

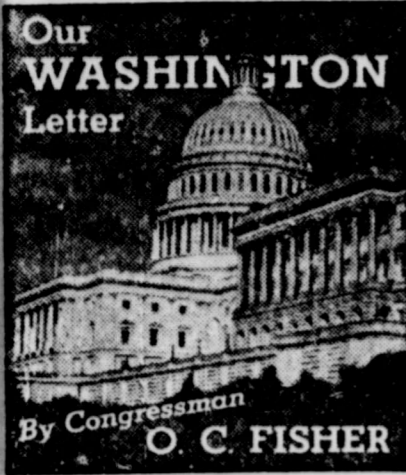

A STERN WARNING that the U. S. will not allow Communist aggression in the vital Mid-East was contained in a Resolution passed in the House last week by a resounding 6-to-1 majority. This action came a week after Red China's Chou and the Soviet's Khrushchev in a joint blast in Moscow declared open cold war against the Resolution. I voted for the action taken by the House.

The Resolution gives the President stand-by authority (which experts on the Constitution say he already has) to commit American troops against overt Communist aggression in the Mid-East area; provided the invaded country requests our help.

The real value of the House action was, therefore, mainly psychological—a demonstration to the world and particularly to the Kremlin, that this country will not tolerate any Monkey Business by the Soviets in a strategic area of the world long sought by Russia, even by the Czars long before the Revolution.

WHAT THE SOVIETS LONG FOR is a warm water port on the Persian Gulf, and now a big cut in the fabulous oil reserves in that area—accounting for more than two-thirds of the world's known oil deposits. For them to gain a firm foothold in the Mid-East would be the most disastrous set-back for the Free World since World War II. And it would strengthen the Soviets, economically and militarily, tremendously. It would increase the likelihood of another world war. So the stakes are high. It is hoped that the overwhelming approval of the Eisenhower Doctrine will have its intended deterring effect. It is a bold, firm move to put the Communists on notice and to still the hand of the would-be aggressor. It will be recalled that two years

## PTA Next Thursday at School Auditorium

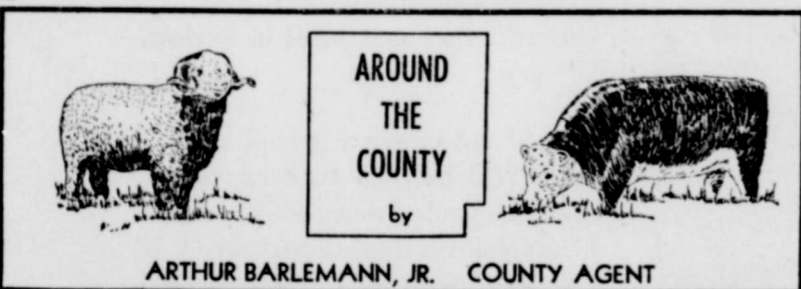
The Sterling City Parent-Teacher Association will meet at the school auditorium next Thursday afternoon at 3 o'clock.

Three down and two to go! That applies to the spring stock shows and not to a football game or wrestling match.

With the Odessa Stock Show, the Abilene Show and our own county show over, we are left with the San Antonio show and the San Angelo show. Both of these shows are rough sheep shows since they draw from the sheep country. The San Antonio show starts this Friday with the parade and official opening of the show. Then on Saturday the judging starts with a storm. On tap for Saturday are the lamb judging, calf judging and other events. Five Sterling County 4-H club members will be on hand with fat lambs. Facing the judges on Saturday in the boys show will be Don McDonald and Freddie Fields. On Monday LeRuth Reed, Cecilia McDonald and Jamie Kay Fields will be trying to hold the lamb the judge is looking for.

A number of FFA boys and their instructor Fred Igo will also be on hand Saturday with about 20 lambs. On Tuesday in the Rambouillet sheep division, Mr. L. F. Hodges and Clinton and Joyce will be showing some of their good Rambouillets.

At the Abilene show Sterling County 4-H Club members did very well in the finewool division in particular. In the lightweight finewool division, a class of 200 lambs weighing 115 pounds or under, Don McDonald had a 4th and a 32nd place lamb. LeRuth Reed had a 22nd place lamb. In the heavyweight finewool class LeRuth had the 16th place lamb and Caro-

lyn Payne had 20th and 24th place lambs. In the group of three finewool lambs owned by one exhibitor Don McDonald had 1st place, Reynolds Lee Foster had 2nd place and LeRuth Reed had 7th place group. In this division, uniformity of the three lambs as well as fat, is a factor and three Sterling 4-H groups were very uniform and made a nice group. The group of 15 lambs from one county was won by Sterling County 4-H members with 15 finewool lambs. These lambs were owned by Don and Cecilia McDonald, Jerry and Carolyn Payne, LeRuth Reed, Mitzi Davis, Temple Ann Foster and Reynolds Lee Foster. Their lambs made up an excellent group of 15 and won the club fund of \$15 in prize money which will be used to repair and paint some of the show equipment and purchase some new equipment.

All the boys and girls listed in the group showing above had individual lambs in the show but they stood just a little out of the winners lineup. Everyone did an excellent job of showing however and are to be commended on their work and spirit in showing. Not all can win and it takes a bigger person to be out of the money than it takes to be a winner.

This is just a reminder that it's time to spray your fruit and nut trees with a dormant oil for Scale. This has to be done while the trees are dormant and time is getting short. Three and one half gallons of 97% oil emulsion spray in 100 gallons of water will do the job.

TAKE NOTICE that an election will be held on the 23rd day of February, 1957, in said County, in obedience to an election order duly entered by the Commissioners Court on the 26th day of January, 1957, which is as follows:

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court deems it advisable and necessary to submit to the qualified voters of Sterling County, Texas, who own taxable property in said County and who have duly rendered the same for taxation, the proposition hereinafter set forth;

Therefore, be it ordered by the Commissioners Court of Sterling County, Texas:

That an election be held on the 23rd day of February, 1957, in Sterling County, Texas, at which election the following proposition shall be submitted:

**PROPOSITION**

SHALL the Commissioners Court of Sterling County, Texas, be authorized to issue bonds of said County in the sum of \$145,000.00, payable at such times as may be fixed by the Commissioners Court, serially or otherwise, not to exceed twenty years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 4% per annum, and to levy out of the tax of not to exceed 30c heretofore authorized at an election held in said County on July 31, 1951, a tax sufficient to pay the current interest on said bonds and create a sinking fund sufficient to redeem them at maturity, for the purpose of the construction of Farm-to-Market and Lateral Roads in said County, as authorized by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Texas, including (but not limited to) Chapter 464, Acts 51st Legislature, Regular Session, and amendments thereto.

The polling places, presiding officers and special canvassing board for canvassing ballots of absentee voters, shall be as follows:

Precinct No. 1 Courthouse at Sterling City with A. W. Dearen as presiding officers.

Precinct No. 2 R. T. Foster Ranch House at Mulberry with Mrs. Bill Blair as presiding officer.

Precinct No. 3 T. H. Humble Ranch House with Mrs. T. H. Humble as presiding officer.

Precinct No. 4 R. C. Bynum Ranch House at Divide with Mrs. Patsy Bynum as presiding officer.

Precinct No. 5 N. H. Reed Ranch House at Kellis with N. H. Reed as presiding officer.

Absentee voting shall be conducted at the office of the County Clerk, Courthouse, Sterling City, Texas, and the special canvassing board for canvassing ballots of absentee voters shall be as follows:

Roland L. Lowe, S. M. Bailey, and R. T. Caperton

That said election shall be held under the provisions of Chapter 1, Title 22, Revised Statutes, 1925, and the Constitution and Laws of the State of Texas, and only qualified voters who own taxable property in said County and who have duly rendered the same for taxation, shall be allowed to vote.

The ballots for said election shall have written or printed thereon, the following:

**OFFICIAL BALLOT**

For the Issuance of the Bonds and the Levying of the Tax in Payment Thereof:

Against the Issuance of the Bonds and the Levying of the Tax in Payment Thereof.

Each voter shall vote on the proposition hereby submitted by placing an X in the square beside the expression of his choice, or said voter may scratch or mark out one of said expressions, thus leaving the other as indicating his vote thereon.

A copy of this order, signed by the County Judge of said County and attested by the County Clerk of said County shall serve as proper notice of said election.

The County Judge is authorized

and directed to cause said notices of the election to be posted up at the County Courthouse door and in each election precinct at least fourteen (14) days prior to the date of said election.

The County Judge is further authorized and directed to cause said notice of election to be published in some newspaper of general circulation published within said County, on the same day in each of two successive weeks, the

date of the first publication to be not less than fourteen full days prior to the date set for said election.

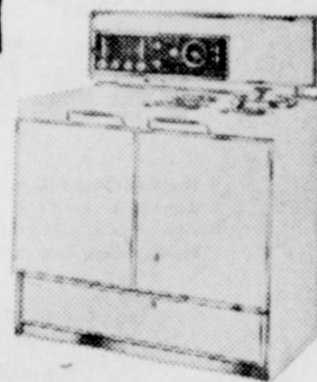

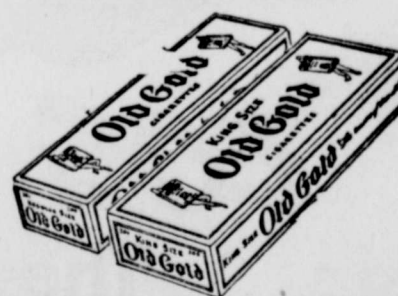
