Bill Freitag, 68, former resident here and lately ranching near Mertzon, died at his home there Wednesday morning at 2:30.

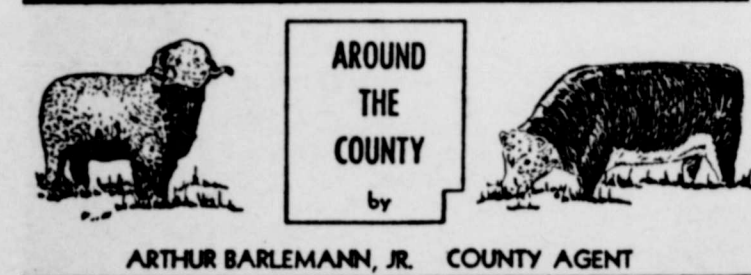

A number of Sterling County people took part in the San Antonio Livestock Exposition which ended last week setting records in all departments. Taking part in the show were 4-H Club members, FFA members and sheep breeders and one quarterhorse showman.

4-H Club members who participated were David Foster, LeRuth Reed, Cecilia and Jeanie McDonald, Rosanne Foster, Drew and Barbara Durham, L. F. and Clinton Hodges, William and Bubba Foster were adult sheep breeders showing while Alvie Cole was the quarterhorse show participant. FFA boys who had lambs in the show were Clayton Stewart, Reynolds Lee Foster, C. L. King, Jr., Tony Allen, Danny Stewart, Johnny Augustine, Don McDonald and David Durham.

In the open lamb show on Monday, Rosanne had 10th place finewool lamb, Cecilia had third place finewool cross-bred lamb and LeRuth sixth place finewool cross. Rosanne's lamb sold for 41c per pound in the auction sale on Friday, going to the Holt Machinery Co. Cecilia's lamb was bought by Mrs. Ruth Davis. LeRuth did not sell her lamb preferring to bring it back for the San Angelo show.

Barbara Durham had 10th and 12th place lambs in the Junior Rambouillet show. There were 167 sheep in the Junior Rambouillet show and quality was high. In the ewe lamb class there were over 30 ewes. David Durham had second place ram lamb in this division.

Clinton and L. F. Hodges took two first places, three seconds, four thirds, three fourths, two sixths, two sevenths, two eights, and one ninth place ribbon in the open Rambouillet show. Here again the quality was high

with 64 animals in the show. William and Bubba Foster sent down three Suffolk ewe lambs and a ram lamb for the Suffolk show. The ram was seventh in his class in one of the biggest Suffolk shows held at San Antonio. They also had the fourth place pen of lambs.

They also bought the reserve champion Suffolk buck of the show for use in their flock. The buck was shown by Victor Ramsey of Garland. He is a very good buck carrying lots of width and depth and should prove an asset.

Alvie Cole's quarterhorse, Dipo Mac, was third in his class. Carlton Fields showed Dipo for Alvie.

The week of February 28—March 7 has been designated as 4-H Club week in Texas as well as nationally. It marks the 50th anniversary of 4-H Club work which began in Texas in 1909 although it was not set-up nationally until 1914 by the United States Government.

Since the 4-H Club movement was begun in Jack County, Texas, more than 1,000,000 boys and girls in Texas have been members. At present there are 111,000 members in Texas. It is the largest voluntary youth organization in the country at present. Adult leaders serve the club in a purely voluntary status helping to guide the boys and girls in their work.

At the present time there are 4-H Clubs in nearly every country of the world with the exception of the communist dominated countries. The organization may not always be called "4-H" since in some countries the words denoting head, heart, hand and health do not begin with the letter H. But the emblem is the four leaf clover, the motto, and purposes are the same regardless of the name—4-H, or 4-C as it is in some of India.

### Car Registration In Sterling County Is Lagging

Captain R. M. Hammett of the Motor Vehicle Inspection Service, Department of Public Safety, advised motorists today that only 28% of the 469,911 vehicles registered in the 49 county Midland Region have been inspected and approved for the 1959 inspection period. Deadline for securing the new inspection stickers is April 15, 1959. As in previous years, it appears many drivers will be in for a long wait to get their vehicles checked. At the present time, most inspection stations are busy, but not rushed.

Of the 854 vehicles registered in Sterling County, only 166 have been inspected, and issued an approval sticker for the 1959 inspection period by the inspection station here.

Captain Hammett reminded motorists that the law prohibits inspections during inclement weather, thereby reducing the time for inspections. There will be no extension of time to have a vehicle inspected. Passenger cars are inspected for headlights, tail-lamps, stop lamps, reflectors, horn and windshield wipers. Commercial vehicles are inspected for the above plus other requirements as provided by law.

Anyone operating a motor vehicle after April 15, 1959 without displaying a 1959 inspection sticker will be operating in violation of the law and subject to a fine not to exceed \$200.00.

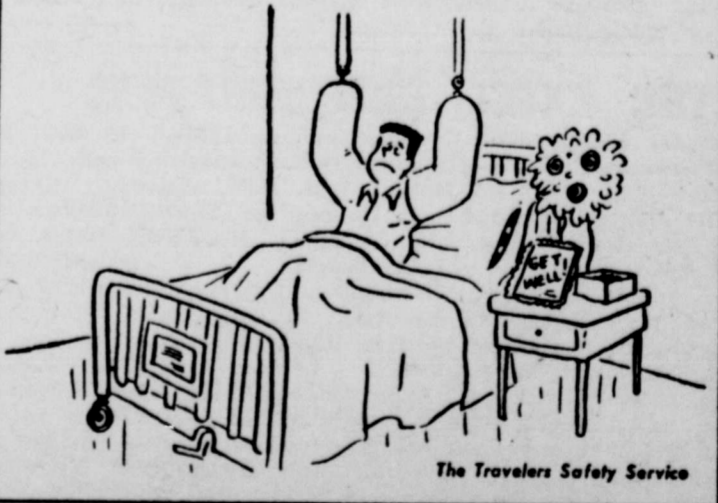

which placed her among the six national champions, was "lemon parfait pie." But this Groom High School junior is a veteran of six years of demonstrating dairy foods. She has been Carson County winner three years for individual demonstrations and three years for team demonstrations.

She has been awarded the dairy foods pin three years, dairy achievement medals twice, and while still too young to compete in the district dairy foods demonstration competition, she won the Carnation pin for her records two times.

She is also the winner of county honors in food preparation, frozen foods, and junior leadership. In 1957, she was county

winner of the bake show. She is a 4-H Gold Star.

**Swisher County Team**

The Swisher County team of Herring and Jones were victors with their demonstration, "start the day the dairy foods way." It featured sour cream pancakes topped with cottage cheese and fruit syrup.

The two Tulla High School seniors were county and district winners in 1957 also with a team demonstration on mocha pudding, placing third in the state.

Both girls are 4-H Gold Stars. Miss Jones was named "Best All Around Girl" in the county in 1956, and Miss Herring was chosen "Most Outstanding 4-H Girl" in 1957.

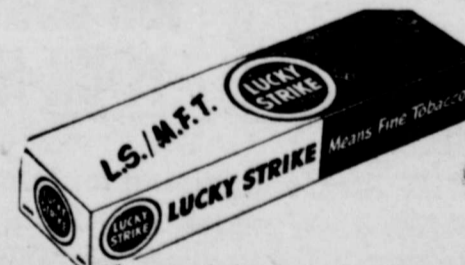

**SENIORS SPONSORING ACROBATIC PROGRAM FEBRUARY 27 AT 2:30**

The Seniors are sponsoring The Coriells—acrobats in an assembly program at the high school February 27 at 2:30 p. m.

The Coriells will feature balancing, acrobatics and juggling acts. The program will cost 15c for grade school students, 25c for high school students and 35c for adults. Everybody in the community is invited to come up to the school and see the program.

The two men feature a variety of balancing and acrobatic routines as well as object juggling. Starting with the demonstration of the fundamentals of juggling, balancing and tumbling this team progresses to perform some of the most difficult juggling of hoops, balls, clubs and Roman battle axes. But not only do they juggle and pass various objects from partner to partner while standing upright, they also juggle while upside down in a free head balance, with both their hands and feet. One member juggling a pole 10 feet in length with his feet while maintaining a free head balance. Juggling is also performed while riding unicycles. A western touch is added to the program when rope spinning is introduced as a part of the act. Although born in the midwest and raised on circus lots, the trick roping in the act makes the cowboys themselves sit up and take notice. The trick and fancy rope manipulating is as expert as any cowhand's and various forms of jumping and skipping the rope while it is being spun and also includes the famous Texas skip. One member of the duo spins a "big loop" seventy-five feet in length while balancing on the shoulders of the other. A demonstration in advanced tumbling is performed in which cartwheels, round-offs,

flip flaps and high aerial backs are demonstrated. Juggling and rope spinning are also demonstrated balanced on the poly-poly and the unicycle. Fun and laughter is also provided when the members of the audience are invited to participate in the act and to perform some of the more seemingly simple balancing feats.

A well-rounded variety program in physical education is brought to a thrilling finale when two of the most difficult feats in balancing and acrobatics are performed by the duo. One member of the team performs a slide-for-his-life down a ramp from a pedestal to the floor while balancing on his head on a roller skate. And finally, the seemingly impossible is performed; almost everyone has seen an acrobat walk on his hands, but one of the members of this team actually walks on his head while maintaining a free head balance. In fact, he is the only man in the world who can jump rope and walk up and down steps standing on his head. This team of acrobatic balancers has been featured on the You Asked for It and Ed Sullivan Television programs as well as other TV shows.

"Persons receiving social security benefits can save themselves and us a great deal of inconvenience if they will report promptly when they go to work and expect to earn more than \$1200.00 in the calendar year," stated Floyd B. Ellington, manager of the social security district office at San Angelo, Texas. "Most people know that if their earnings are in excess of \$1200.00 for the year that they will not be entitled to a benefit check for every month of the year," Ellington continued. "However, many folks are confused as to what to do when they don't know for sure on January 1 what their total earnings for the year will be. Sometimes they go on receiving their benefit checks all year without realizing that their earnings in the last part of the year may cause them to go over the \$1200.00 limit. When this happens they may have to refund part of the benefits they received."

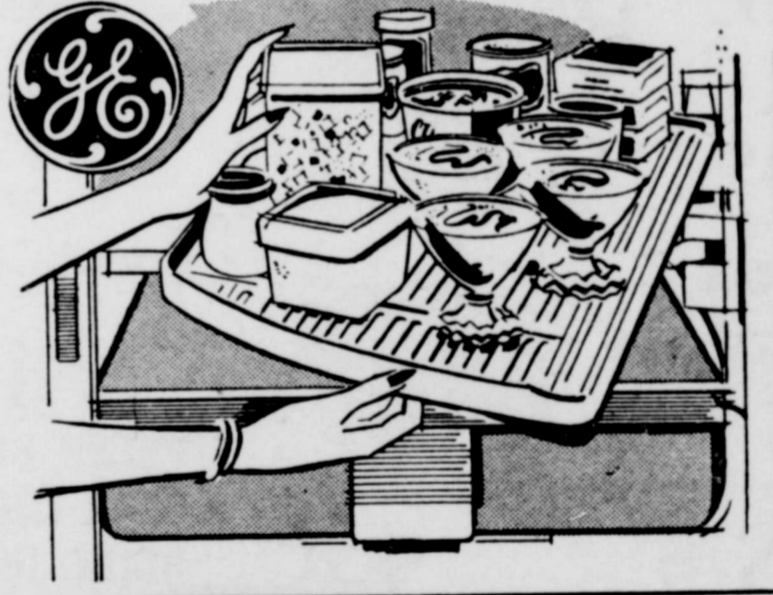

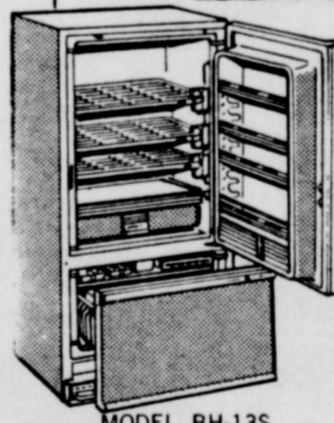
