YELLOW FEVER NOTES. New Orleans, September 14.—Filed 12:30 p. m.—Weather clear and pleasant.

The following dispatch was filed here at 10 o'clock this morning: Grand Rapids, Mich., Sept. 13.—Dr. Woodford, of Paducah, died tonight at 8:15 o'clock, after an illness of one week.

Dr. Yeazle, of New Orleans, and Dr. Henry Stearns, of Natchez, are the only physicians here. They are going night and day.

Baton Rouge, September 14.—The official statement of cases reported for the 24 hours ending this morning at 9 o'clock, are: deaths, one; new cases, 42; total deaths to date, 27; total cases, 117.

DESTRUCTIVE STORM AND FRESHET.

Washington, September 14.—Dispatches from various points in Virginia, West Virginia, Ohio, Pennsylvania, and as far north as Canada, give accounts of a destructive gale, accompanied by heavy rains and causing extensive damage to railroads, crops and other property.

Stanton river bridge on the Virginia Midland railroad, between Lynchburg and Danville, two bridges over the Roanoke river in North Carolina, Big Bridge, and one at Big Hollow on the Atlantic Mississippi and Ohio railroad, have been washed away.

A dispatch from Covington, on the Chesapeake and Ohio railroad, says that Jackson river is higher than it has been at any time in the season.

On the line of the Chesapeake and Ohio railroad serious damage was inflicted. The business and engineering men killed by the washed away bridges on the Pan Handle road have been washed away, a freight train was plunged into the stream, and the engineer and fireman have not yet been seen.

At three o'clock yesterday morning the residents on the streets in the vicinity of the following river were being removed from their dwellings on Mahoning Avenue as the water was eight feet deep, several small dwellings were swept away like drift wood.

The County Commissioners of Mahoning County, Ohio, have ordered that the bridges over the river be repaired.
