Sterling County homemakers will have access to help with home economics problems in the near future. The new county home demonstration agent-at-large, Mrs. Jean Holland, will spend at least one day a month in the county beginning in October to assist homemakers and women working with the home economics phase of the 4-H Club program.

Mrs. Holland will be in Sterling County on the first Tuesday of each month from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. She will be here in the office on that day to help homemakers with their problems, plan programs, and work with the women leaders of the girls 4-H club program. She will also spend other time as is necessary and will schedule those times on the first Tuesday of the month.

Mrs. Holland will be introduced to the women of the community at a get-together on September 27. She has been serving as assistant county home demonstration agent of Tom Green County for the past two years. Mrs. Holland succeeds Mrs. Mrs. D'Lynn Whitten who held the position of home demonstration agent-at-large for the past year but resigned to move to Amarillo with her husband. The new agent assumed the position on August 16 and will work in four counties in Extension Service District Seven, Sterling Irion, Mason, and Kimble Counties. These counties have no home agent but are served by the agent-at-large, a position created last year.

The pecan weevil is here! John Brock checked some of his trees the latter part of last week and reports that he found a number of these late season pests of the pecan.

The pecan weevil makes its appearance the latter part of August and in early September following rain or irrigation of the trees. At this time, the nut kernels have begun to harden and the female chews a hole in the nut and deposits her eggs in the nut. The eggs hatch into creamy white grubs with red heads—some refer to them as red heads when they inspect the nuts. The grubs feed inside the nuts during the fall attaining a length of about 3-5 inch. When they reach maturity, they chew a hole in the shell and drop to the ground where they pupate and remain until next year. The life cycle requires from 2 to 3 years most of it being spent in the soil.

The weevil is one of the causes of the nuts dropping now. Pecans are now in the water stage and the damaged nuts fall from the tree. Unfortunately, Sevin has been removed from the list of insecticides recommended for use on pecans and cannot be used at this time. The authorities are working on the problem and it is hoped that it will be approved for use soon but at present time it cannot be recommended.

Another cause of the dropping pecans is scab, a disease that causes the immature pecans to drop. Scab is characterized by small spots in the nut husks as well as the leaves. The spots grow and finally form large areas on the nuts. When the infection

Open Admission Policy

is severe, the entire nut surface turns black, development is arrested, and the nut drops off. Scab can be controlled with applications of Du-Ter at the rate of 0.3 to 0.6 pounds to one hundred gallons of water. Trees should be sprayed at the rate of one gallon of spray for each foot of height of tree. If trees are affected now, it would be well to use the same spray application next year when the leaves are one-third grown, again at casebearer spraying time, and again fourteen days after the initial casebearer spraying. Do not allow meat or dairy animals to graze in Du-Ter treated areas. Two of the more popular varieties here, the Burkett and Western Schley, are particularly susceptible to scab.

The other cause of dropping nuts now is the lack of food and moisture. During the dry summer months we have just been through, the trees were in a state of stress and were not able to maintain the crop on the tree. There is little that can be done for this situation now.

Brands Must Be Re-Recorded

NOTICE Concerning Rerecording of Brands in Texas

All brands and marks on Texas livestock must be rerecorded with County Clerks after August 30, 1971, according to a new law passed during the last session of the Texas Legislature. Producers will be given a six-months period (August 30, 1971 through February 29, 1972) in which to register these brands and marks and the location on the animal which they are currently using, after which time any unrecorded brand will be available for use on a "first come" basis.

The law further states that all such brands and marks must be rerecorded every 10 years. Each County Clerk records for his given county only, so many producers may need to record their brands in additional counties if their operations are extensive.

The new owner shall have the right during this six-month period to file the mark and brand now recorded in his name. In the event it cannot be determined from the records who first recorded the brand and mark in the county, then the person who has been using such mark and brand the longest shall have the right to have the brand and mark recorded in his name.

It should be noted that it is illegal to brand livestock without first properly recording the brand with the County Clerk in the county in which the livestock are held.

When the brand or brands are recorded, the location on the animal on which the brand is to be applied must be designated. If the brand is to be applied to more than one location on the animal, it must be so recorded and each additional location for the brand on the animal shall constitute a separate recording of that brand.

There is no limit to the number of brands and-or marks which may be recorded in a county by a person as long as requirements of this law governing the recording and rerecording of livestock brands are met. Minors may have marks or brands separate from that of the father or guardian, which must be recorded or rerecorded as provided by the new law.

SHRIMP AND RICE CREAM MOLD

2 cans (4 1/2 ounces each) shrimp
1/4 cup uncooked rice
1 1/4 cups chicken broth
1 envelope unflavored gelatin
1/2 cup freshly grated onion
1/2 teaspoon white pepper
1/2 cup mayonnaise
1 cup heavy cream, whipped

Drain shrimp, reserving canned liquid. Chill. Combine rice and broth; simmer, covered, 20-25 minutes, stirring frequently to make rice "starchy." Soften gelatin in shrimp liquid; stir into hot rice. Cool rice; add onion, pepper, mayonnaise, and about 1 1/4 cans of the shrimp. Fold in cream; turn into a 1-quart mold and a 1-cup mold. Chill until firm. Unmold smaller mold on the larger one. Decorate with remaining shrimp, with parsley and lemon slices. Serve with Curried Mayonnaise, combining 1/2 cup mayonnaise, 1/2 teaspoon curry powder, 1 teaspoon Dijon style mustard. About 8 servings.

Social Security Tips

Each calendar quarter, the Social Security Administration receives employer reports of earnings showing incorrect social security numbers of employees, according to J.M. Talbot, social security manager. These incorrect reports, in many cases, happen when a girl has married but does not have her name changed on social security records.

Mr. Talbot stated that when a girl marries, she should complete a 'Request for Change in Social Security Record' form. After completing the form and returning it to the social security office with her old card, she will be issued a new social security card with the same number but showing the new name.

If the name and number reported by an employer do not match the name and number on file with the Social Security Administration, the earnings might not get to the proper account. This could result in a later loss of social security benefits or in a smaller benefit being paid.

Forms for application for a social security number or a request for change in social security records can be obtained at the Social Security Office at 3000 West Harris Avenue (P.O. Box 3808) in San Angelo, Texas, or see the representative when he is in your area. Persons who are unable to meet with him are encouraged to call the office in San Angelo at 949-4608.

Water Can Be Tested for Salinity

For Social Security

Worried about proving your age? J. M. Talbot, social security manager, said the people at your social security office may be able to help you make your claim. There are some things you can do ahead of time. If you were born in a state that kept birth records when you were born, write for your birth certificate. If the state where you were born wasn't keeping birth records at the time, the next best thing is a baptismal record.

If you were baptized before age 5, you'll be asked to find out if there is a record. If there is, it is all the proof of your age you'll need.

If you have no birth or baptismal record, the people working in the social security office will be happy to suggest some other possibilities. Some examples are an old family Bible, school records, and federal census records.

You may not recall now, but when you bought your marriage license you gave your age. You may also have some old insurance policies about the house. The list of proofs to try is quite long. When you file your claim, it helps if you have already found the oldest thing you can that shows your age. Usually, the older the record the better it is for proving your age. It will help the people at the social security office pay your benefits sooner if you think ahead on your age.

Many times a telephone call before you visit the social security office will help. You may be able to file your claim by phone. Contact the Social Security Office at 3000 West Harris Avenue (P. O. Box 3808) in San Angelo, Texas, or see the representative when he is in your area. Persons who are unable to meet with him are encouraged to call the office in San Angelo at 949-4608.

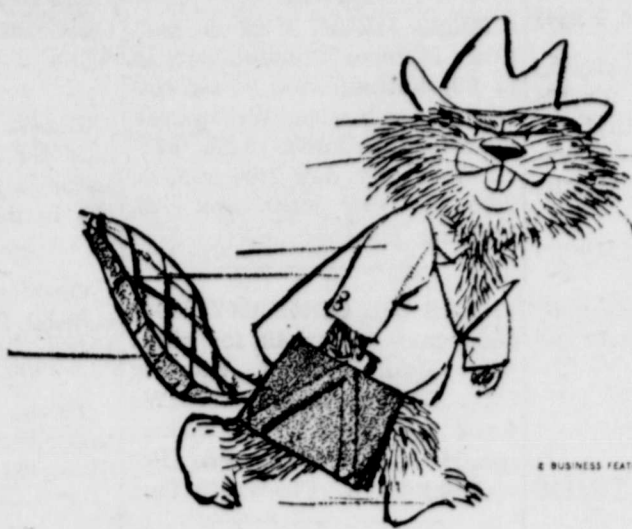
WHO MUST FILE SOCIAL SECURITY EARNINGS REPORT

Most social security beneficiaries who earned over \$1680 in 1970 are required to file a report of their earnings with the Social Security Administration by April 15, 1971. This report is in addition to any Federal or State tax return, and it must be filed with the Social Security Administration, according to J. M. Talbot, social security manager.

Beneficiaries who were 72 years old in all months of last year are not required to file the annual report of earnings. Disabled beneficiaries should report immediately if they become self-employed or take a job. All other beneficiaries, including families of disabled persons, are under the retirement test and must report their earnings annually.

The purpose of social security benefits is to replace earnings lost due to retirement, death, or disability. If an individual continues to earn a substantial amount — \$1680 or more — some adjustment is made in the amount of his benefits. One dollar for every two dollars earned between \$1680 and \$2880 is withheld. If an individual earns over \$2880, he gives up a dollar for each dollar earned over \$2880 regardless of the amount of yearly earnings. A beneficiary is entitled to his full social security check for any month in which he does not earn over \$140 and is not self-employed. The annual report will allow us to determine whether or not additional benefits are payable.

CHECK YOUR SOCIAL SECURITY RECORD

"How do I know my work under social security is being credited to my record, and how do I find out about it? This is one of the questions most frequently asked," says J. M. Talbot, social security manager.

In explaining the process involved in reporting social security, Mr. Talbot said, "When you work for wages, your employer deducts social security tax from your paycheck each pay day. At the end of each calendar quarter, he submits your name and number with payment for these taxes to Internal Revenue. Internal Revenue forwards copies to social security's main office in Baltimore, Maryland. Your wages are then posted to your record. The same process is followed for a self-employed person except that his earnings are recorded yearly."

Mr. Talbot states that the possibility of an error being made in the process does exist. He recommends that you request a statement of your earnings at least every three years.

All you have to do to secure the statement is to send a post card request available at your social security office to Baltimore, Maryland. If the reply you receive is incorrect in any way, contact the Social Security Office at 3000 West Harpur Avenue (P. O. Box 3808) in San Angelo, Texas, or see the representative when he is in your area.


