The Financial Condition of the State-Coke's Exhibit One Million Dollars Added to the State Bebt-The Morgan Combination.

AUSTIN, Sept. 18, 1874.

Governor Coke, through his Private Secretary, has furnished the News and other Democratic papers with a financial statement. The Democratic Statesman cop-

The following facts and figures will number, but asserts that they are there Periam, Agricultural Editor of the West-The Farmers' Loan and trust Company do not hold any of the bonds. No bonds have been sold by Williams & Guien, nor by Chas Morgan purchased the first lot of five hundred bonds, equal to \$500,000, at eighty-five cents, August 8, 1874, issued under act of the Fourteenth Legislature. street, purchased one hundred and fitty bonds, equal to \$150,000, at eighty-five cents, August 19, 1874. Jas. B. Colgate & Co., September 3, 1874, purchased fifty bonds, equal to \$50,000, at eighty five ets. Jas. B. Colgare & Co., also, September 11. purchased three hundred bonds. equal to \$200,000, at eighty-five cents The above are all of the new issue, and make

the \$1,000,000. Mr. Nicolay, of New York, August 29, 1874, purchased fifty old (frontier defense) equal to \$50,000, at eighty seven and three-quarters cents flat, which is the same as eighty-five cents. Moses Taylor, of New York, September 5, 1874, purchased seventy-five old (frontier defense) bonds. equal to \$125,000, at eighty-five cents. There are 775 bonds yet to be sold, equal to \$775,000. There are \$900,000 of the old bonds in New York, a portion of which was hypothecated with Williams & Gnion, and the balance is in the bands of W. L. Moody, Esq., financial agent of the State. Four hundred of these are frontier defense ands, issued under set of August 5, 1870. and 500 revenue, deficiency bonds issued under act of December 2, 1871. The 400 were hypothecated and the 500 deposited with the Farmers' Loan and Trust Com-

The total State debt January 1, 1874. was \$2,384,336.33, which included the \$450,000 bonds hypothecated with Willlams & Gnion. To this amount add \$1,000,000 sold of the new issue which makes the sum total of \$3,384,336 33.

remination of Brownsville's favorite, Hon. gan and Nicolay was paid to Messrs. Wiliams & Guion, reducing the amount in their hands to \$275,000. Considering this last amount as debt, and taking the amount paid, \$125,000, from the total of \$2,384,333 .-63 leaves \$2,259,336.63.

Now, after adding the one million bonds sold to the debt-the amount realized from them should be subtracted, as it is supposed it will be used to cancel some of this outstanding debt,-the result would be, \$2,409,336.63. But that this is correct is altogether problematical. We are treated to this bald statement, and left in total ignorance of the real financial condition of the State. Why do school warrants only command fifty cents on the dollar? What has become of the funds belonging to the schools ?

This Democratic admidistration will leave the State burdened with double the debt incurred during Gov. Davis' administration. The people will have to pay equally as heavy taxation, and they will get less for their money. The figure at which these valuable securities of our State were sold was a great sacrifice. Gov. Davis repeatedly refused offers of 85 cents for the State bonds, made by the same men who have bought of Coke.


