Heart Fund Goal Reached Here

With a few small contributions still out, the month-long drive of the Heart Fund has resulted in total contributions of \$112,766, W. R. Brooks, chairman, announced today.

"The splendid response of the people of Sterling City to the 1959 Heart Fund Appeal," he said, "is dramatic evidence that they understand the seriousness of the heart problem. It also demonstrates their strong conviction that the Heart Association's program of research, education and community service is the most effective way to combat and eventually to control this leading health menace," the chairman added.

Brooks paid tribute to the various ones who helped in the campaign. "Without the broad support of the school, Lions Club, business firms Dr. Swann and the newspaper we could not bring the message of the heart story to the people of this community," he continued.

Finishes Basic Training

Pvt. Melchor Gomez has finished his army basic training at Fort Riley, Kansas. He is now home on a 12 day furlough, and then will report to Fort Leonard Wood, Mo. He volunteered for a three-year stretch. Pvt. Gomez is a grandson of Lula Gonzales and the late Nick Gonzales.

In the commercial steer show, the steers are graded by a packer on the basis of packer grades such as choice, prime, good, etc. The commercial ewe lamb class is a different class from anything held anywhere else. The ewes are in groups of three. The judge picks the top fifteen groups in the wool. These groups are then sheared by a crew furnished by the show. The boy or girl exhibiting the ewes must roll and tie the fleeces. They are then graded—the fleeces that is—on quality, shrink and character. The ewes are scored out of the wool on body confirmation. Then, the score of the ewes in the wool, the fleeces themselves, and the conformation scores are added up to get the final placing. First place is \$200, second \$150 and so on down to \$10.

Jury at Lubbock Sets Death Sentence

Roosevelt Wiley, 26, was assessed the death penalty for the brutal murder of L. H. Shorty Canada by a Lubbock jury last Saturday.

Wiley, Odessa Negro, was found guilty and assessed the death penalty by the jury after nearly five hours of deliberation.

Canada, a 48-year-old San Angelo route salesman for Gandy's Creamery, was found slain—his throat slit and the body stabbed several times in the chest—Oct. 4 along the roadside between here and Water Valley.

Missing from the body was approximately \$900 received earlier from the sale of a farm.

Wiley and Willie Calvin McDade, Odessan who celebrated his 17th birthday in Coke County jail, were arrested in Big Spring the day of the murder.

Nearly two hours after the jury left the courtroom at 3:15 p.m. (in Lubbock where the case was tried) a written question was submitted to Judge Victor H. Lindsey, asking "Is it possible to sentence the defendant so that he will not receive a pardon or parole?"

The two negroes had made a confession to the crime as they were arrested in Big Spring the day of the murder. McDade will be tried at a date next month.

A change in venue to Lubbock was granted Jan. 19 at Robert Lee by District Judge Joe L. Mays on a defense plea that Wiley would not receive a fair and impartial trial.

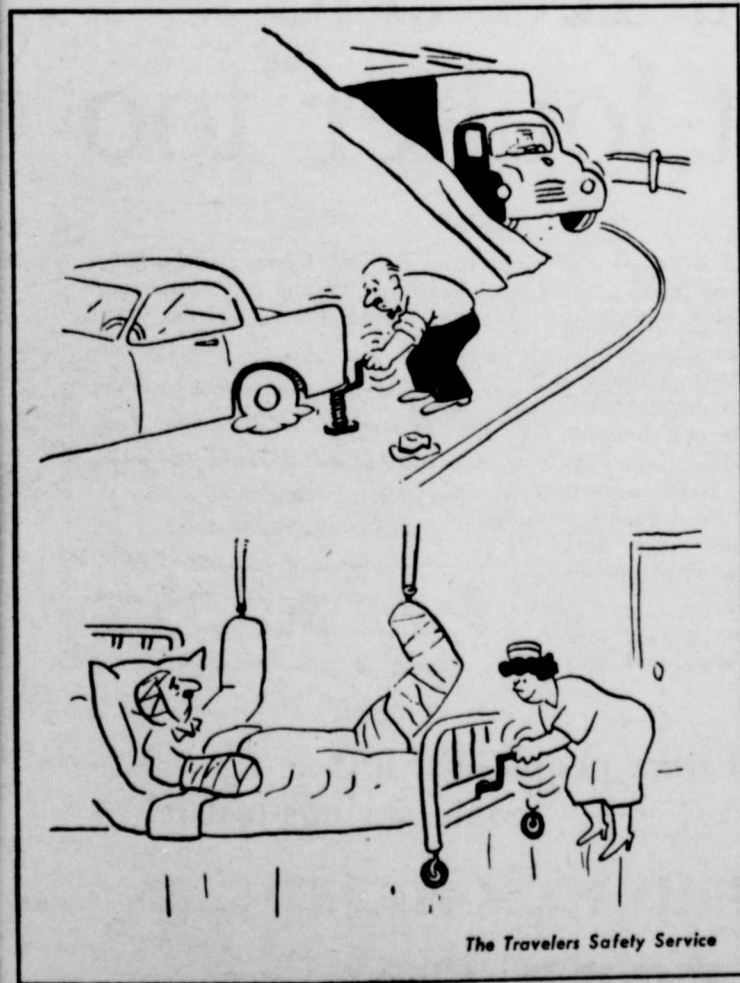

Top young Texans in the 4-H Leadership program for 1958 were Miss Judy Dawson, 17, of Tulla, and Bob Wilson, Jr., 18, of Edinburg.

Both were named state champions and awarded a pen and pencil set from Edward Foss Wilson. A seven-year 4-H'er, Miss Dawson is assistant leader of the Tulla 4-H Club which she helped organize two years ago. She is a member of the state 4-H Council. In 1958 after attending state leadership laboratory, she helped organize a similar lab in her district.

State dress revue winner in 1956, Miss Dawson attended the National 4-H Club Congress in Chicago as guest of Simplicity Pattern Co. She is also a Swisher County winner in canning, freezing, and food preparation.

In 1955, she was chosen "most outstanding 4-H girl" in the county. She is a senior at Tulla High School.

Young Wilson, a 4-H'er for nine years, is recreation leader of the Alamo First and Foremost 4-H Club. He has led recreation at state round-up and at leadership laboratory. He helped clubs in Hidalgo County to develop their own recreational programs.

CHOCOLATE MINT CREAM

2 squares unsweetened chocolate
1 envelope (1 tablespoon) gelatin
1/4 cup cold water
1 1/4 cups milk, scalded

1/2 cup sugar
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 cup heavy cream
1/4 teaspoon vanilla
Peppermint extract to taste
Green coloring

Melt chocolate in top of double boiler. Combine gelatin and cold water in mixing bowl; mix well. Add scalded milk, sugar, and salt, and stir until gelatin is dissolved. Add cream. Pour 2 cups gelatin mixture slowly into melted chocolate, beating with rotary egg beater until blended. Then cook 5 minutes. Remove from boiling water and add vanilla. Chill chocolate mixture until slightly thickened. Place in bowl of ice and water and whip with rotary egg beater until fluffy and thick. Pour 1/2 of chocolate mixture into large mold or individual molds and chill until firm. Place remaining chocolate mixture over lukewarm water until ready to mold.

To the plain gelatin mixture, add peppermint extract and green coloring. Chill until slightly thickened. Place in bowl of ice and water and whip with rotary egg beater until fluffy and thick. Turn into mold over firm chocolate layer and chill until firm. Pour remaining chocolate mixture into mold. Chill until firm. Unmold. Serve plain or with whipped cream. Decorate with candies and chocolate leaves, if desired. Makes 6 servings.

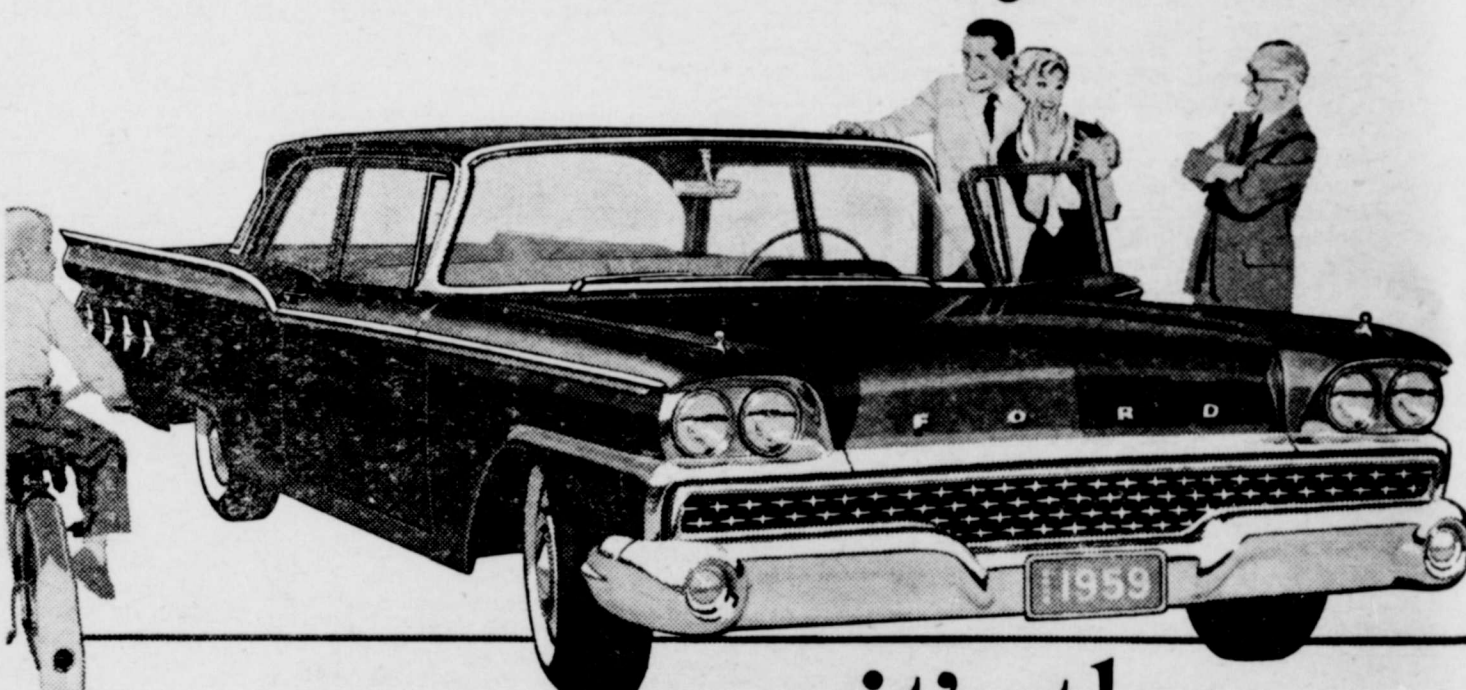

New Hospital For Southwest Is Announced

Designed as the nation's most modern combined diagnostic clinic and hospital, this \$10,000,000 building project has been announced by the board of the Scott and White Memorial Hospital of Temple, Texas. It will provide 279 beds and facilities for 50,000 clinic and hospital patients annually. An innovation for care of the critically ill will be a special observation unit on each hospital floor. A nursing station will be surrounded by a circle of 12 private rooms, where all patients will be under constant observation within a few steps of the nurses. This, it was said, will improve service for many of the critically ill.

Four hospital bed floors in the shape of a cross (A) and two clinic floors (B) rise above the first two floors and basement, which contain diagnostic and research laboratories, surgical and X-ray departments, rehabilitation therapies and other jointly used facilities. A Nurses Residence (C) will help meet the shortage of nurses in the Southwest by increasing student nurse enrollment from 60 to 85. The structure marked (D) is a future building for educational purposes.

The consulting architects, Elberle and Company of St. Paul, Minnesota, designed the new Mayo Clinic and specialize in planning combined diagnostic clinic and hospital facilities. Architectural working plans will be prepared by Wyatt C. Hedrick of Fort Worth.

Jay A. Phillips, of Houston, Chairman of the Scott and White Board of Trustees, said that the target date for starting construction is June 1, 1960. "We already have upward of \$1,000,000 and are aiming at raising the balance over the next year and a half. As a non-profit institution Scott and White serves patients from all parts of the Southwest. This new center will be of tremendous benefit in providing people of moderate means throughout our region with a high quality of diagnosis and treatment at a reasonable cost."

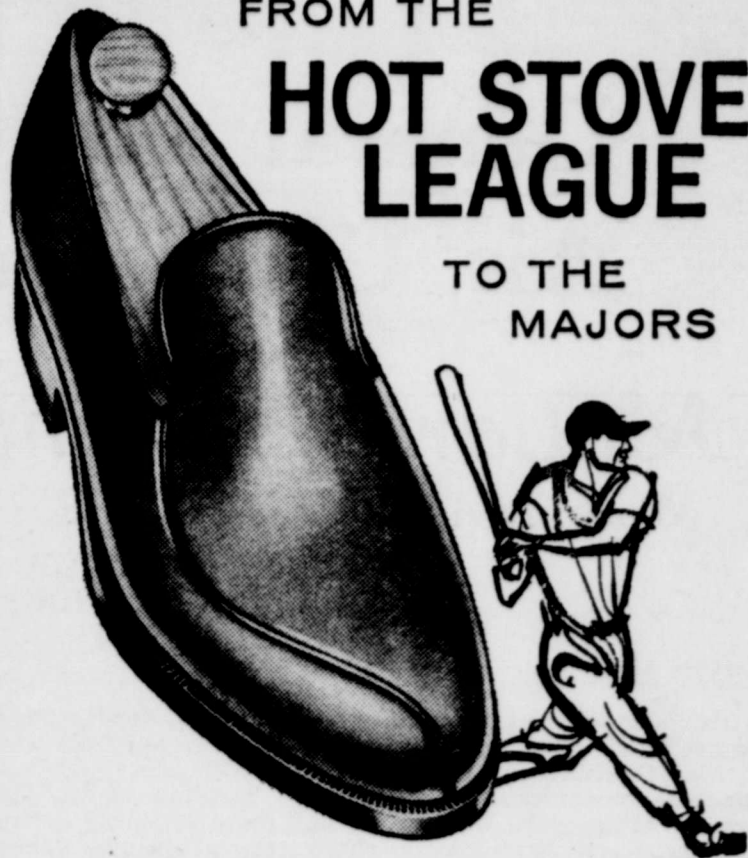

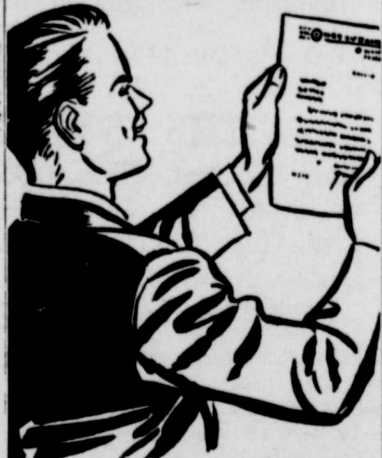

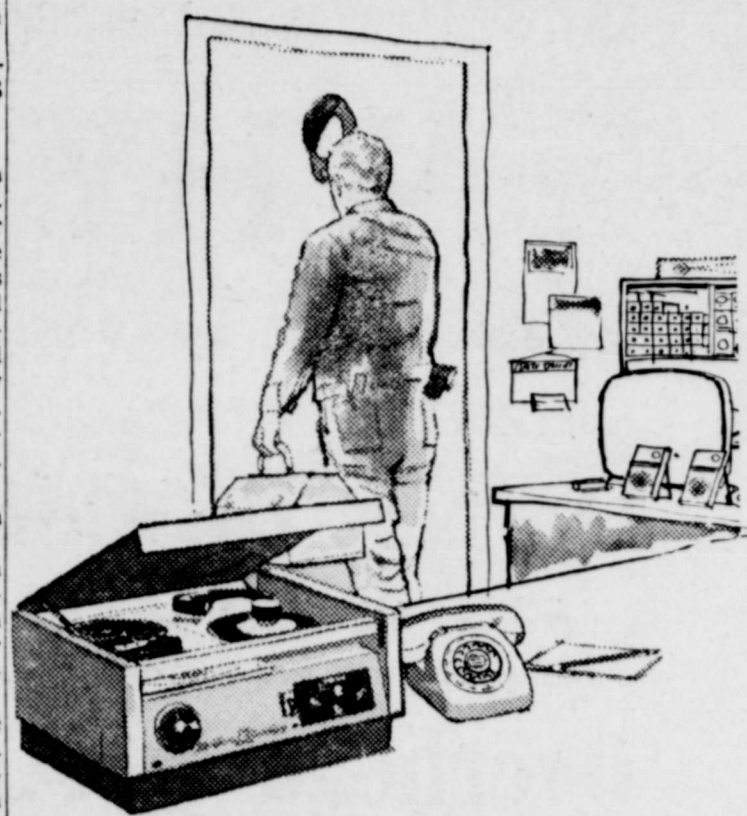

Miss Obrecht is district representative at the State 4-H Council and president and junior leader of the Claude 4-H Club.

Now a home economics major at Harding College, Searcy, Arkansas, she hopes to become an Extension worker.

SOCIAL SECURITY NOTES

"Persons receiving social security benefits can save themselves and us a great deal of inconvenience if they will report promptly when they go to work and expect to earn more than \$1200.00 in the calendar year," stated Floyd B. Ellington, manager of the social security district office at San Angelo, Texas.

"Most people know that if their earnings are in excess of \$1200.00 for the year that they will not be entitled to a benefit check for every month of the year," Ellington continued. "However, many folks are confused as to what to do when they don't know for sure on January 1 what their total earnings for the year will be. Sometimes they go on receiving their benefit checks all year without realizing that their earnings in the last part of the year may cause them to go over the \$1200.00 limit. When this happens they may have to refund part of the benefits they received."

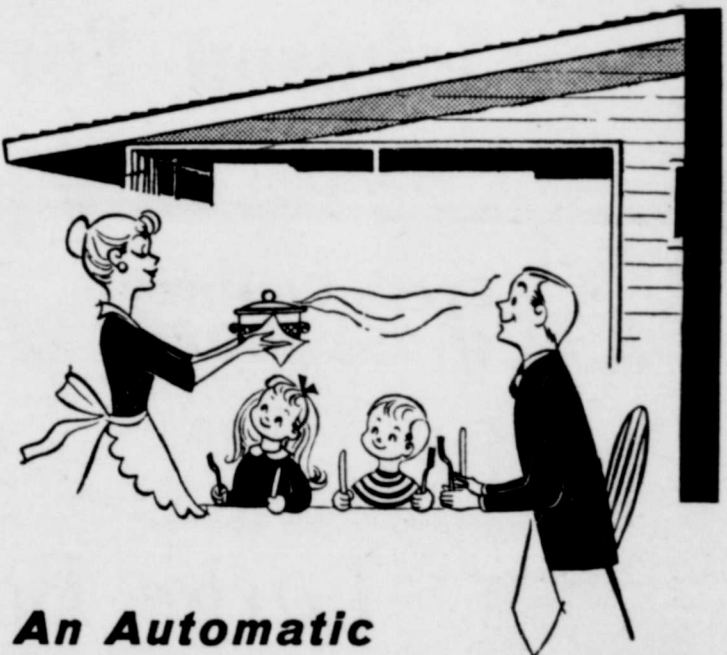

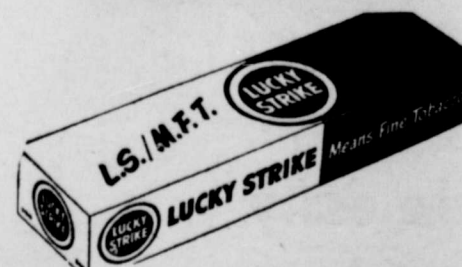
