mexican Government is convinced that our Government is in earnest in demanding that the delimitations from the other side of the Rio River cease. The only course to Mexico is to see to it that the thieves are kept in order on the other side of the river. This is no mission of Gen. Escobedo and will have his hands full in attending to his own countrymen, and will have neither time nor occasion to make demonstrations on a nation with which Mexico is on the best of terms.

CINCINNATI, July 1.—At Des Moines, Iowa, on Saturday, Nelson Yard shot and instantly killed Jackson Jones, who, he alleges, outraged his wife. Mrs. Yard also tried at Jones with a revolver. They are in jail.

DETROIT, July 1.—Barker's tobacco factory is burnt. Loss \$9,000.

ST. LOUIS, July 1.—Three cholera deaths reported yesterday, were traced to impure well water, impurities in diet, and disinfection.

COLUMBUS, July 8, 1873. I gather the following information concerning the railroad from reliable sources: The first contract of the Galveston, Harrisburg and San Antonio Railroad from Columbus, the present terminus, was let out last March to Fry & Co. contractors, to grade thirty miles of the extension to the neighborhood of High Hill. The grading is completed thirty miles, but no iron laid as yet, owing to the continued bad weather. There are about 1000 men at work and over 500 miles, and the contractors have good facilities for a rapid completion of the road. I am reliably informed that Mr. Pierce, of Boston, has contracted for the iron to build the extension of this road to San Antonio but owing to the strike in the furnaces in England the iron is delayed.

The American Bridge Company, of Chicago, has contracted to replace the present wooden bridge across the Colorado river at Columbus with a fine iron bridge like the present one across the Brazos at Richmond.

I am informed that the San Antonio people have made a proposition to Mr. Pierce to build and complete the road to San Antonio immediately. Mr. Pierce has until the first of August to give his answer. The Galveston, Harrisburg and San Antonio Railroad is generally regarded to be one of the most important roads that run into Galveston, from the fact that it will open up and control a large trade that has heretofore gone from San Antonio and that section to the Gulf of Mexico, and thence by Morgan's Line to New Orleans.—Correspondence Gal. News.
