## Telegraphic Gleanings.

TURKISH AFFAIRS:

Constantinople, Sept. 5.—Zerver ascha, in a telegraphic dispatch, dated Mostar to day, states that many insurgents had submitted and agitation greatly allayed. Imperial troops have been traversing all parts of the country for several days without meeting with any re-visiones. He believes order will be restored before foreign consuls begin the work of mediation.

Belgrade, Sept. 6,—Servian min-ister of toreign affairs has officially notified the Turkish government and the powers that Servia has taken the necessary measures to prevent armed bands from going n aid of the Herzegovinian insur rents.

Belgrade, Sept. 5 .- An insurrectionary movement is reported in the neighborhood of Gradatschatz, Bosnia, instigated by bands of Servians. It is asserted the whole districts on the south eastern frontier of Bosnia are rising.

Lendon, Sept. 6.—A special dispatch in the Morning Standard says the British Consal has arrived at Mostar. He witnessed the horrible cruelties perpetrated by the risurgents, who, in one instance, reasted children alive. The insurrection is put down; only raids by the Servians and Montenegrians take place, and these are exagerated ten told. A telegram to the Buily News states that Servia Pascha has been

authorized to propose a limited A dispatch from Constantinople states that information has been eccived from Belgrade by Turkish Government and by the loreign embassies, which removes all apprehension that Servis will by her conduct add to the compliations of the Hersegovinian question A solid agreement between the Powers and the Servian Gov-ornment has been effected at Belgrade. Owing to the pressure brought to bear by the representa-tives of the former, Servin undertakes to restrain the party of action within her borders.

London, Sept. 6 .- A special dispatch to the Times, from Berlin, mys Russia is convinced that the Khokan rebellion was fomented by Yakoob Khan. An agent of Yakoob's arrived at Odeses, but as he left before the recent events in Khokan, his arrival will hardly ures by Russia.


