

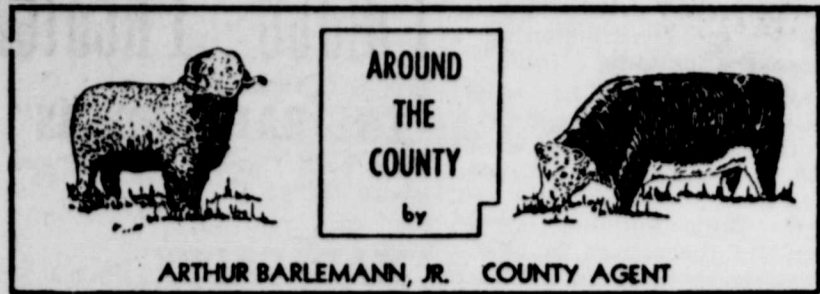

In spite of the bad weather Saturday, a good crowd turned out for the lamb tour barbecue dinner at the show barn. About 140 people ate there and all the rest of barbecue remaining was sold in a few minutes after dinner.

Winners in the judging contests were as follows: Junior division, those in grade school or junior high; First, James Morgan; second, Troy Murrell; third, tie between Barbara Durham and Marsha Stewart. Senior division winners were, first, Bill Davis; second, Danny Stewart; third, C. L. King Jr. First place winners received a number 3 card to use in grooming their lambs; second, a pair of hoof trimmers; and third, a head and neck card.

Trimming and fitting contest winners were Jerry Payne in the junior division and Kenneth Fincher in the senior division. They each received a pair of shears. The Livestock Association decided to give equipment as prizes this year rather than the trophies as in the past.

Reynolds Lee Foster received his certificate as a state winner in 4-H Range Management Awards contest sponsored by the Texas Sheep and Goat Raisers' Association at their annual convention in Dallas last Wednesday. Bill Jacoby a co-winner in the contest which has two state winners, also received his certificate. Both boys will also receive scholarships to the State Range Camp at Junction next August.

The two boys and Alice Clair Jones of Sonora, winner of the sheep and goat wool and mohair award, appeared on a panel before the convention Wednesday. Also, Reynolds Foster participated as an adult leader in the panel. Others on the panel were Garlyn Hoffman, range specialist, and Floyd Lynch, state 4-H club leader.

Television stations KRLD and WFAA both filmed the panel for presentation to their television audiences that evening. The club members were also guests on Mr. A. B. Jolley's noon farm news program on radio station KRLD. The Sheep and Goat Raisers' Association was most gracious to the boys and girl; both contests will again be sponsored by the association next year.

If your pecan trees were infested with scale this past summer, you might want to begin a spray program now to control this pest. Sprays which work the best on the scale are the dormant oil sprays which must be applied during the winter months when the trees have shed all their leaves.

If you had a bad infestation, it might take more than spraying to do the job and you might want to give them one treatment this month and one treatment next month. You would want to give them the first spraying next month at least and one in February.

Best control is achieved by using 3½ gallons of oil emulsion in 100 gallons of water. The oil emulsion should be of the 97% emulsion. Be sure to cover the trunks and branches of the trees thoroughly to all the scale. The scale is a small insect in a hard shell case looking much like a miniature snail.

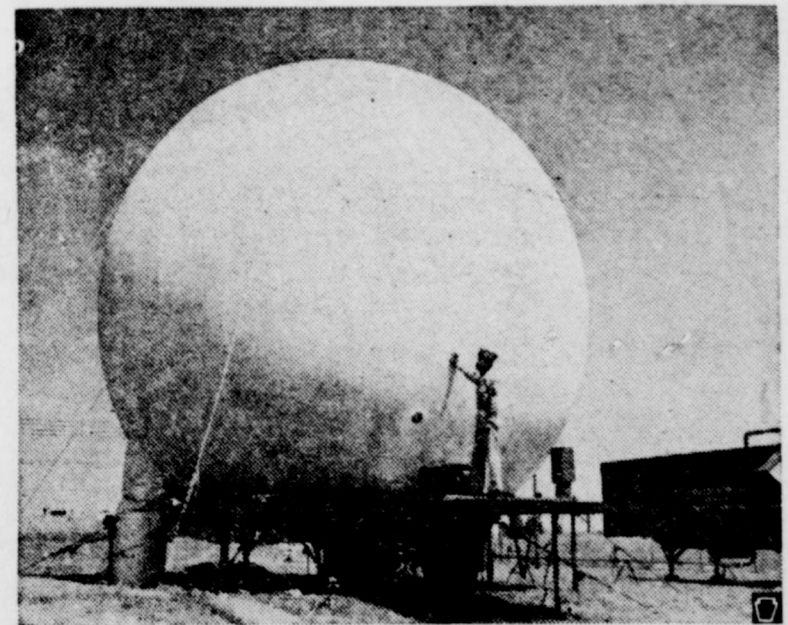

3-D Radar in Plastic "Overcoat"



Comfortably huddled inside a spherical all-weather "overcoat" of plastic stands the triple-threat antenna of Frescanar, new 3-D system which scientists term the most revolutionary advance in electronic detection since the development of radar.

The antenna revolves within its balloon-like house of neoprene-coated plastic, protected from wind, rain, snow and driving sand. The encasing bubble does not prevent Frescanar's electronic beams from poking inquisitive fingers into distant skies to detect multiple airborne targets.

Developed and manufactured by Hughes Aircraft Company at Fullerton, Calif., for the U.S. Army Signal Corps, Frescanar (frequency scanning radar) is now disclosed as the eyes of "Missile Monitor", an Army air defense missile fire distribution system for mobile use with a field army.

The new Hughes radar system is three-dimensional. It simultaneously computes distance, bearing and altitude of airborne targets and feeds the information to weapons batteries where Nike and Hawk missiles are launched to knock any invader out of the skies.

Frescanar, designated the MP-23, consists only of the antenna with its collapsible plastic cocoon, an equipment van and a power truck—sim-

licity that makes the system highly mobile over rough terrain.

Where conventional radars require two or more antennas, operators and master consoles, Frescanar achieves similar or better results with only one of each, sharply reducing weight, bulk and personnel to make transportation with other Army field units easier. Use of transistors instead of tubes further cuts size and increases ruggedness for movement.

Frescanar concentrates all available power in sharp pencil beams of energy that pour in fan-shaped array from the antenna, according to Dr. Nicholas A. Begovich, Hughes ground systems group scientist. Pinpointing targets with extreme accuracy, up to 50 per cent farther than ever before possible, the electronic beams scan rapidly, greatly increasing the number of targets that can be tracked at the same time. The new system also provides better separation of closely-spaced targets with a minimum of ground clutter.
