Property Rights. The very great disregard shown for property rights, when those rights are the result of nature's free gifts, by persons of high as well as low degree, calls for special notice, not only by the administrators of the law, and ethical teachers, but writers for the press, that great moral lever, with which the world has already been lifted from the darkness of the "middle ages" to a height, which even to us, in those days of "light, by express and telegraph, seems indeed wonderful. The "banker" steps from amidst his vaults and safes, gleaning under the "weight of the accumulated gold, into his aerobulance drawn by his "spanking pair of grays," or his "one-horse chaise" harnessed to his shining "bay steed," and with a "two-dorty" gait winds his way to some favorite spot, the property of another, where he degrades, with gun or rod in hand, to enjoy the sport he will in keep the profit of a cruise for, and the taking "upon the wing" of the wild game, that the owner of the premises delights to see run o'er the prairie as their pleasure, or is suffering to run as will until such time as in his own pleasure he shall desire to appropriate them to his own use; or he sits quietly down to "introduce treacherous bait," the fish that sport beneath the waves, also the property of the owner of the soil, with its attendant fountains and streams.

Or it may be, he steps with bucket in hand, to the fruit bearing tree or shrub, and plucks therefrom the native fruit, heeding not that the act is no such a theft, as that by which the shining gold is extracted by the midnight burglar from the groaning safe or vault.

In the lumber walks of life, the same disregard is shown, and the quail and rabbit, plover and deer, the grape and plum, berries and fruits, of whatever kind or nature, the free gift of nature, unaided by cultivation, are alike considered by them common property. Suppose, while the banker is pursuing his hunting or fishing operations, the owner of the soil should happen along, and find the vacated vehicle and team, upon his premises, and should remove them to his home, with the view of appropriating them to his own use, what a flood of indignation would be heaped upon him, to say nothing of the strong arm of the law which would be brought down with tremendous force upon his head.

But, which think you would be the more guilty? The one has taken what he found upon his own premises, while the other goes upon the premises of another, to find there what does not belong to him. Let these things be pondered well by the high and the low, the rich and the poor, and let them understand, that while many of nature's gifts, such as air, light, heat, &c., are free to all, in the present organized state of society, where vested rights of property are recognized, the law and ethics are equally binding to protect the free gifts of nature, with the works of man's own hand or the labor of his brain.

The immediate inspiration of this essay was the finding two youths, belonging to the F. F. S. A., helping themselves, (without so much as saying "by your leave,") to the wild plums from trees growing within an enclosure, which were looking upon, when fully ripened, as something out of which to make some nice jellies and preserves, and when asked why they had thus trespassed, stated that they had a few days previous, while on a fishing excursion on the premises, (thus adding trespass to trespass,) discovered them, and supposed the time for picking would be that selected.

"And as of old, the eating our grapes by the fathers put the children's teeth on edge," so the examples set by the elder heads led the younger ones, and therefore this appeal to them to take heed to their ways, lest they corrupt the young until they stop not at such trespass. As history records the fact that the simple robbing of birds nests proved to be the starting point in the downward course of a noble house."

Mr. Albert Diaz, a Spaniard, and the well-known cigar and tobacco dealer on the corner of Main and Alamo streets, took it into his head to do some ugly thing yesterday evening. Mr. Diaz has, for some time past, been possessed of a desire to marry the fair daughter of Mr. Frank Umscheid, an old German citizen, who is the owner of the block where the cigar store is situated, and who, by the way, is blind. The match was highly objectionable to the family, who, one and all, except the young lady, worked against it.

Mr. Diaz did not seem to grow happy at such opposition, but, on the contrary, he became very angry, and much annoyed. Yesterday he closed his shop for the entire day, excluding himself and drinking some, but at no time appeared to be unreasonably drunk.

That evening about half past 6 o'clock, Mrs. Umscheid and her son Albert being out in the yard, Mr. Diaz appeared, and opened a conversation with the old lady. Very shortly after, the son, thinking the matter under discussion was none of his business, arose to go, when he saw Mr. Diaz draw a pistol.

Albert started to run up stairs as fast as his legs would carry him, thinking that it was the intention of Mr. Diaz to kill him for using his influence against the marriage. However, just as he reached the foot of the steps, a shot was fired, the ball striking the wall very near Albert Umscheid's head.

The family express a great fear of the man, whom they regard as very dangerous.

The excitement before Recorder Anderson this morning, on the charge of violating the city ordinance against carrying fire arms, but young Umscheid was so exceedingly positive and severe in his evidence that the Hon. Recorder a warrant made out for assault with intent to kill, and the immediate arrest of the offender. The bond was fixed at \$1000.

Albert Umscheid tells us that Diaz told his sister, who told him of the fact, that if he could not get her, he would kill her, and then himself.

The matter will be settled at the next term of the District Court.

scoble matters... which, gaining strength by age, sweep ultimately, in a legitimate of wrath, over the entire expanse of the State. You, gentlemen on the watch-tower, waking up one by one, from your dreamy slumbers, discern that the country was on the verge of one of the greatest events of the century, and that the State whose honor you should guard, and whose interests you should protect, was drifting, in a current of apathy, steadily, but surely, towards the deep dead sea of disunion and ruin, against the beneficent of its opportunities and duties. Uniformed as to the merits of the situation, you have turned your batteries on the United States Centennial Commissioners. Take the advice of a friend and a brother quill-driver: wheel your carriages, point your guns and blast away at the Governor of our State and the members of the Fourteenth Legislature!

If you want representatives of the Centennial Exhibition, call on Gov. Coke to appoint a Board of State Centennial Managers, consisting of as many members as you please, and if you cannot get them to work without compensation, then call on the Legislature to make a suitable appropriation to pay their expenses. No man relies more fully than I on the power of the press—except possibly our astute Governor—who seemed to have known to a nicety when to break off correspondence with the United States Centennial Commissioners from Texas. That correspondence will be resumed, gentlemen of the press, when you so order. The State Board will be constituted too, if you demand it; and under your lead the Lone Star will shine brightest in the diadem of States next year at the grand gathering of the Nation.

Pending action on the part of the Governor and Legislature, it would be well for the people to organize a Centennial Association, similar to those recently formed at Houston and Galveston; for the collection of exhibits; the classification of an arrangement of the Director's request; the exhibition for their shipment directly to Philadelphia. Besides fulfilling, to the extent of my ability, my official duties at headquarters, I have written rooms of letters and distributed thousands of documents, at my own expense, throughout my State. I have endeavored, with all of the resources at my command, to inspire an interest among my people in this great work; for setting together aside the question of patriotism, and the amicable relations between the sections which that great national festival is calculated to foster, I have felt that Texas has never had, and may never have again, so grand an opportunity to advertise the world her diverse attractions and unbounded resources.

I have received scores of letters from my State, saying "the people are apathetic," "we are not informed," "how to proceed and what is expected of us;" "what about the State Board of Managers;" "the Legislature will not vote an appropriation;" "I suppose we ought to do something;" nearly every letter concluding, in substance, as follows: "You will please send down and make a few speeches and tell the people what to do and how to do it, you will arouse an enthusiasm among them and get all you want." Well, gentlemen of the Texas press, you must admit that, take it all in all, I have had a rather hard time. My primitive views of the dignity, glory and emoluments of office are sadly changed. The rosy tints are all gone—faded away into midnight darkness. To labor for Uncle Sam, and pay my own way, to conduct a voluminous correspondence with my people, if my own best seems not all that is expected of me, but I shall make a pedestrian tour of the thousand miles or more, and return to teach my people their opportunities and their duties. To this conclusion I am forced to come, for nothing in all of those piles of letters indicated the idea of a present of a R. R. ticket or a square meal.

Open your batteries, Editors, and the Governor will see that Texas claims, and must enjoy, her full share of the benefits and honors of that great occasion. A rattle of musketry, Editors! and down falls the miserable crumblers who predict non-participation of Texas in the Exhibition because, forsooth, there happens to be one out of the ninety-six United States Centennial Commissioners offensive to them. Up with the flag, at your Masthead, Editors! and with the pen, for mightier than the sword, carve out for Texas—our Texas—a road to fame and fortune in that grand arena of 1876, where the nations gather and strive for victory. I shall anticipate, gentlemen of the press, on seeing you all at the International Exhibition next year, and serve you by my best efforts to the point of your pens, for the ensuing six months, hangs the well-wish and the honor of Texas.
