GOOD RAINS FALL HERE

Tuesday afternoon and night saw the rains hit West Texas again with refreshing and life giving moisture. The area hit was general over West Texas with amounts varying—as usual.

Here in Sterling City the rain was .90 inch in town and was as much as 2.50 inch in more favored spots. Generally the fall was heavier to the north, east and west. In fact the rains varied in every area.

Then on Wednesday afternoon and night light rain showers added to the totals. In town two-tenths of an inch was registered, and more in outlying areas.

Mertzon to the southwest got seven inches, putting Spring Creek on a huge rise. San Angeloans hope for a full Three Rivers Lake from the rains there. Highway 67 was closed to traffic Wednesday night.

AROUND THE COUNTY

Officials of the Southwest Screwworm Eradication Program urging all livestock producers to step up their vigilance in the battle against screwworms. Many areas are finally getting welcome moisture after the dry summer; this situation may lead to more screwworm cases.

A missed case during the coming weeks could lead to an outbreak similar to the one in Bowie County in northeast Texas. Eighteen confirmed cases were identified in that county during July alone. Thirty cases were confirmed in the state during the past month. This compared with the 10,267 cases confirmed in the state during July 1962, the first year of the program, shows what can be done.

The nearest cases thus far this year have been in Menard, Kimble, and Val Verde County. Keep up the vigilance, mail in samples of suspected cases, and treat all wounds wherever possible.

Texas has now taken over as the leading cattle-feeding state. On July 1, this year, there were 1,700,000 head on feed, up twenty-six percent from a year ago. This is a new for the state and along with a decrease of thirteen percent in Iowa, allowed Texas to take over the lead.

Water Can Be Tested for Salinity

The school now has the chemicals on hand to test well water for salinity — salt water content. So says Fred Igo, local vocational agricultural teacher. If landowners want to keep a check on the salt content of their water wells, they can bring a sample in for testing. Social Security Tips

Each calendar quarter, the Social Security Administration receives employer reports of earnings showing incorrect social security numbers of employees, according to J.M. Talbot, social security manager. These incorrect reports, in many cases, happen when a girl has married but does not have her name changed on social security records.

Mr. Talbot stated that when a girl marries, she should complete a 'Request for Change in Social Security Record' form. After completing the form and returning it to the social security office with her old card, she will be issued a new social security card with the same number but showing the new name.

If the name and number reported by an employer do not match the name and number on file with the Social Security Administration, the earnings might not get to the proper account. This could result in a later loss of social security benefits or in a smaller benefit being paid.

Forms for application for a social security number or a request for change in social security records can be obtained at the Social Security Office at 3000 West Harris Avenue (P.O. Box 3808) in San Angelo, Texas, or see the representative when he is in your area. Persons who are unable to meet with him are encouraged to call the office in San Angelo at 949-4608.

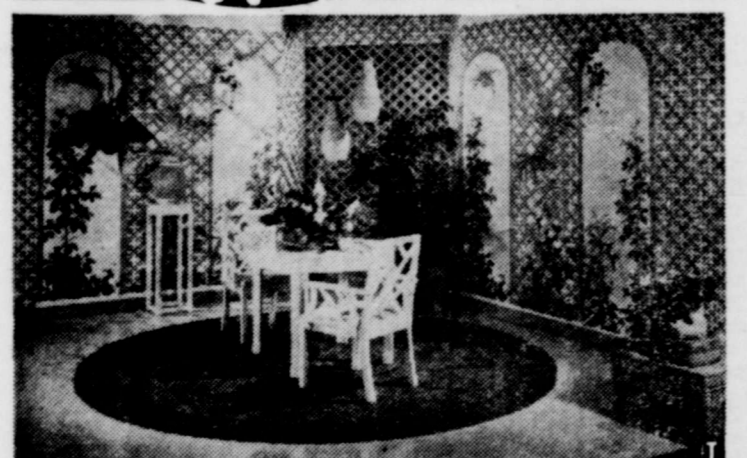

DINING ROOMS AND AREAS

Dining rooms—like old-fashioned parlors—give much pleasure. They enhance the ceremony of eating, their decoration, likewise, partakes of ritual: the centered table, the sideboard, the chandelier or wall sconces.

Somewhat a deep dado is right for such a room, and above it a wallpaper mural or a large repeating pattern should be considered. Painted walls, or heavily paneled ones of wood, should be firmly rejected: the former because they lack richness and atmosphere, the latter because they have too much, like a clubroom.

In country houses, over a dado, a scenic "toile" might be an excellent choice, or even—if there is no dado—a broad floral stripe.

At present, the dining room is often just around the corner from the living room, and hence easy to decorate quite differently, with regard to both furniture and wallcovering. But it must be constantly remembered that even here, as in all adjacent and visible areas, the colors should be related, from one area to the next, although the change in pattern and texture can be as abrupt as you wish.

In a small apartment the "dining room" may consist of nothing but a table and some chairs. Should you attempt to enclose them by screens or curtains? If you do, you may make an already small room seem smaller. Rather than cut up your floor space it might be wise to define the different areas by means of well-chosen wallcoverings. It would be sad not to point up a dining room in some way. The evening meal in particular should be heightened by romantic lighting and a colorful background.
