SCOUTS GIVE TRASH THE SACK

Three billion dollars! That's the estimated annual bill Americans are paying for public collection and disposal of garbage and solid waste — the third most expensive community service in the land, which is exceeded only by spending for highways and schools.

Concerned citizens, of course, can make significant contributions to cleaning up this national mess. As in Watertown, N. Y., where the initiative of the Environmental Systems Division of St. Regis Paper Company and a local Boy Scout Council is currently leading the way.

AS IT LOOKS FROM HERE

Washington, D. C. — Six times in the last seven years Congress has been asked to step in at the last minute to settle disputes and prevent a Nation-wide tie-up in railroad and airline transportation.

Each time it has been a national emergency and each time the Congress has responded.

The most recent strike involved railway signalmen. In this instance, the union demanded a 54 percent wage raise. Management offered 3 percent and a Presidential board created under the Railway Labor Act set a 42 percent increase which neither side would accept and the strike resulted.

Within 24 hours hearings held by committees, the House and Senate passed a bill and the President signed it into law. Included in this action was a 13-1/2 percent increase in the pay of signalmen and a ban against striking until next October 1.

Unless legislation is enacted providing better legal machinery for settling disputes, another strike at that time is likely. Even now the United Transportation Union is giving notice of a strike on July 16, unless there is a settlement, and action by the Congress in connection with this Union's action may come even sooner than we think.

Several proposals for dealing with emergency strikes are now in the committees in both the U.S. House of Representatives and the Senate, which have their purpose a wide range of actions which the President can take to prevent strikes and settle disputes. Two laws giving the President authority to stop strikes are now on the books. The Railway Labor Act and the Taft-Hartley Act. Neither has proved adequate to assure that our nation-wide transportation system will not be paralyzed by a tie-up. Thus far the Congress has been treating the symptoms instead of the disease.

The administration has recommended putting the transportation system under the Taft-Hartley Act entirely, which at least has the effect of postponing a work stoppage for a longer period of time.

At least a half dozen other approaches are proposed. A bill introduced last week sponsored by more than 40 members of the House of Representatives gives wide authority to the government to control and end strikes. Hearings will soon be scheduled by the Interstate and Foreign Commerce Committee. One of the most important features will permit selective strikes by unions against a limited number of companies. In other words, it proposes to ban nation-wide and industry-wide work stoppage.

It is recognized that the right to strike, the complete opposite of totalitarian economic devices, must be preserved wherever possible to do so.

For Social Security

Worried about proving your age? J. M. Talbot, social security manager, said the people at your social security office may be able to help you make your claim. There are some things you can do ahead of time. If you were born in a state that kept birth records when you were born, write for your birth certificate. If the state where you were born wasn't keeping birth records at the time, the next best thing is a baptismal record.

If you were baptized before age 5, you'll be asked to find out if there is a record. If there is, it is all the proof of your age you'll need.

If you have no birth or baptismal record, the people working in the social security office will be happy to suggest some other possibilities. Some examples are an old family Bible, school records, and federal census records.

You may not recall now, but when you bought your marriage license you gave your age. You may also have some old insurance policies about the house. The list of proofs to try is quite long. When you file your claim, it helps if you have already fund the oldest thing you can that shows your age. Usually, the older the record the better it is for proving your age. It will help the people at the social security office pay your benefits sooner if you think ahead on your age.

Many times a telephone call before you visit the social security office will help. You may be able to file your claim by phone. Contact the Social Security Office at 3000 West Harris Avenue (P. O. Box 3808) in San Angelo, Texas, or see the representative when he is in your area. Persons who are unable to meet with him are encouraged to call the office in San Angelo at 949-4608.

right to strike, in an absolute sense, does not and cannot exist throughout our economy.

The nation cannot stand a nation-wide railway strike for more than a few days. The effects on commuters, national defense, the supply of perishable foods, the mails, the electric power industry and other basic industries such as automobiles, steel, coal and paper could in a few days paralyze our whole economic system.

Professor Jerre S. Williams, in a prize winning essay on labor disputes articulates this position:

'We cannot continue to hold a false belief that the right to strike is unlimited. We cannot insist that all bargains must be made through the collective bargaining process. We can and must make every effort to have the keen of collective bargaining so that it is an effective tool in all but the very hardest of cases. But, must be courageous enough to handle the hardest cases another way.'

In the past emergencies it is pretty obvious that the Congress itself, by the very nature of things is neither equipped nor qualified to settle strikes. It can and has acted to grant what amounts to an injunction against strikes but it is in no position to legislate pay rates.

The chairman of the house committee with jurisdiction over this matter states the obvious: 'The problem,' he says, is to be fair to the working man, to management and to the American people.' He adds that when hearings begin it will take months and months of consideration to arrive at a conclusion on these goals.

The only trouble is that we may have another nation-wide rail strike on our hands unless action is taken.

Immunization Shots for Children Now Necessary

The state of Texas now has a law requiring immunization for all students enrolled in schools and colleges.

All students in grades 1 through 5 have to have 3 oral polio shots, 3 diphtheria-tetanus shots, measles, rubella, and smallpox. Grades 6 and above have to have the shots or doses in rules set forth like polio to age 19, smallpox and diphtheria and tetanus within 10 years, and the others through age 12 or the illness itself.

All immunizations should be completed by the time school is entered.
