

Where the Sun Jumps a Day.

It is a good place for peo. ple who bave lost much time, for by taking an early start they can always get a day ahead on Chatam Island. It took philosophers and geograhers a long time to settle the puzzle of where Sunday noon ceased and where Monday began, with a man traveling west fifteen degrees an hour, or with the sun It is hoped that the next English Artic expedition will settle the other mooted question-"Where will one stop who travels north west continually?

The Dangerous and Terrible Quail.

[Ficm a Specch by Senator Harris, in the Senate of Indiana.]

Each pair of quaits produce an average of ten chicks per yearmany, in favorable seasons, hatch out sixteen in a brood, and then hatch out a second brood. If we estimate only the small number of 500,000 quails in Indiana to start with (though there are probably ten times that number), and take ten per year as the produce of each pair, the figures will simply be stupendous, and we present them to the Iudiana Legislature for consideration:

Pirst year, total 3,000,000 Becourt year, total 18,000,000 Third year, total 108,000,000 Fourth year, total 648,000,000 Fifth year, total 38,888, 000, 000 We would have to station an

army along the Ohio River to prevent the invasion of Kentucky, after these birds had eaten everything visible in Indiana. There wouldn't be a big left in that State, and the birds would require grain to live upon. Estimating a gill of grain-per day for each bird it would require about 15.000,000 bashels per day to feed them. We enter on protest in advance, and shall de mand, if Indiana does not pass the law, that the State shall raise the grain to feed the birds, and shall put up a bird net 300 feet high along the Ohio, to keep the inhabitants from invading Kentucky. The bill was defeated.

It is to be deplored that our young people are rejudant to mairy because they cannot at once set, up expensive or stylish housekeeping. Late marriages are becoming so jargely characteristic of social life on these false and selfish grounds of social economy, that society as a whole, and religious life in par ticular, are seriously damaged. It a man has gained a position that enables him to marry with ordinary prodence, let him marry, and let not prudence be pressed too hard: roung love, if true and godly, will make early struggle wholeseme and joyous. It he has found a woman who will make him happy, let him take her to a modest home, the loving wife of his youth. His life and his fortunes will be better for

The Russian army is at Kisheneff and ready to move against the Turks It numbers 120,000 infants ry, 8000 cavalry and 418 guns. Two corps of the army at Odessa would make a total of the advance of 180,000 infantry, 12,000 cavalry and 720 guns. Thousands of horses have been bought for the trains. The bridge lying here is capable of passing the whole army over the Danube in one day. There are also thirteen enormous steam launches, two large barges, seven smaller boats and masses of other things, even to the smallest detail. Mobilization has proceeded to great satisfaction, and within a month four army corps could have crossed the Prath.
