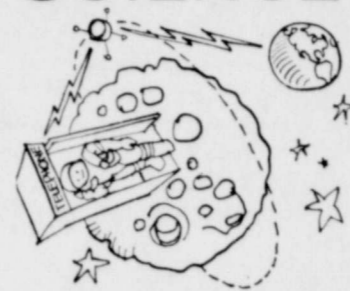

Five of the seven Sterling County 4-H teams entered in the District Seven elimination contests held at Angelo State University Saturday placed either first or second. The twelve members of the teams brought home four blue ribbons and eight red ribbons.

The Junior Safety Demonstration team placed first in their division. Team members were Patti Bynum and Melinda Terry; they demonstrated the safe use of pesticides around the home.

Civil Defense Demonstration team members Russell Davis and Jeff Cantrell placed first in their contest's junior division. They gave a demonstration on a rural fire defense plan based on the grass fire plan developed and used here last summer.

The senior Beef Cattle Business Team made up of Bobby and Tommy Bynum placed second in their contest and will be one of the district's representatives at the State 4-H Contests June 3-4-5 at College Station. Their demonstration was based on the use of artificial insemination of beef cattle.

Senior Natural Resources Demonstration team members were Janis Igo and Ray Sparks placed second in their contest. They will also be one of District Seven's representatives in the State Contests at 4-H Round Up in June. Janis and Ray demonstrated the use of better range management practices to conserve grass and increase livestock production.

Range and Pasture Grass Identification team members were Charlotte Foster, DeNeal Reed, Skeete Foster, and Steven Foster. They placed second in the senior division and will also compete in the State Contest.

Others who competed in the District Contests were Becky Hodges and Russell Davis. Their demonstration in the junior division was based on the use of salt and water to control grazing.

Amy Hodges gave an individual demonstration on keeping a grass cover on rangeland. Amy competed in the Junior Division of the Natural Resources Demonstration's individual contest.

The adults who helped prepare the club members for the contests and also provided transportation to San Angelo are greatly appreciated. Those who helped were: Mrs. Bill Bynum, Mrs. Charlie Davis, Mr. and Mrs. Clinton Hodges, Mrs. Neal Reed, Mrs. I.W. Terry, and Mrs. Barlemann. Without their help, it would not have been possible for this many boys and girls to participate in the contests.

According to officials of the screwworm eradication program at Mission, the screwworm holiday in Southwestern United States and Texas as well, ended last week. The first positive case of worms was identified in a sample from California last week. Within two days, another positive case was found in a sample from Brooks County, Texas near Falfurrias about 170 miles south of San Antonio.

Sterile fly treatment is under way at both locations. Program officials will again use this method to stop the spread of these pests.

All livestock producers are urged to maintain their vigilance in the fight against this pest. Even though the weather is dry in this area, many of the days are humid which is conducive to the spread of this pest. Because of the labor short throughout the state,

producers are finding it difficult to find time to make the necessary checks of their stock, take samples of suspected cases, and mail them to Mission. It must be emphasized however that this time of the year is critical in the program as cases which do not get reported may result in a rapid build-up in a short time, thus placing the success of the program in jeopardy. Shearing is under way in all of this area and this too is an opportune time for cases to break out. All producers are urged to check their stock as often as they can, treat all wounds, and take samples of worms to mail to Mission. Supplies for this are available in the county agent's office and the local feed store.
