A small spot of opacity first appears nearly in the centre of the cornea in many cases, and from this point the white olnud gradually spreads until the entire surface of the cornea is covered, and the sheep become totally blind. Opacity of the cornea is frequently associated with inflammation of the membrance of the eyelid, and a purulent discharge issues from the eyes, often causing them to adhere together: this affection is however, quite distinct from the one above described-it is, in fact, ordinary ophthalmia, and its spreading among the flock leads to a suspicion of infection; there is no doubt that the discharge from the eyes in ophthalmia of the human degree. and it is not unlikely that the same characteristic may belong to the disease in the sheep; but in the case of simple opacity of cornea, unac-companied with discharge; there is no Iground for referring the spread. ing of the disease by infection. In the way of treatment much may be done; for the way of prevention very little, in the absence of any definite ideas on the subject of causes. As soon as the disease is detected, the medicine, two to four ounces of salts in half a pint of water; the sheep should have a dose of cooling eyes should be dressed with some styptic solution, as sulphate of zinc, five grains to an ounce of water; or lunar caustic, two grains to the ounce of water. Either solution may be applied daily for a few days, by means of a camel's hair pencil. It will be well to protect the diseased animals, so far as possible, from the strong light, by keeping them under cover until the disease


