## Social Security Agricultural Workers Covered by SS

"Did you know that if you operate any type of agricultural business, the hired workers you have in that business may be covered by social security?" J. M. Talbot, social security manager, asks.

Any employee who works and earns \$150 or more for one employer during any year or works at least 20 days on a time basis for an agriculture business, is covered by social security. Even part-time employees could meet the earnings or work test. You, as their employer, would be liable to withhold social security tax from the employee's check, match that tax yourself, and report the earnings at the end of the year.

The report of agricultural employees must be filed with the Internal Revenue Service by January 31 of the following year. Reports should be on Internal Revenue Service Form 943—showing each employee's name, social security number, and amount paid. The report should be accompanied by tax withheld from employee's pay and matched by employer.

To be sure which employees to report, Mr. Talbot recommends keeping records on anyone working for you in your agricultural business.

"If you have any questions about farm wages," Mr. Talbot said, "please inquire at the Social Security Office at 3000 West Harris Avenue (P. O. Box 3808) in San Angelo, Texas, or see the representative when he is in your area."

## Martin and Fincher on Ballot

The Democratic Primary runoff election will be held here Saturday, June 6 for the deciding of the race between County Judge J. K. Martin, and W. G. (Dub) Fincher. Both had received 151 votes each in the first primary back on May 2, thus causing a runoff election.

Absentee voting started last week on Wednesday and ended here on Tuesday of this week.

## All Voting to be at the Courthouse Box

All voting Saturday will be done in the box at the courthouse, said Democratic County Chairman Jack Douthit.

The polls will be open from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m., said the chairman.

As soon as the results are known, they will be posted on a cardboard in front of the News-Record shop, it was said.

## Social Security Tips Medicare Premiums Up on July 1

Premiums for the supplementary part of Medicare go up July 1, 1970. According to J. M. Talbot, social security manager, the new premium for most people will be \$5.30 monthly, an increase of \$1.30 over the current premium.

Mr. Talbot explained that the supplementary part of Medicare is the part which helps pay doctors bills. The program is financed by the premiums beneficiaries pay, matched dollar for dollar by the Federal Government.

Mr. Talbot said the premium increase is necessary because of rising medical costs. Each year, the financing is evaluated by the Secretary of Health, Education, and Welfare.

The law requires that premiums be raised each year the cost of the program indicates a need. The last premium increase was in January, 1968, when premiums were raised to \$4 monthly.

Social Security beneficiaries receiving cash payments will have the additional premiums held out of their checks beginning with the check delivered about July 3, 1970. Those who pay premiums directly will be billed \$5.30 a month or \$15.90 per quarter. The relatively small group of people who now pay more than \$4.00 per month, because they were late enrolling will pay proportionately higher under the new schedule.

On registration day, June 8, all students should show up bringing their birth certificates and records of inoculations by 8:30 a.m.


Mrs. Juanita Noles will be the teacher of Headstart this year. She is the regular first grade teacher here.


### SCIENCE SKETCHES





**Medicare Patients Pay More For Hospitalization**

Because of the rising cost of hospital services, Medicare beneficiaries will be paying a bit more for hospitalization in 1970.

The deductible payable by the beneficiary will be \$52 beginning January 1, an increase of \$3 over the present amount. Medicare will continue to pay for the remaining covered services for the first 60 days of hospitalization for each benefit period.

For the 61st through the 90th day of a hospital stay, the beneficiary will have \$13 a day of the covered services to pay. At present, the beneficiary is liable for \$11 a day of such costs. Medicare will continue to pay the balance, which will average over \$40 a day now.

"This increase in cost to the beneficiary is a must," according to J. M. Talbot, social security district manager, "in order to keep the Health Insurance Trust Fund on a sound financial level."

"The nationwide average cost of hospitalization for a Medicare beneficiary in 1966 was \$37.95 per day, including costs to the patient and costs paid by Medicare," Mr. Talbot pointed out.

"This cost per day rose to \$49.34 in 1968 and with such a substantial rise in costs still continuing, an increase in the deductible paid by the patient could not be avoided."

**U.S. Border Patrol Seeks Applicants**

The U.S. Border Patrol of the Immigration and Naturalization Service has an urgent need for physically fit young men desiring a career in Federal law enforcement work. This is a career opportunity for those who like action and outdoor work.

The Border Patrol is the mobile, uniformed enforcement branch of the Immigration and Naturalization Service. Its principle purpose is to prevent the smuggling and illegal entry of aliens into the United States. The border patrolmen, called Immigration Patrol Inspectors, work along international boundaries, although their duties are not necessarily confined to these areas. They work in jeeps, cars, on foot, in boats and even in airplanes. Officers investigate violations of the immigration laws and frequently make arrests. They are often required to work irregular hours, under all weather conditions. These duties demand mental alertness as well as exceptional physical vigor and stamina.

The entrance salary of an Immigration Patrol Inspector is \$7,639 a year (Grade GS-7). There are promotional opportunities up to executive levels in the Immigration and Naturalization Service. On-the-job training offers splendid opportunities for promotion to positions of greater responsibility.

No experience is required for these positions. To qualify, applicants must pass a written test of verbal abilities, judgment, and aptitude for learning a foreign language. Candidates who pass the written test are called for oral interviews in the order of their standing on the list. The oral interview is designed to

determine if the candidate has the personal qualities needed for the work. Applicants must also pass a rigid physical examination. Candidates who are selected for appointment are assigned to the Border Patrol Academy for a period of intensive training in such subjects as immigration laws, Spanish, physical training and marksmanship. Trainees receive full pay while in the academy.

Applications are now being accepted for the civil service examination for Immigration Patrol Inspector which will be held on Saturday, January 24, 1970. An additional examination is scheduled for April, 1970. However, those wishing to be tested in January must submit their applications before December 19, 1969. Full information is given in Announcement No. WAM-911 which may be secured from Interagency Boards of Examiners and from many post offices as well as any office of the Immigration and Naturalization Service. Applications should be submitted on the tearout application form on the announcement or CSC Form 50000AB and forwarded to the Interagency Board of U. S. Civil Service Examiners for Washington, D.C. 1900 E St., N.W., Washington, D.C. 20415.
