CHINESE OVSTERS

Like so many peculiar things in the Celestial empire, the system of breeding the above named bivalve differs widely from that pursued in Europe and America. In the southern parts of China "collectors" of bamboo are placed in the cyster-beds, much after the rame fashion as the elaborate tiles and "hives" employed in France. Those cyster-acthers are, however, prepared in a curious manner. The cans are exposed for about two months to the rays of the sun, and then placed for a similar period in salt, water, after which they are again dried for several days, the object being to preserve them from decay and prevent the twisting or warping of the bamboo. Notches are then cut in the canes, into which empty cyster shells are fixed, like so many cups, and thus prepared they are driven into the the seashore between high and low water mark, and left standing to catch the young spat. Those localities are considered the best where the rise and fall of the tide is the pat. Those localities are considered the ber, where the rise and fall of the tide is the best where the rise and fall of the tide is the the greatest, so that the bivalves may be alternately covered by the flood and exposed to air on the ebb. There the young oysters thrive well and develop rapidly, and are quite ready for the market when they are two years old. A large trade is carried on by the persons who pursue the calling, and who have many thousands of these collectors.
