Telegraphic.

NEW ORLEANS, May 21.—Hon.
Frank Morey asks by telegraph
from Washington, when is it esti-
mated present supply of food and
funds will be exhausted at the pre-
sent rate of distribution. Govern-
or Kellogg replies: Reher Com-
mittee for Louisiana receive from
Government 8,000 rations daily,
and distribute from 30,000 to 40,000.
Funds from private contributions
will be expended in fifteen days.
Every effort is being made, by send-
ing cotton seed, seed corn and rice to
the overworked districts to afford
relief in the shape of work, and dis-
courage idlers; but necessities for
help will last much longer than pre-
sent resources.

CHICAGO, May 21.—Tobey &
Booth's packing house, with a large
number of dressed hogs, over a mil-
lion pounds of bulk meats, several
thousand pounds of lard, and six
hundred live hogs, were burned last
night. Loss estimated at \$150,000;
insured.

ATLANTA, May 21.—The Confed-
erate Surgeons' Convention elected
Surgeon General P. Moore perman-
ent President, Dr. H. Campbell
Vice President at Large. The med-
ical officers of the late Confederate
States army and the naval medical
officers of the United States army
and navy who resigned to join the
Confederate service were made hon-
orary Vice Presidents. A commit-
tee of three was appointed to confer
with the Surgeon General of the
United States army relative to the
archives of the medical department
of the Confederacy.

The records of the medical direc-
tors of the army of Tennessee and
the Western army were tendered
the association.

Richmond was selected as the
next place of meeting, on the first
Wednesday in July, 1875.

After a harmonious session of two
days they adjourned sine die.

LOWELL, MASS., May 21.—Re-
mittances of \$2000 to New Orleans
and \$643 to the reservoir sufferers
have been made.

SYRACUSE, N. Y., May 21.—The
engine of the early train on the Sy-
racuse and Northern Railroad went
through the draw. The engineer
and conductor were killed. The ac-
cident was through the carelessness
of the engineer.

PARIS, May 21.—Specie increased
nine and a half million francs.

A duel between Comte Montebel-
lo and Prince Metternich was fought
to-day. The weapons used were
swords. The result is not known.

The Duke de Montpensier, son of
Louis Philippe, died to-day.

GENEVA, May 21.—The names of
the drowned students are Grant
and two brothers named Woodberry.

LONDON, May 21.—Bullion in-
creased three eighths of a million.

The-Czar departed homeward to-
day.

MADRID, May 21.—A fight took
place in the province of Tarragona
to-day, between a force of Republi-
cans and a body of Carlists, result-
ing in the defeat of the latter. The
insurgents had sixty killed and
many wounded. The casualties
to the Republicans were five killed
and ninety wounded.

A body of Carlists in Catalonia,
numbering two hundred men, have
been defeated by the National
troops. Their loss was twenty-one
killed and fourteen prisoners.

WASHINGTON, May 21.—In the
Senate, Senator Tipton has given
notice of his intention to move an
amendment to the deficiency bill,
to appropriate \$25,000 for the sub-
sistence, etc., of the Kickapoo In-
dians, lately removed from the bor-
ders of Texas and Mexico to the In-
dian Territory.

The bill to enable New Mexico be-
come a State was carried through
the house to-day. It will meet with
much more opposition in the Senate,
and will not be acted upon until the
next session.

The New Orleans Towboat mono-
polists have been so successful as
to secure favorable reports from the
committees of both Houses on the
Eads' jettty plan of improving the
mouth of the Mississippi, although
Eads' bills is not likely to pass this
session. It defeats the appropria-
tion for the canal until next winter.

LITTLE ROCK, May 21.—Business
fully resumed all day. To preserve
strict order, a portion of the infan-
try and cavalry of Baxter's com-
mand have been sworn in as special
police, who patrol the city night and
day.

The Governor to-day appointed

Colonel J. N. Smitther Commissioner
of Public Lands *ad interim* appoint-
ments.

All military offices have been re-
moved to the Capitol, and the earth-
works in the yard are being leveled.

Gen. Newton tendered his resigna-
tion to the Governor last night, and
his staff resigned to-night. It is
thought by some that Newton's
course will divide the Governor's
friends, but that is hardly probable.

The commission appointed to ex-
amine the accounts of the State
Treasurer and Sheriff reports the
accounts of both officers correct,
and balances sufficient to cover all
minor deficiencies.

Baxter continues to receive con-
gratulatory letters from all parts of
the State.

Matlock, the negro who murder-
ed an entire family near here several
months since, will be hung on the
26th.

WASHINGTON, May 21.—Jerg-
ensen has been confirmed postmaster
at Petersburg.

In the Senate, a joint resolution
of the Pennsylvania Legislature
was presented against the with-
drawal of the Pacific Mail Steamship sub-
sidy.

The post office appropriation bill
passed the House. It allows the
agricultural reports to pass through
the mail free.

The pension appropriation bill
passed.

The bill admitting New Mexico as
a State passed by a vote of 160 to 54.
