Rocently the Bishop of Nevers, in France addressed to the President of the Republic a letter on the position of the Pope with regard to the Italian government; with regard to the Italian government; but inasmuch as a cat may look at a king a bishop may certainly write to a President, and this fact alone might have caused no great scandal, even in France, where there is an abnormal sensibility as to the doings of coclesiastics. But the Bishop did more. He addressed to all the mayors in his diocese a remarkable communication, partly in the nature of a letter of instruction, and the instructive element might instity be regarded as domiter of instruction, and the instructive clement might justly be regarded as dominating the other, since they were not ignorant of what was given as information. He addressed these functionaries as 'depositaries of part of the Executive power," whe were, therefore, cone raed in the establishment of right relations between the Pope and the people. He then called their attention to the Pope's 'imprisonment' in the Vatican; argued that no Catholic was free in his conscience while the head of the Church was restrained, and urged that all should use their influence to change these un pleasant facts. This is but one of many facts which seem to form a part of a regular propagands for disturbing the relations of France with Italy.
