If you were born in a state that kept birth records when you were born, write for your birth certificate. If the state where you were born wasn't keeping birth records at the time, the next best thing is a baptismal record.

If you were baptized before age 5, you'll be asked to find out if there is a record. If there is, it is all the proof of your age you'll need.

Immunization Shots Necessary

The state of Texas now has a law requiring immunization for all students enrolled in schools and colleges.

All students in grades 1 through 5 have to have 3 oral polio shots, 3 diptheria-tetanus shots, measles, rubella, and smallpox. Grades 6 and above have to have the shots or doses in rules set forth-like polio to age 19, smallpox and diptheria and tetanus within 10 years, and the others through age 12 or the illness itself.
