Clyde Vinson Out for District Judge

Clyde Vinson, an attorney of San Angelo, has announced his candidacy for District Judge of the 51st Judicial District, composed of Coke, Sterling, Irion, Schleicher and Tom Green Counties. Judge John F. Sutton, of San Angelo, incumbent, has not yet announced his intentions.

Vinson has resided in San Angelo since July, 1925, where he located for the practice of law immediately after his graduation from the University of Texas with the degree of Bachelor of Laws. He is also a graduate of the University of Arkansas, Class of 1920, with the degree of Bachelor of Arts.

Vinson's law practice has been general and varied. He is licensed in the State and Federal Courts, and has been successful in office, trial and appellate work.

Vinson is married, and he has one daughter, now the wife of J. S. Miller, who is ranching in Schleicher County, Texas. His niece, Ivodell Vinson, makes her home with him, and she is now a senior in San Angelo College. Vinson has his religious affiliation with the Congregationalist Church, Mrs. Vinson and Mrs. Miller with the Presbyterian Church, and Ivodell with the Baptist Church. Mr. Vinson has been a member of the Mens Bible Class of San Angelo since this class was founded in 1927.

In 1917-18, Mr. Vinson served with the U.S. Marines, as private, joining as a volunteer in May 1917. That fall he transferred to the U. S. Army Air Corps where he was commissioned a pilot with the rank of Second Lieutenant. He was honorably discharged January 5, 1919. He worked his way through the University of Arkansas and the University of Texas. He came to San Angelo in 1925 at the invitation of Ricker and Dodson, for whom he worked for two years.

Mr. Vinson has been an active member of the American Legion

for thirty years, and his membership in the 40 & 8, attests his interests in Legion activities. He served as commander of James J. Goodfellow, Jr., Post No. 32, San Angelo in 1937, and in 1944 was Chef de Guerre of the local 40 & 8. During World War II, he served with Selective Service Board No. 1 of San Angelo from its organization in 1940 until September 1945, the last four years as chairman of the board, and a framed document on the wall of his office now, signed by Franklin D. Roosevelt, recites an appreciation of "uncompensated patriotic service to his country". He served as Tom Green County Democratic Chairman from 1928 to 1934, an uncompensated position.

Mr. Vinson has indicated he intends to make an active campaign, and will endeavor to see all the voters in the district before the July primary.

Stocking Cents!

NYLON, rayon, or silk—your stockings cost money. Besides that, they are much in the public eye; as your stockings appear, so your laundry habits are judged!

Now is the time to check your stockings: Colors faded? A run here, a run there? Unsightly snags? These are stocking tragedies (and personality indications!) you'll be interested in preventing... and the time to start is at the moment of purchase. Even before wearing, give those brand new stockings a good sudsing. You'll need only the fragrant bluing that comes in bead form and is detergent-based. The United States Department of Agriculture clothing specialists say that sudsing before wearing insures a closer, neater fit the first time the stockings are worn. In addition, this first sudsing removes the finish applied during manufacture and helps stockings wear longer.

For complete color protection, make this bluing wash a routine step after every wearing. Put about a quarter cup of bead bluing in a washbowl of warm water. Squeeze the sky-blue suds through and through the stockings... rinse twice and hang by the toes to dry. You can help prevent many snags and runs by removing your rings, and filing rough nails before laundering.

You'll be delighted with color-saving results when you use just these blue beads in the daily rinsing of other underwear... yes, you can solve many another laundry problem with this dramatic method
