We are the more ur-gent in regard to this matter from the fact that our Fair is rapidly spproaching, and at that time and on that occasion, if ever, we should organize the association necessary to carry out the important obtest had in view.

Unless there should be some failure in the programme, preparations or management, the Centennial will be, by far, the grandest worlds exposition of the arts and industries of all nations that has ever occurred. The buildings are larger and better arranged than any previous exposition has had. The occasion of the assemblage is more interesting, attractive and popular than any previous one. Over forty nations are already preparing to be fully represented on that grand occasion Millions of people, from every State in the Union, and from every nation under heaven will be there with the products of their soils, their mines, their labor and their skill. Texas will be fully represented, and Western Texas should see to it that she fills her full share of the Texas representation.

Among the cities of Texas, Houston is especially active and sagacious in her arrangements for the Centennial. She has organized what she calls a Texas Auxiliary Association, for this purpose. At a meeting of this association last Monday, the plan was adopted of creating a co-operative committee in the principal counties of the State, which is to collect specimens of the productions of their respeetive sections, and hold them subject to the order of the parent association at Housten.

San Anionic should form an association of her own, or else adopt the humbler method of acting as an auxiliary to a central passociation at Houston. Even that would be far better than do-

ing nothing at all. It would seem, however, that a central association In San Antonio could represent all Western Texas, by acting through counties, and thus exhibit the productions of this section more effectively, all by themselves. We should be satisfied with either plan. however. The Houston Association wishes the committee in each county to collect the fellowing things :

1. The different varieties of soil common to their respective localities; its average depth and adaptability for prostion, with kind, quantity and quality of production, and such other information germain to the same as may be deemed mportant.

2. Specimens of every variety of valuable timber growing in their respective counties, and to include especially the best specimens of all kinds of oak, pine, cypress, walnut, bols d'are, asb, mesquite, magnolia, elm, gum, cottonwood, hickory, pecan, linn, sycamore, chesnut and other valuable timber.

3. Specimens of all kinds of eres and minerals, such as gold, iron, lead, silver, copper, coals and deposits of rock salt. bods of gypsum, also all kinds of valuable stones, and marble, grantis, etc., etc., clays and carries fessils and petrifications. 4. Specimens of field productions, to

include corn, wheat, rye, oats, barley, peas, beans, cotton, angar, rise, polatoer 5: Specimens of native grasses, showing those which are best adapted for grazing and those which are best for making hay ; also, such other native and foreign grasses

and forage plants as have been developed by cultivation, with the betanical names of same when they can be ascertained. 6. Collections showing the fauna and flora of Texas; also, collections of insects, whether advantageous or prejudical to

agriculture. 7. Specimens of manufactured articles, sepecially such as are made of native material; also, works of art and practical and scientific invention. .
