As I have just recovered from the effects of being tossed by the sea, in the late terrible storm, for about forty-eight hours, and thinking that you might want to get an accurate account of the number of lives and the amount of property lost in the late storm at Baytown, although weak yet, I will endeavor to give you a true account, as I am one of the three sayed out of

twelve persons.

I resided at Baytown, where I had just finished a new residence, at a cost of \$1200, situated about half a mile from my store, on the highest point of land, which was about nine foot above the level of the San Jacinto river, and about twenty feet from the bank of the the San Jacinto river, and about twenty feet from the bank of the main channel. My wife's little daughter and mother, Mrs. McKie and son, and Mr. McKie, resided with us. Wednesday night, when I retired, the river did not appear to be any higher than ordinary tide.

The Largest Daily Circulation tide. Thursday morning, about 3 o'clock, 1 was awakened by the rushing of water, when I got up and looked out of the window, I saw that I was surrounded by double the circulation of any paper in the West. The Express, therefore, in the water. At daylight the water had risen about a foot higher. I looked for my skift boat, but it had broken loose and drifted away. My other skiff I had lent to Mrs. Pierce, which she had in use at Hog Island. so that I was hemmed in by water, in this region of the State. The proprietors are well known as editors and frinters of long ex-perience and mature judgment, and they intend as the land on the road was so much lewer.

TO GET TO THE HIGH LAND I would have to swim for about a half mile against the waves, so that it was impossible to do it and carry my family.
About 2 o'clock P. M. Mrs. Peirce,

with her four children, and Charles Posh, her hired men, came to my house in my skiff-boat. They came in the back way, and stated that they were very near not getting there. They were all wet, and the boat was about half full of water. When they left Hog Island the water was up to the floor of their house, which was on posts about four feet from the ground. four feet from the ground they arrived at my place there was about three feet of water, but the wind had increased since morning, and made a very heavy sea. In a and made a very heavy sea. In a few minutes after Mr. McKie came from my store in his skiff-boat, and stated that he was nearly swamped two or three times on his way to the house. He said when he left the store there was about two feet of water in it, and that he piled everything he could litt ou to the counters, off the floor. About nine colored in the said water had rise or the counters of the floor. o'clock P. M. the water had risen to the floor and the heavy seas washing against it made it rock like a ship at sea in a storm. I looked for something to cut holes in the floor, but could find nothing, so that I had to open the hall doors, which were east and west, so that the water would come in and the weight would help to keep house on the underpinning.

I got them to the window, where Mr. Mckle and Post helped them into the boats, while I got the rest, and saved them all from drowning in the house.

After getting all into the beats, seven in the largest skiff, with Mr. McKie and two children in the amall skiff with Charles Post, I got on the window-sill and held the beats up from swamping till day-light.
