





HOW DOES ALCOHOL WORK IN THE BODY?

(Note: This is second in a series furnished by the National Institute of Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism.) When you drink an alcohol-

ic beverage, 20 per cent of the alcohol in it is absorbed directly and immediately into the bloodstream through the stomach walls. Unlike other "food," it does not have to be digested. The blood carries it directly to the brain where the alcohol acts on the brain's central control areas, slowing down or depressing brain activity. The other 80 per cent of alcohol is processed only slightly slower through the gastrointestinal tract and into the bloodstream.
